Home Building Under FHA Help
Record Level

Applications in U.S. Top \$100,000,000 For Second Month

The 1949 program of home building, which in April saw the \$100,000,000 mark in applications for FHA assistance, continued without faltering in May when applications again topped the \$100,000,000 mark.

According to Stewart McDonald, FHA assistant secretary for home building, applications for new homes to be built under the program showed a gain of 10 percent in May over the month of April and about 50 percent in comparison with the same month of 1948.

A total of 28,000 mortgages amounting to \$100,000,000 were submitted for approval by the FHA in May, an increase of 10 percent over the month of April, McDonald said. This was the largest number of mortgages in number since the April figure of 25,000 mortgages for a total amount of \$90,000,000.

May was also the most active month ever recorded under the FHA program for home building under its inspection, McDonald said. A weekly average of about 1,000 new mortgages for the month was recorded, the first time in the FHA's existence compared with the year's weekly peak of 1,100 in 1948. Time For The Soul

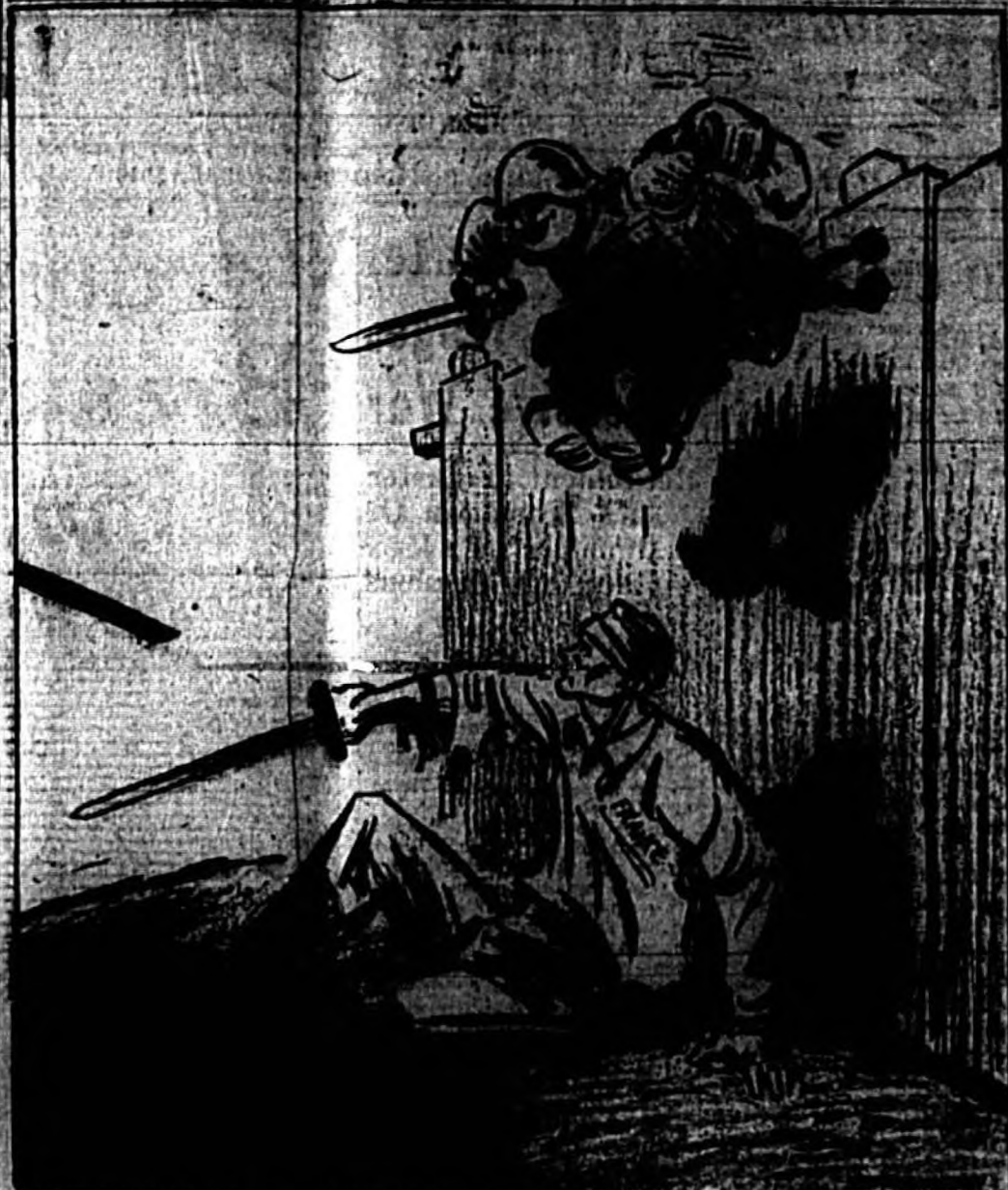

Germany Will Not Forget U. S. Aided Allies, Says Nazi

NEW ORLEANS, June 18.—(AP)—A German general reported yesterday that Germany will not forget the United States' aid to her very life, the United States, says every material aid to her, according to a statement made by Baron Edgar Von Spiegel, consul for eight southern states and Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands, in an interview with a New Orleans Times reporter. He later said he had not meant to talk for publication.

Von Spiegel's name figured in the Dies committee hearings in Washington last Aug. 22 when President Hoover's of France University said the Germans had attempted to give the school free German language books and Germany and questioned the status of the school's German professor, a witness, who refused to appear in Nazi Germany.

Von Spiegel said the books in question were "four or five fairy tales," offered as prizes for students, and "did any effort to incite Nazi propaganda in the university."

Von Spiegel yesterday disclaimed any German territorial ambitions in the western hemisphere, saying specifically "Germany does not want Florida, Georgia or Louisiana."

He said: "I am confident the German government will be satisfied with retaining her possessions in Africa—and possibly a little more."

Mr. Lamson kindly obliged and supplied us with more figures than you'll find in a show-up book. According to Lamson, the Seminoles' management, had to pay for the cost of uniforms, a road uniform for at least 12 players. The electricity to light the park runs to \$25 a game for all home games. And there is the little matter of replacing broken or worn out lights at \$2.00 a pop. Fans will remember one game recently in which no fewer than ten lights popped, costing the management a cool \$20.00 that was an unusual night, but the cost of lights over a season's time will run from \$200 to \$300.

Let's not be discouraged, there's more yet. Baseball runs to \$10 a game. Everytime you see a ball game over the fence that isn't for the masses, but for the elite, it's \$1.00 a pop. Most of the expenses, however, it's not in last night, but in balls that are broken or worn out or the cover on the ball. There are 100 balls in a game, and if you use a new one every time, that's \$100 a game. There is the cost of two meals for each ball player, or all out for games with the exception of Orlando and Daytona in which the players are allowed one meal.

And in case there are any people out there who think that's all, well, just last night we had \$100.00 for a week's social security, paymaster, and league assessments. After looking over those fancy figures, we think we'll give up our ambition to own a baseball team.
