Here's the Answer By ANDY LANG AP Newsfeatures Writer. Q.—What kind of paint should be used on cinder blocks? I have been told that since they contain alkali, it should be careful not to use oil-based paint. Is this correct? The blocks have no pores on them. A.—Alkali is present in concrete and the mortar used in concrete joints, therefore oil-based paints should not be used on them. However, cinder blocks are a special case because they contain both alkali and acid. Your best bet is what is called a swimming pool paint, a portland cement paint or a solvent-thinned resin, in which calcium portland cement belongs.

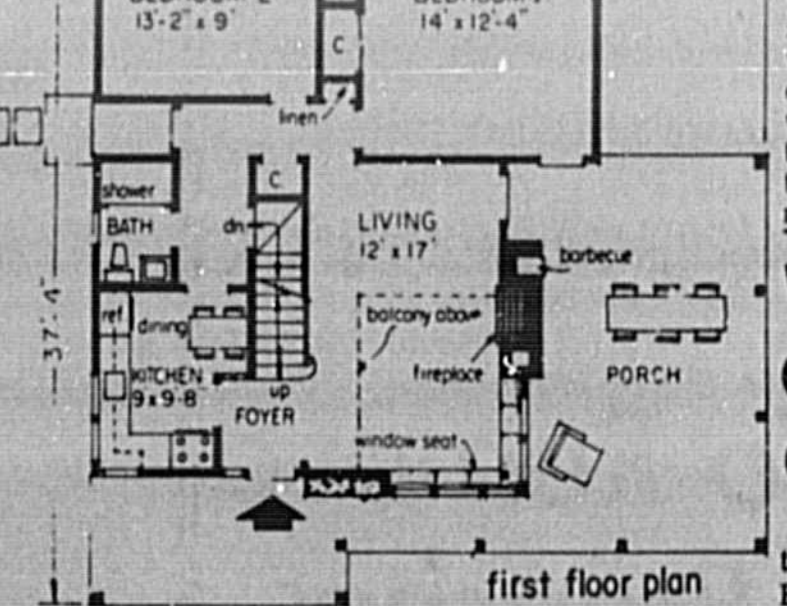
HOMES FOR AMERICANS. Q.—One of the shades in our house is driving me mad. Every time it is pulled down, it snaps up again rapidly as soon as I let go of it. What is causing this and how can I fix it? A.—The spring inside the roller has become wound up too much. Raise the shade as high as it will go. Lift it out of the brackets and unroll it by hand about half way. Replace the shade roller in the brackets. It should now work properly, but if it doesn't, do the same thing a second time.

Q.—Our plastic garden hose has a damaged area in it. I bought the necessary couplings, cut out the damaged section and then tried to place the severed nozzle into the inside of the hose. No matter how hard I pushed, the nozzle would not go into place. What did I do wrong? A.—Nothing. This is a trouble sometimes encountered with plastic hose that has become stiff with age. You can save the cut end by dipping the hose in hot water for a few minutes. This softens the plastic a tiny bit and permits you to push the nozzle into the hose.

The WEEDERS GUIDE By EARL ARONSON AP Newsfeatures. If you have pruning courage you can fashion a clump of birch. You must prune heavily. An advocate of drastic pruning, Prof. Radcliffe B. Pike, University of New Hampshire horticulturist, says, "Birches may be cut off a few inches above ground level. Although it may look a little ridiculous to transplant a stump, nevertheless it is sound practice. One then gets a clump of several stems which most people prefer to a single trunk in birches. That's how some nurserymen get their birch clumps (known as 'pads' in the trade). Heavy pruning encourages basal shoot growth." If you buy a single trunk birch and the trunk dies after transplanting, don't be hasty about digging it up. Pike advised, "Cut off the trunk near the ground. Often there still is life in the roots, and they'll shoot up to form a nice clump." (We have what we call a maple bush. A young tree had been girdled when we moved in. I cut the trunk off near the girdled area and shoots soon appeared from the bottom. The bush is beautiful.) Shrubs also may be cut near-

Here's How Set's House Not Built as a Home. By VIVIAN BROWN AP Newsfeatures Writer. A house on a movie set is likely to be so authentic you could move in. How come then they can't build them so fast, art director Joel Schiller was asked on the set of "Man on a Swing." "Our blueprints are in minute detail, so most of our work is done before we build anything," Schiller explained. "Of course many things are especially designed, requiring more details than a home builder would need, but we include many more details often than architects do, and we find it better when the actual building begins. DEAR POLLY — My quick and easy way to wash greasy or oily hands is to wet them with water and then rub with a tablespoon of granulated sugar. Rinse thoroughly, then finish the job with ordinary hand soap. — TERRY

DEAR POLLY — To clean venetian blinds, spread them on the lawn. Spray with the garden hose with a pressure-controlled nozzle and a rather heavy spray. Next, spray with a liquid cleaner and then rinse with the hose. Leave to dry quickly in the sun. I hang them while they're still a little damp as the tapes tend to shrink a bit. This is much easier than the old bathtub routine. — CONNIE

(POLLY'S NOTE) — Be careful not to leave them in a wet spot for drying. Better still, wipe off excess water to prevent rusting of metal blinds and warping of wooden ones.

