### Mitchell Approved Plan

WASHINGTON (AP) - Former Nixon campaign aide Jeb Stuart Magruder has told the Watergate cover-up trial that John N. Mitchell approved the political intelligence plan that resulted in the Watergate break-in. Testifying as the third prosecution witness, Magruder quoted Mitchell as saying, "Let's give them the \$250,000 and see what they come up with."

### Food Price-Fixing Probed

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Justice Department is investigating possible illegal price-fixing of foods, one of the crucial areas in the nation's surging inflation. Atty. Gen. William B. Saxbe, elaborating on the Ford administration's recent push for stepped-up antitrust enforcement, said, "A far greater number of possible antitrust violations involving foods are under active investigation by the Antitrust Division."

### Nixon Defense Fund In Red

WASHINGTON (AP) - Rabbi Baruch Korff says his fund to pay former President Richard M. Nixon's legal fees is \$99,429 in the red with more bills expected. A source close to Nixon in San Clemente said that in the face of mounting hospital and legal costs, Korff's President Nixon Justice Fund will provide "essential assistance for Nixon to pay his bills. His entire finances could be substantially wiped out in a year," the San Clemente source

Aid Promised To India

DACCA, Pakistan (AP) - Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger arrived in hungry Bangladesh today after promising India upward of a million tons of American food grains in the next year. More appeals for American food awaited him in Bangladesh, where the threat of famine is even more acute than in India. Kissinger told newsmen the door to negotiations between Israel and the Arabs still appears to be open despite the Arab summit conference's recognition of the Palestine Liberation Organization's claim to the West Bank of the Jordan River. The secretary of state said he will probably visit the Middle East late next week to assess the prospects.

### Conference Ends On Pledge

RABAT, Morocco (AP) - The Arab summit conference has ended with a pledge of more than \$2 billion a year in oil money to Israel's enemy neighbors - Egypt, Syria, Jordan and the guerrillas of the Palestine Liberation Organization. The four-day conference's other major action was the recognition of the PLO as the government of a future independent Palestinian state on the West Bank of the Jordan River, occupied by Israel since the 1967 war.

### **Dutch Considering Demands**


THE HAGUE, Netherlands (AP) - The Dutch government says it is considering the demands of four convicts holding 16 hostages in the Scheveningen prison chapel since Saturday. But Justice Minister Andries van Agt said the cabinet was in no hurry to make a decision. The convicts, who are armed with at least two pistols and include a Palestinian hijacker, demanded that another Palestinian hijacker in the prison join them in the chapel. that a bus be supplied to take them to Amsterdam's Schiphol airport and that a plane be ready there to take them to an undisclosed destination.

MEXICO CITY (AP) - An early frost in September appears to have wiped out two years of experiments at the grain research center of Nobel Peace Prize winner Norman E. Borlaugh. The cold also cost Mexico more than half a million tons of grain.

### Nixon Critical, Stable

LONG BEACH, Calif. (AP) - Former President Richard M. Nixon is in critical condition today after lapsing into shock for three hours and experiencing internal bleeding following surgery for phlebitis. Dr. John C. Lungren said in statement that a team of physicians administered "countershock measures for three hours until a stable vascular (circulation) condition was once again restored" late Tuesday. He added, "The patient is still considered critical." Lungren said Nixon, 61, was under round-the-clock care by a team of specially trained intensive care nurses and that Dr. Eldon B. Hickman, the cardiovascular specialist who performed the operation,



Financially, much of U.S. industry is in sad shape. Replacement of obsolete equipment and some improvement costs normally come from the value of the dollars set aside that many companies literally cannot afford to modernize their worn-out or out-dated plants. Others do so

The outlook is even worse than painted above. Money borrowed for expansion and moder-nization at today's exorbitant interest rates will inflate production costs for years to come. In many cases, this will severely decrease the

The men in business are beset by un-

Even when they can get the money, many firms find it difficult to get the materials they need for modernization or expansion, or for producing consumer or industrial goods in sufficient quantities. Aluminum, coal, plastics, basic chemicals, paper and steel are in short supply. So are electric motors, metal castings and bearings. It is difficult to get business equipment

The wonder is not that stock prices are low but that with financing so difficult and the outlook uncertain, American business is now in the midst of an expansion drive that is little short of miraculous. Sizeable investment programs are underway in the basic materials industries. This year's capital spending in the paper industry will chemicals, 20 per cent. The forecast for next year is likewise promising. The size of these increases must be discornted for higher costs. But capital expenditures nave expanded in real

