### Dead Or Alive?

Speaking of John Dillinger, Public Enemy No. 17 of 1934, an assistant attorney general in the Justice. Dypart-ment made the statement that "I hope we get him under such circumstances that the government won't have to stand the expense of a trial." The assistant could have meant nothing else than that John Dillinger would be more acceptable dead than alive, that federal agents should shoot him on sight. It would seem to be a fight to the finish.

One may wall question whether this is the way the law ought to be enforced. It deprives the victim of a fair trial. which was supposed to be a fundamental of law and order. It falls to take into consideration extenuating circumstances such as the man's sanity. Shooting a man down like a mad dog in the streets is hardly a dignified method of enforcing the law, or of setting an example to its citizens, in a civilized country in this day and time.

But it seems to be the only way in which it can be done. Undoubtedly a bloodless capture, a fair trial and conviction, a life sentence property carried out, would be the preferable way of handling a case such as this and in our opinion this method would do a great deal more toward helping to create respect for the law, But if, in our imperfect world, this method is impossible, the "shoot to kill" policy should not be neglected.

It must be remembered that Dillinger was captured once before. He was taken to prison under armed guards. While awaiting trial, he escaped. His method of escape, to sny the least, was one contemplated to arouse the suspicions of even a gullible public. Honest guards do not put up their bands and let their prisoner go at the point of a wooden pistol without some other consideration.




