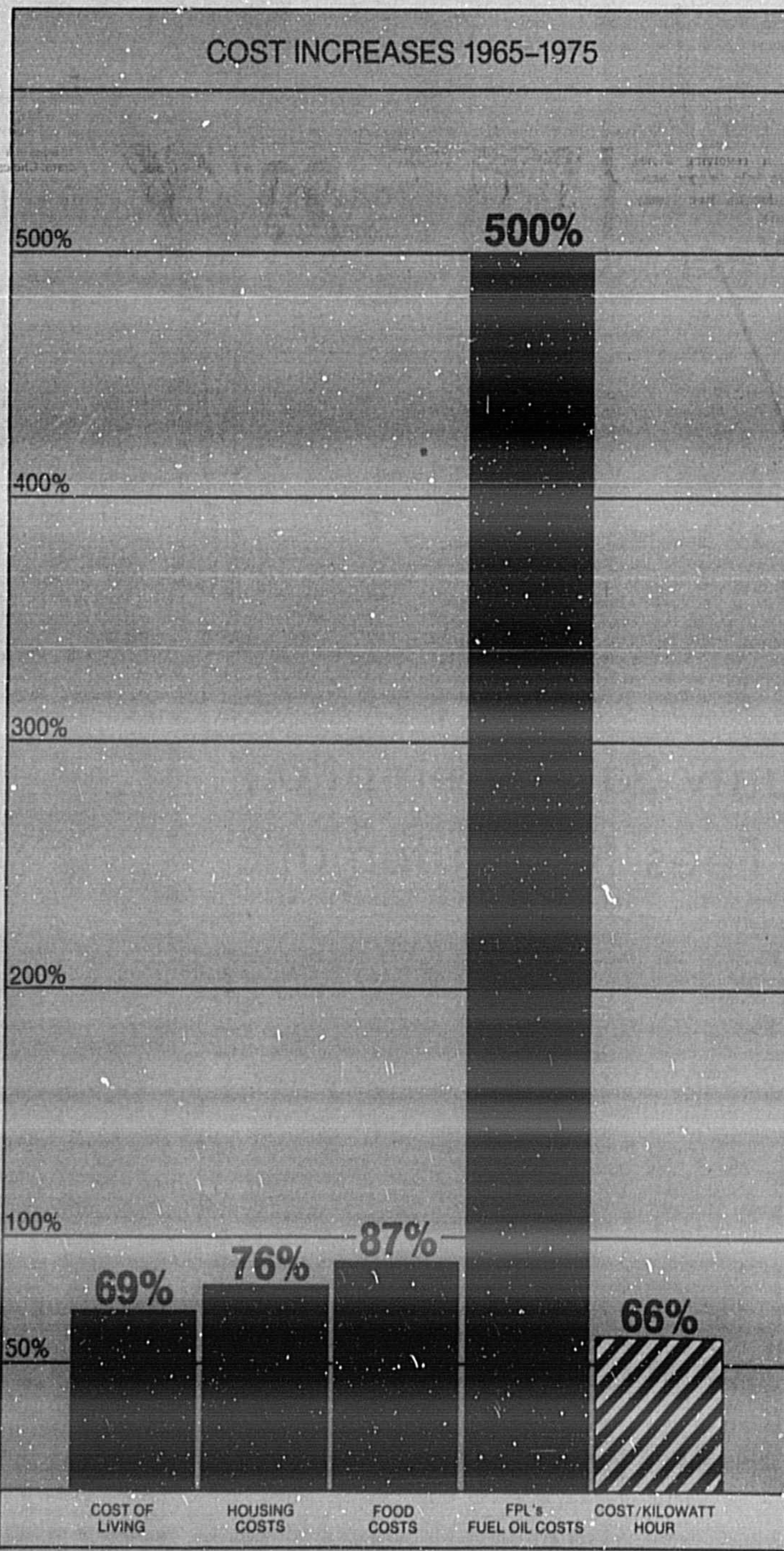

How does the rising cost of electricity compare with other rising costs?



In the past ten years inflation has caused the price of practically everything to zoom upwards — just take a look at the chart on the left.

Teachers To Question Board On Controlling Class Sizes

The question of school class size will be aired a second time tonight when the Seminole Education Association (SEA) presents a grievance to the Seminole County School Board.

At last Wednesday's meeting, Bill Moore, association vice president, charged that the school system had not made "every effort" to keep class sizes down to the acceptable levels agreed upon in the SEA contract.

After School Supt. William P. Laver denied their grievance, the SEA brought it before the board.

Moore told the board inequities in class size existed around the county and that the load was particularly heavy in kindergarten, sixth and ninth grades.

Class sizes approved in the SEA contract called for 25 students in kindergarten classes, 27 in grades 1 through 3, and 30 in grades 4 through 12.

Laver recommended the grievance be denied, saying every effort had been made to keep class sizes down to an acceptable level.

He said results of a survey conducted by his office showed that countywide, only kindergarten class size was slightly over the agreed-upon level.

All other class size averages are below the maximum approved by the SEA, Laver said.

Board Chairman Robert G. Feather finally declared the grievance out of order as the paperwork had not been presented according to contract guidelines.