# Make Tea Sandwich For Party

By CECILY BROWNSTONE Associated Press Food Editor The only time I ever encounter old-fashioned homemade tea sandwiches is when my nextdoor neighbor, who grew up in Kentucky, serves them at a party. Hers are miles ahead of the bought cocktail sandwiches, straight out of a freezer, that occasionally I meet up with at other parties. Homemade tea sandwiches were at the height of their popularity from the '20s through the '40s. They came in a variety of shapes: rounds, squares, triangles and ribbons with savory fillings stacked between two to four layers of bread. In their heyday they were served at teas, receptions and bridge or mah jong parties. If you want to offer a delicious taste of nostalgia, they may appeal to you for party

fare. To spur you on, here is a tea-sandwich effort of my own in ribbon shape. The fillings were inspired by my Kentucky neighbor's way of teaming cheddar cheese with green pepper and mayonnaise and my own penchant for mixing deviled ham with chili sauce. A few rules. The bread must e extremely tresh and thinly sliced and the fillings compatible. The sandwiches must be covered with a tea towel (well wrung out of cold water) and then with wax paper, foil or plastic film. If they are made ahead and refrigerated, they must be left to stand at room temperature about an hour

before their covering is removed and they are served. RIBBON SANDWICHES 412-ounce can deviled ham 2 tablespoons chili sauce 1 cup grated (medium-fine) mild cheddar cheese 2 tablespoons minced green

Mayonnaise 15 thin slices bread In a small bowl stir together the deviled ham and chili sauce. In another small bowl stir together the cheese, green pepper and just enough mayonnaise (start with 1 teaspoonful) to make the mixture of good spreading but firm consistency. Spread the cheese mixture on 5 slices of the bread; cover with 5 more slices of bread and spread these with the deviled-ham mixture; top with remaining 5 slices of bread. Trim crusts from sandwiches: cut each into 3 ribbons. Makes

Layer's Flyer Misleading

# Discusses Suit

Controversy highlighted the Seminole County School Board meeting Wednesday evening when the chair refused to recognize a speaker on the agenda and the board debated the ethics of political flyers and the role of the superintendent in labor negotiations.

The meeting started amiably enough, with a discussion of the \$250,000 personal damage suit by the Seminole Education Association (SEA) against the board members. Board attorney Douglas Stenstrom said he had not had an opportunity to study the complaint, but he would make the appropriate legal replies within the next

With that, everyone but the few teacher organization officers thought the subject was closed. The SEA was listed on the agenda, but when its turn came to speak, Board Chairman Davie Sims refused to recognize the group. Outside the meeting room, several of the association officers suggested investigating the legal grounds for Sims' action.

Sims said after the meeting, he had checked with the board's counsel before acting. The reason for the refusal of recognition Sims told the audience was the absence on the agenda of the purpose of the SEA address to the board.

What he said after the meeting was that the board was not willing to allow the SEA to make points for their lawsuit, either by their comments or baiting the board to reply. He added, if the SEA has something new to tell the board, it would listen, but since the board was not informed of the subject of the SEA statement, it refused.

### 'Not For The Public'

public," Sims explained. "We don't have to listen to anyone. (Other speakers) added at the last minute to the agenda are not suing the board. When they (SEA) filed suit that draws the line."

tative of Educational Services Bureau of Washington, D.C. The soft spoken, representative explained the services the agency could provide the board, but could not quote a price schedule.

### No License To Practice

Stenstrom countered by asking if the Ph.D. had a license to practice law or give legal opinions in Florida. Moses admitted he did not. Stenstrom added, the law is "very specific:" the superintendent or his designated representative will handle the negotiations. The board is powerless to hire someone, without the recommendation of the superintendent, except in an advisory capacity. Moses was excused.

Sims brought up the issue of political flyers being distributed by a school district official, William Layer, superintendent of schools. He questioned the legality of such action on the basis of Stenstrom's advice last week which forbids the board to distribute through the schools information on any political issue which encouraged a particular point of view.

Stenstrom explained Wednesday if Layer did this with his own funds, and did not distribute them through the schools, there was nothing illegal. Sims was dissatisfied with the remark, and said he thought the entire affair was

It was further explained by Stenstrom the Layer flyer, urging a vote against the appointed superintendent, was not a political advertisement, according to one section of the election law. Political advertising was defined as only that information which dealt with a candidate for office.

### **Hasty Interpretation**

Dorothy Glisson, Florida State Secretary, conceded today Layer may be correct in his interpretation of the election law concerning the necessity of disclosing the publisher, printer and financier of political advertising. Glisson, whose interpretation Stenstrom said Wednesday evening may have been "too hasty," expressed reservation the legislature had intended to exclude publicity of ballot issues from the requirements of political advertising. Considering that groups supporting ballot issues are required to make financial disclosure, she was doubtful the legislature intended to exclude individuals who spend less than \$500 from this requirement

"Any campaign literature without financial disclosure is certainly not complying with the spirit of the
