In this increasingly credit-oriented society, the contents of an individual's credit report assume an ever-larger importance. Thus, it was with some satisfaction, undoubtedly, that many Americans read Friday that the Senate had passed a bill designed to protect 110 million consumers against arbitrary and erroneous credit information.

"The bill's passage was "the greatest consumer victory this year," its chief sponsor, Sen. William Proxmire enthused. The bill yet faces action by the House, probably early next year. The importance of the bill may lie in the guarsitee it could provide consumers that at last they could check information in their credit rating files for accuracy. The bill also provides