Youths Charged In School Burglary

By BOB LLOYD Herald Staff Writer Sanford police have arrested two teenagers in a burglarized school principal's office and sheriff's deputies have cleared up a south Seminole residence burglary and 18 auto burglaries in Orange County with the arrest of three teenagers.

Sanford police responded Tuesday night to a burglar alarm at Sanford Middle School and apprehended two 13-year-old boys in the ransacked office of principal Dan Pelham.

Patrolman D.H. Whitmore reported the juvenile suspects discovered a cache of stolen clothing, stereo tapes, golf clubs, canned goods and a bicycle in an orange grove near the south Seminole Trailwood Estates subdivision. Poole said items recovered were valued at more than \$1,000 and have been identified as loot from 18 recent auto burglaries in Orange County.

Kerry Gene Mason, 18, of Apopka, was charged with possession of stolen property in connection with the recovered items, Poole said.

Poole said \$1,129 in diamond rings, watches and camera equipment has been recovered in a separate case and two teenagers arrested for burglary.

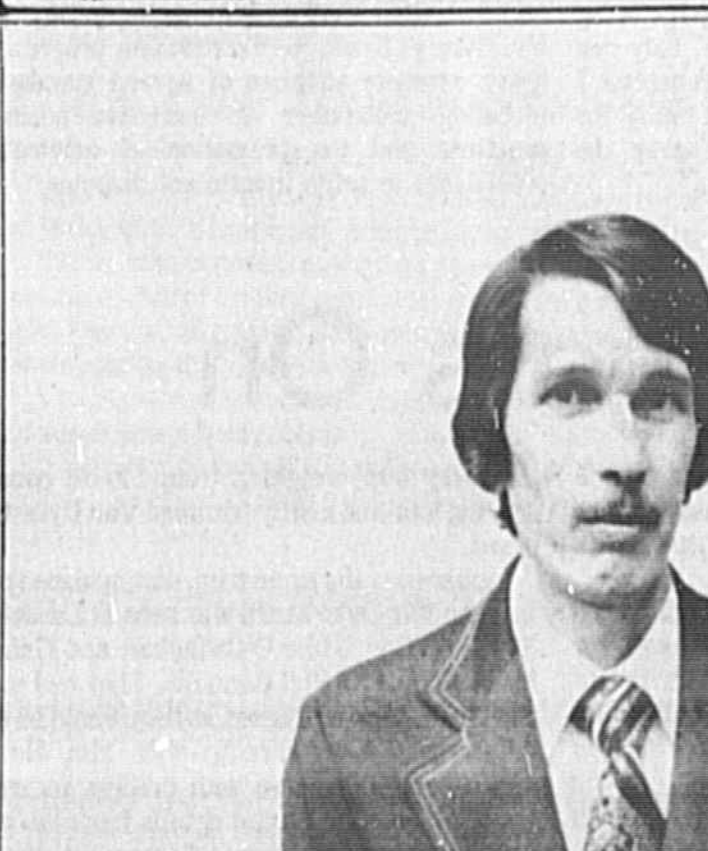

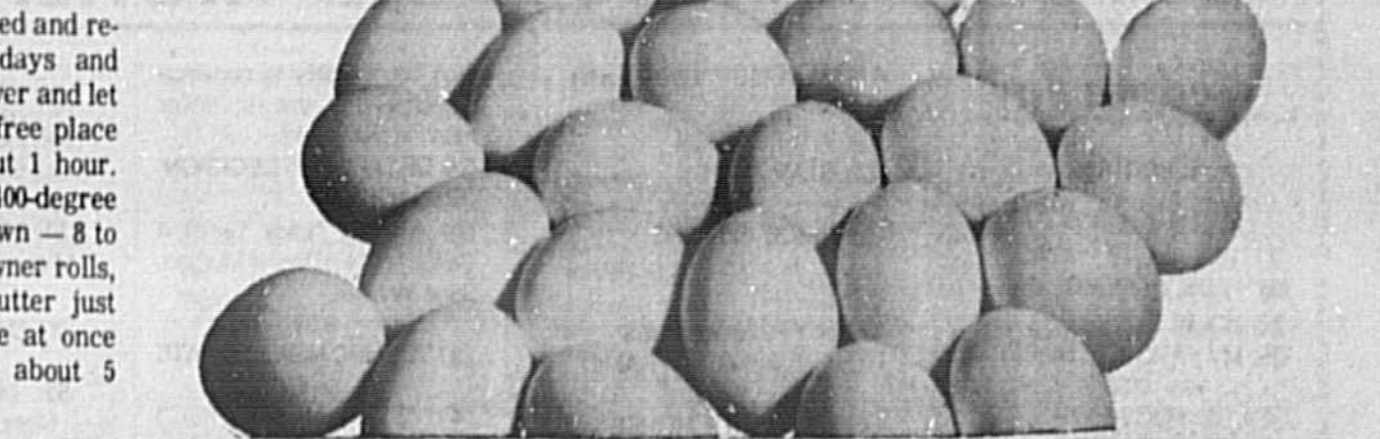
