

Kennedy **Backers** Boiling

Carter's top campaign aide today called for help from defeated Sen. Edward Kennedy, but some angry Kennedy supporters began to rebel after their candidate dropped out of the race for the

White House Monday night. Kansas supporters of Kennedy walked out of their delegations wearing "Dump Carter" buttons and there were other cracks in the unity that the president is anxious to build.

"We need his help and the help of his supporters very badly," Carter aide after Kennedy lost a key convention rules battle at the Democratic National Convention Monday night and publicly ended his campaign for the White House. winning the so-called "faithful delegate"

rule roll call 1,936.4 to 1,390.6. Kennedy quit 90 minutes later with a statement that had his loyal followers crying "oh, no!" - then chanting "84, '84." Carter, who flies to New York Wednesday and will be nominated for a second term that night, wants to heal his differences with Kennedy to build a united Democratic front against Republican candidate Ronald Reagan.

But with Reagan leading in virtually every national poll, the Democratic wounds continued to bleed today as: -Former Wisconsin Gov. Patrick Lucey, a top official in Kennedy's presidential campaign, resigned from the state's delegation to protest the Democratic convention's defeat of the open convention effort.

Sweeps The Middle East

By United Press International Hopes for an early resumption of the frozen Middle East peace talks faded today in a running battle of letters between Egypt and Israel over Jerusalem and

Afghan Kids Brainwashed

NEW DELHI, India (UPI) - The Soviet-installed regime is brainwashing Afghan children with threats, beatings and political indoctrination until they swear to support the government, a former Afghan officials

The official said Monday his own son had been arrested and imprisoned for 23 days for participating in a shouting demonstration at a school six weeks ago against Afghan President Babrak Karmal's Par-

"The new approach of the president's Parchamities is to arrest young students and boys between the ages of 13 and 21 in batches of 200 to 300 for a short period of 20 to 25 days," he said.

"During that time, they are subjected to threats, brainwashing and in a few cases physical violence. "Many of these boys apparently fell in line by giving written assurances they would not participate in antigovernment movements and would inform on others if approached to do so," he said.

Iran Prime Minister OK'd

By United Press International Iran's parliament moved a step closer to its longawaited debate on the American hostages by overwhelmingly endorsing hard-liner Mohammad Ali Rajai as the country's new prime minister.

Rajai, a former school teacher and education minister, elected by a 153-20 margin, with 19 abstentions, said he would name a new Cabinet within 10 days, the official Pars News Agency reported Monday. The parliment has been charged by Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini to solve the hostage cris, but its work had been postponed until a prime minister could be named. The hostages are in their 283rd day of

NATIONAL REPORT: Down-pours drenched much of the Midwest and sent rain-swollen creeks surging through eastern Ohio cities, forcing residents to abandon their homes. Flashflood watches were in effect today in parts of Texas drenched by the remnants of Hurricane Allen. The National Weather Service predicted record flooding today along Ohio's Wills Creek, which was expected to rise 10 feet over flood stage. The Southern Plains and the West were hot. Several places in Arkansas and Oklahoma reported temperatures over 100 degrees. Bullhead City, Ariz. recorded a high of 120 degrees. In New York, a 90-minute rainstorm, with thunderclaps that could be heard even on the floor of the noisy Democratic National Convention, knocked out power for more than 30,000 people in Nassau and Suffolk counties. "We've got tree limbs down, burned out transformers, as well power lines hit by lightning," a spokesman for the Long Island Lighting Co. said. From Goldsboro To Be Prosecuted

Seven of the eight persons arrested last month when Sanford police swept through Goldsboro to stop loitering will be charged with obstruction of justice, Chief Assistant State Attorney Chris Ray said today. Ray said he could not announce the name of the one who will

not face court action until all eight appear in court Friday to

A ninth person arrested the night of July 17 still faces felony reapons charges made by police, who say they found two ice picks in her purse. A tenth person arrested for disorderly conduct is under 18 years old and is being handled by th tuvenile justice system.

Ray said Sanford police have furnished him enough evidence on seven of the eight arrests to bring first-degree misdemenor

He said obstruction means interfering with a police officer possibility of disorderly conduct or unlawful assembly. "I believe they knew they were obstructing at the time," he said, explaining obstruction of justice covers a wide range of behavior, although he could not draw a line between behavior which was legal in the presence of a police officer and behavior

If convicted, the seven persons could be fined up to \$500 and sentenced to a year in the county jail. Last week, assistant state attorneys working on the Goldsboro cases said, based on the information they had been given by police, they could not bring charges in about half the

Opening arguments were held today in the murder trial of a Melbourne woman charged with the first-degree murder of her

A jury was picked to hear the case against Joyce Cummings, 18, charged with first degree murder and conspiracy in the death of optomist John Bradford in his home. Before the jury of 12 Seminole County residents was selected to hear the case against Cummings, who faces death in the electric chair if convicted as charged, defense attorney Joan Bickerstaff asked Circuit Judge J. Willima Woodson to

move the trial again. Thirty of the roughly 40 people called to court for jury duty said they had read or heard something about the case, he said. Prosecutor Dean Moxley replied that all but three of them said they could render an impartial decision. Woodson allowed selection to proceed and by 7 p.m., 12 jurors had been seated. Bradford's wife, Priscilla has already pleaded guity to bludgeoning her husband to death with an assortment of kit-



Energy Crisis Ours To Solve

The American Petroleum Institute says the United States can cut its oil imports in half within the next 10 years if it wants to. This raises the question of where responsibility for the "energy crisis" really lies.

The conventional wisdom is that first and foremost we are in trouble because the planet Earth has only a limite supply of the petroleum on which we have come to depend heavily for fuel. Further most of the oil that is left is beyond our borders, making us yulnerable to the power of foregin countries to control its price and supply.

True enough. But the API, which speaks, for the oil industry, is making the point that the extent to which this creates a "crisis" for the American people is still pretty much our own affair. As it is, we produce 80 percent of the energy we consume. It is within grasp, says the API, to derive 90 percent of our energy from domestic sources, relieving our economy of much of the pressure which the dependency on imports is creating.

As the API experts work it out, our present demand for about 8 million barrels of imported oil per day could be cut in half by 1990 by permitting more development of energy resources on federal land, by striking a "more careful balance" between environmental considerations and energy needs, by getting our derailed nuclear energy program back on the track, and by promoting more private development of synthetic fuels and other alternate energy sources.



Unlike the metals that humans have known for the past 8,000 years, metallic glass does not have a crystalline structure. It is cooled from a liquid so fast that, like glass, crystals

John J. Gilman, director of the Allied glass are arranged that gives it its unique

glasses is that they can be produced in useful forms economically," Gilman wrote in a report in the journal Science.

"As a result, on a comparative cost basis, they are potentially the strongest, toughest, most corrosion resistant and most easily magnetized materials known to man."

He said one significant disadvantage of metallic glass is that it cannot withstand temperatures of more than a few hundred

glass alloys. The materials are called Metglas, Gilman said they are finding uses in everything from razors to rockets.

One of their most promising applications, Gilman said, is in transformer cores. Because they are so easily magnetized, metallic glasses could cut by half the energy loss that occurs in standard transformers with steel

Because molten alloys must be cooled very rapidly to make metallic glass, the product comes out in continuous ribbon or filament form. The typical ribbon is five-hundredths of a millimeter thick. Thicker material would cool too slowly in the middle to avoid

The metallic glass ribbon can be woven to make fabrics, braided to make tubes, wrapped to make cylinders or laminated to
