

Syria's Action To Safeguard Lebanon Wins Praise

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - Christian praise for Syria's military intervention in the Lebannese civil war put the spotlight today on the alliance between Syrian President Hefez Assad and the Lebanese Christians opposed by Assad's former proteges, the leftist Lebanese

Lebanon's Christian president, Suleiman Franjieh, telegraphed Assad expressing his "gratitude for Syria's action to safeguard Lebanon."

Pierre Gemayel, whose rightwing Phalange party has the largest militia fighting on the Christian side, declared: "Assad has acted to resolve the tragic situation after a year of bloodshed and warmongering by the false

Assad is trying to force Kamal Jumblatt, the leader of the Lebanese left, into a political settlement preserving some power for the Christian minority. He warned Jumblatt Monday that he was "prepared to move into Lebanon to protect any victim of aggression," and he said his forces "have the capability to take any position we

Thailand Names Chief Of State

BANGKOK, Thailand (AP) - Khieu Samphan, one of the two Communists believed to be the dominant men in the Cambodian government, was named chief of state today, Radio Phnom Penh appounced. The other man believed to share power with him, Ieng Sary, remained a deputy premier, and the premier's post went to a virtual unknown, Tol Sat

Another veteran Communist of the Khmer Rouge phan as deputy premier and defense minister. Vorn Vet, unknown to observers in Bangkok, was named to a third deputy premiership, in charge of the economy.

Public Need And 'Big Oil'

Americans have by tradition viewed profit as a reward which stimulates business to try harder.

Of late, however, "bigness," the visible indication of profit, has come under attack. The oil companies, because of spiraling price of fuel, are the primary target.

And a few members of Congress, who should know better, have taken up the crusade to force the oil companies who explore for and produce oil, transport it, refine it and then market the products to divest themselves of all but one phase of the

These critics claim that the industry is noncompetitive and monopolistic and hint that high prices are a result of corporate greed.

But more than 50 oil companies can be disined as "integrated," engaging in three or more levels of the marketing operation. No one company produces more than 10 per cent of the nation's petroleum products. No one company accounts for more than 9 per cent of refining capacity. No one

The companies grew simply because they gave us efficiency and service. They can conduct their operations by the most economical methods.

By tuning the various phases of their well-tomarket activity, they can keep a steady flow of petroleum and petroleum products to the consumer. They can cope with seasonal demands and

During the Arab oil embargo, which triggered the major producers' current unhappy state, they were responsible, paradoxically for easing the crisis through their ability to redistribute supplies on short notice.

Punitive actions in Congress - even against only the six largest firms— would have as victims 14 million investors, who owns 90 per cent of the socalled "giants."

Divestitre would slow technical advance when we need it most. Capital for exploration would be depleted. In the end, the consumer would suffer through higher prices and little assurance of getting the energy he needs.

Hughes Era

The death of Howard Hughes brings to an end one of the most unusual - indeed eccentric - careers of an American entrepreneur. In an era of corporate decision-making and organization man, Mr. Hughes had retained the aura of a 19th century captain of industry and freewheeling financier.

The passion for privacy which kept Mr. Hughes out of the imelight for many years had tended to obscure his achievements as a pioneer of the aviation industry. With inherited wealth and a fascination with flying he became a backer of experimental aircraft and a builder of airlines when the business world was still skeptical about the future of

The personal power which financial success brought to Mr. lughes, and the manner in which he used it, ran counter to the tide as government and the public demanded more accountability from industry and its leaders. He may one day be regarded as America's last "tycoon" with the ambiguous ethical connotations which surround that word.



MIAMI (AP) - If you own a new Chevrolet, the car advertised as being as American as baseball, hot dogs and apple pie, there's a good chance the auto radio for which you've paid top dollar is a Japanese import.

Industry officials say hundreds of auto dealers, mainly General Motors outlets, imply that you are driving out of their showrooms with Americanmade radios from GM's Delco division. But in reality, the radios are foreign-made units which cost half as much and are designed to match the interior of your car.

There are no indications that the foreign brands are inferior in quality, only that the savings are not being passed on to consumers.

Birth Control Bill Blocked

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - Contending that passage would promote immorality, an all-male Senate committee has killed a bill to allow minors to obtain birth-control devices and information without the knowledge of their

The Senate Health and Rehabilitative Services Committee defeated the bill (SB503) on a 6-1 vote Tuesday, marking the fourth year in a row the proposal has been killed by Florida lawmakers.

Defeat came despite an appeal by Rep. Elaine Gordon, DMiami, who already had pushed the bill through a House committee, for the all-male Senate Panel to try to understand the problems of teenaged girls.

Cuban Exile Activist Shot

MIAMI (AP) - Cuban exile activist Ramon with U.S. authorities for repeated trips to the island, has been shot to death at his boatyard office. Police said Donestevez, 48, was shot five times at close range early Tuesday. One bullet struck him in the head, four in his abdomen. He died after being rushed to a

President Ford also honored Jefferson, saying he sees the third century of American independence as a century of individualism in the classical Jeffersonian sense. "I see it as a century of achievement and fulfillment for all Americans," Ford said in ceremonies at the Jefferson

Ford placed a wreath at the base of Jefferson's statue and signed bills designating Tuesday as Jefferson Day and naming an annex to the Library of Congress the Thomas Jefferson Building.
