It all begins tomorrow night and it all may well end at a national tourney in Kansas City late in the month of March. But for tomorrow night Coach Joe Sterling will be satisfied with a victory over the highly improved Jones College Blue Devils of Jacksonville.

This year, Florida's champion goes directly to the national

other team he has ever coached. The question in the SJC mentor's mind: "Is how they will play as a team"? This will be determined as the Seminole season progresses. Only ONE starter returns from the 1968-69 squad, but what

a starter, in former Oviedo High School ace Simon Harper, n 6'5" forward, who proved to be one of the keys in SJC's cage coup last year. Harper is a fine jumper and he became of age last year, averaging 17 points per game along with about the same amount of rebounds, Harper will be the team captain this year.

Harper will receive some "tall help" this season in 6'4" Jim Glichrist and Harry Lee also 6'4". Lee will probably play at center while Glichrist will see forward action along with Barper. Gilchrist and Lee were both selected by Sports Illustrated Magazine as two of the top 500 cage prep players in the nation, last year. Lee is a sizzling foul shooter and was Maryland's leading free shot artist in his junior year. Lee was also the leading scorer in the city of Baltimore in his junior year, averaging 25 points per game coupled with 20 rebounds per contest.

Glichrist has been tabbed by Sterling as most likely to replace high jumping forward Vernell Ellzy, formerly of Sanford Crooms. Elizy was one of the main reasons the Raiders won the state championship last year. The talented forward is now playing with Fiorida State University and is expected to be one of the "keys" to their success this year. Glichrist "jumps as good as Elizy" according to Sterling

Another area standout is also expected to see plenty of action this year, in 6'0" Jim Below of Winter Park. Below played on the U of F Gator freshman team last season. Steriing calls Below "a heady ball player" and believes the youngster will really improve as the season starts out.


