Noble Leviathon Worth Rescuing
Sixty-or-so feet long, with an enormous,
blunt-nosed head, the sperm whale scours the depths of temperate seas for squid, cuttlefish ecology and its evolution over the millennla are reasons enough to save thls noble
levathon from extinction. (About 200,000 of the mammals remain.)
But the sperm whales' survival is uncer-
taln. Killing of these creatures was to have stopped this year under an agreement of the
International Whalling Commission. the 40 -member organization of major whaling countrles.
However.
However. Japan. where the sperm whale is
prized for its meat. has shown no inclination to go along with the ban. And the U.S. government regrettably has refused to impose
penalties on an ally and important' trading partner. even though federal law requires
sanctlons against countries that vilate IWC rules.
Instead
Instead, a so-called compromlse between
the two nations will allow Japan to continue hunting sperm whaies until 1988 without risking punishment. The Japanese are
permitted to take up to 400 sperm whales this season and the same number next year; the neturne the Japanese will stop all commerctal whaling by 1988, according to the Commerce
Department. But Japan denles that it has agreed to an
overall ban. And its reluctance to abide by IWC rules ralses questlons about the efectiveness of any unenforced restrictions on
sperm whaling. If Japan can get away with violations. other whaling countries may
follow sult, thus pushing other spectes of whales still closer to the brink of extinction. The United States ought to resume dis-
cusslons with Japan with an eye toward restricting filshing in Amertcan territorial
waters if the Japanese do not end the killing would doubtless protest loudly: its whaling Induatry employ morethen 50,000 peopler
