Southern Baptists Have 23 Hospitals Located in 14 States

ATLANTA, May 15.—Marked progress has been made in the matter of building up endowment funds for many Southern Baptist schools during the past year, and still other institutions have been assured definite income from the Baptist state conventions, it was reported to the Southern Baptist Convention last night by the education board through Dr. W. C. James, of Birmingham, corresponding secretary.

Some of the gifts by the denomination have been supplemented by contributions from the general education board and similar agencies. Among the institutions that have received large additions to their endowment during the past year, it was reported, are Furman University, Greenville, S. C., whose increase has been \$500,000; Cauchita College, Arkadelphia, Ark.; whose increase has been \$40,000, while Wake Forest College, Wake Forest, N. C., has successfully terminated its litigation over a gift made some years ago whereby it has now come into possession of endowment funds amounting to \$1,250,000.

Geologist Finds a Rare Mancheneel on Pine Key Island

TALLAHASSEE, May 16.—The report of Dr. R. M. Harper, the widely known geologist who has written several volumes on the plants and vegetation of Florida, that he discovered a mancheneel tree on Big Pine Key on a recent trip there, has led persons here to an investigation of early reports of the unusual qualities of the wood of the mancheneel tree.

Trade With Russia Follows Quickly Signing A Treaty

STOCKHOLM, May 16.—A reduction by 8 per cent of the harbor dues of Swedish ships entering the port of Leningrad, a return to Swedish ownership of the embassy house in that city, and the appointment by each nation of official envoys to the other among the first results of the signing of the pact between Sweden and Russia, in which the Soviet is recognized as the government, de jure.

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The treaty contains a clause granting each nation the most favored nation treatment, which does not depend upon ratification by the riksdag. This has an important bearing on shipping privileges, as hitherto Swedish ship-owners have been obliged to pay five times as high harbor dues as those from countries with which the Soviet had treaty relations.