DEAR POLLY — Cultured marble bathroom sink tops do not take well to cleaning with a regular powdered sink cleanser. I keep a plastic scrub sponge and a small bottle of liquid detergent in each bathroom for this little job. One or two drops of detergent and a brisk scrub do the trick, with no scratching. — K. M. S.

DEAR POLLY — To keep a doubled thread from twisting and tangling so badly, make a neat knot at the end of each thread instead of just one for the two threads. — ALENE

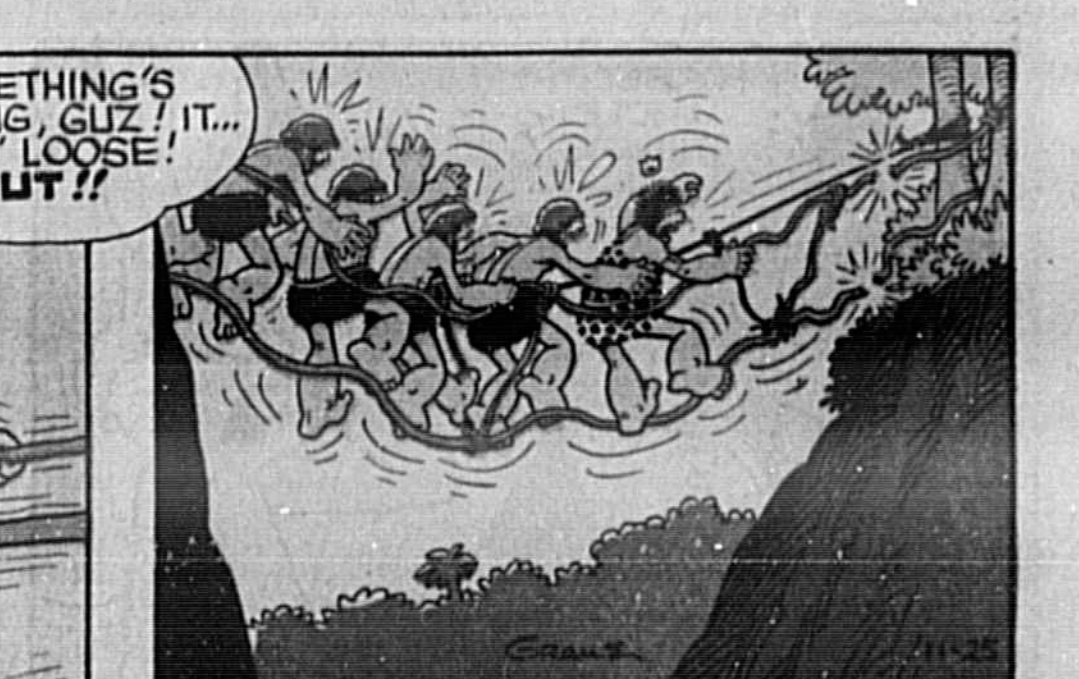
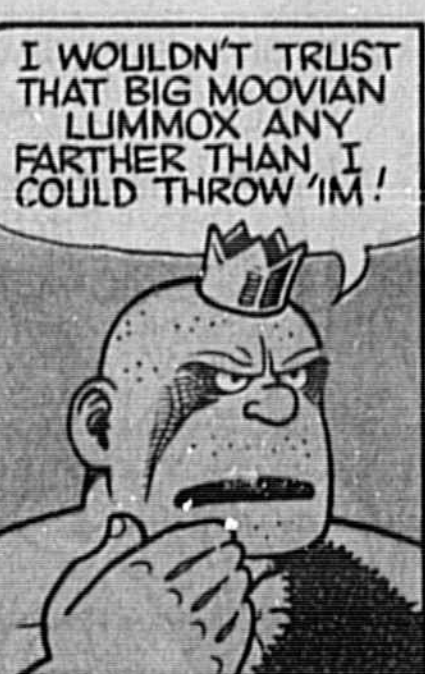