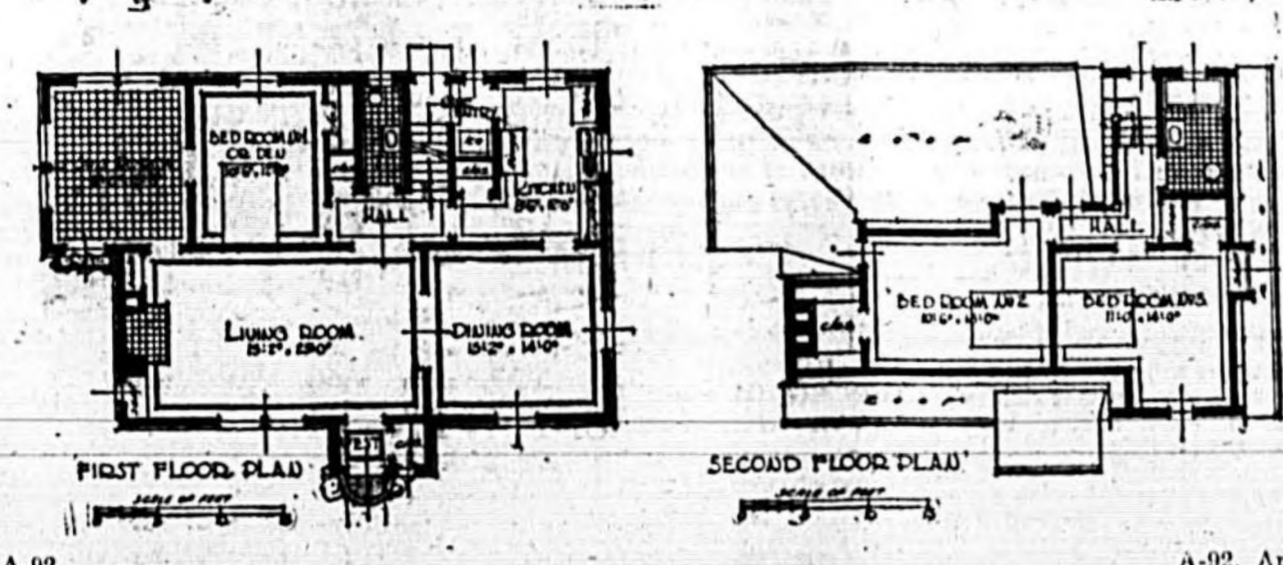
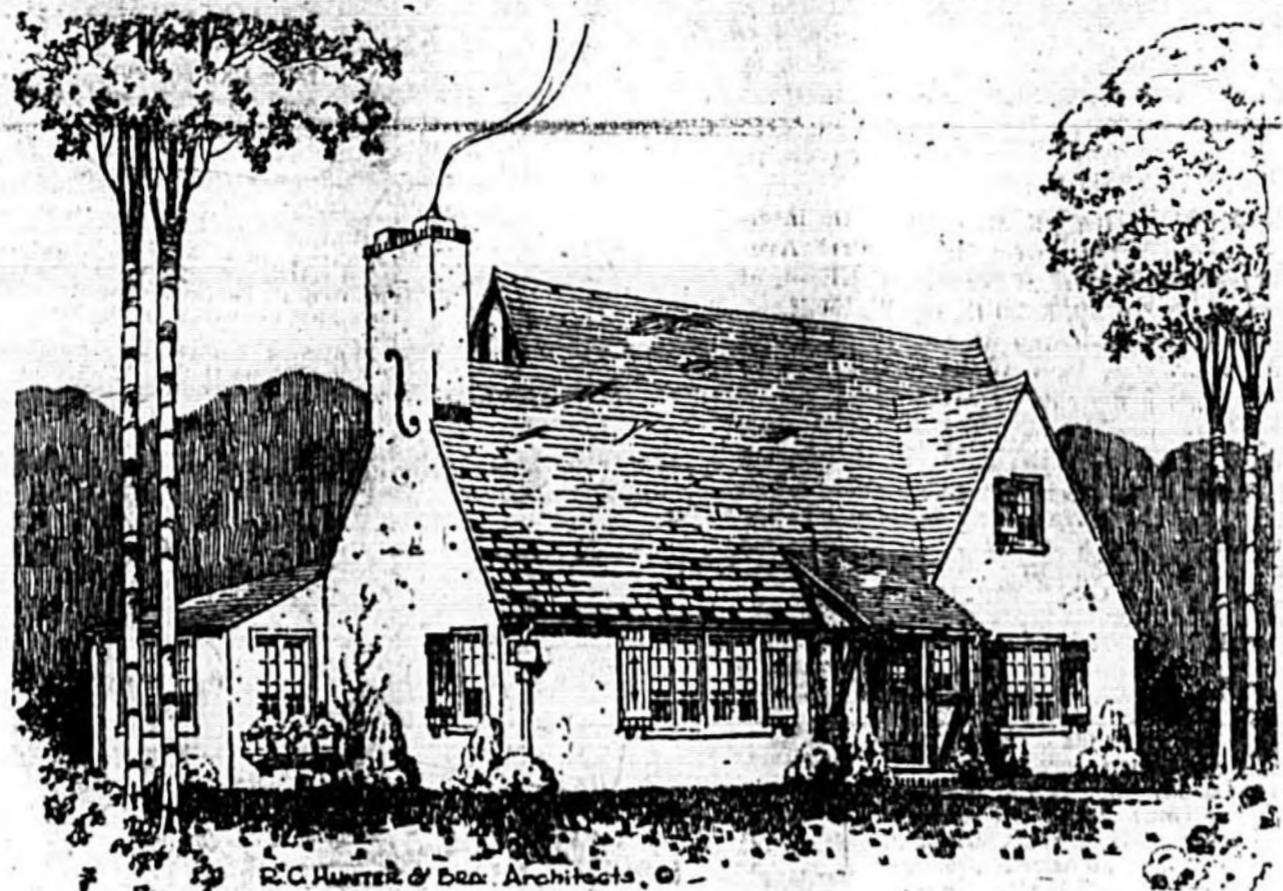
