HOOVER GIVES TALK BEFORE BAR MEMBERS

Scores "Seductive But Disastrous Governmental Theories Being Offered Nation"

WASHINGTON, Oct. 13.—(A.P.)—President Hoover told the American Bar Association last night that "seductive but unworkable and disastrous" theories of government are now being offered to the nation, and that the legal fraternity should "defend our system of government against reckless assaults of designing persons."

The President spoke in Constitution Hall before a gathering of attorneys, their ranks augmented by members of the supreme court and by distinguished legal leaders from other nations. He was introduced by Chief Justice Hughes who extended to him that greeting of "our personal confidence in his ability and purpose," which he recalled had been given by the same organization to President Wilson in 1914.

Youth Movements Decried By Leader Of German Society

BERLIN, Oct. 13.—(A.P.)—A maturity movement, to neutralize the world's too many "youth" movements, is being launched here by Max Thieler, leading theorist of Germany's physical culture enthusiasts.

He says the white race has become "dejuvenated" to the point of childishness and that it is high time for elders to take their age seriously.

"Youth's zeal for reform is futile," says Thieler, because "it believes in fighting where supervision, experience and patience would help infinitely more."

He says immaturity is natural in youth, it's a misfortune in age. Granting normal physical health, one has a fairly complete comprehension of contemporary knowledge at 50, reaches his wisdom at 60.

Thieler's views have gained many converts. He says his movement will have its first effect in the political sphere where its slogan of "good, knowledge, maturity, judgment and love," ought to get a response from the whole world.

USE OF ENZYMES IN MANY WAYS IS TOLD BY CHEMIST

Best Known Function Is Assisting In Digestion Of Foods

ITHACA, N. Y., Oct. 13.—(A.P.)—What is an enzyme?
Most persons neither know nor care and yet all is dependent upon enzymes and all plants and animals are full of them. Every body has heard of the enzyme pepsin, which digests meat in the stomach, but few have ever heard of the other hundreds of more enzymes which exist.

When yeast is added to a solution containing sugar the mixture soon begins to ferment. This is due to the presence in yeast of the enzyme "zymase," or ferment, known as "zymase."

When hydrogen peroxide is used as a septic, or put into a wound it begins to foam. The foaming is caused by the action of the enzyme catalase, present in blood and saliva, upon the hydrogen peroxide.

One may wonder whether enzymes are of any practical importance. The answer is that they are used in making leather, in the cheese industry, in preparing artificial sugar to be used by diabetics.

GREECE WILL PROBE ARREST OF SAM INSULL

Claim Made That Fugitive Was Held Without Any Authority; To Call Police Head

ATHENS, Oct. 13.—(A.P.)—The Greek government today ordered an inquiry to establish the responsibility for detention of Samuel Insull early this week, claiming Insull was held without authority.

The director of Athens police will be called upon for an explanation. Relief was expressed today that the government eventually will ask Insull to shorten his stay in the country. Officials of the American legation saw neither Insull nor the American consululate his passport which was taken from him by police when he was detained and presumably returned to him when he was released.

It was learned on good authority he has an intention to return to the United States voluntarily. Insull lawyers expressed astonishment at a report that the legation had been instructed to withdraw his passport. One lawyer commented this could not be done if his passport is entirely in order.

Maillefert Is Pictured By Courson As Bad Prisoner Resisting Fatherly Advice

JACKSONVILLE, Oct. 13.—(A.P.)—A picture of an angry and defiant prisoner who resisted fatherly efforts to get him to reform and serve his sentence peacefully was shown today by George W. Courson, former South-Atlantic camp captain charged with the youth's swindler death.

Taking the stand behind a parade of defense witnesses who, although differing in details somewhat, testified that Maillefert often threatened suicide and continually tried to escape.

Courson told the jury he had not been cruel to the boy, but had tried to do his duty and make Maillefert's life out of him. Smiling and occasionally licking his lips, Courson related he conferred with Maillefert to assist from causing trouble, but told him he had to see that sentence served.

Maillefert, he said, declared he had received his sentence and was going home. Courson answered, "No, you have nine years and I'm here to see you do it." The youth was quoted as answering, "No I'm going to hell then."

At one time Courson said Maillefert asserted "If you don't kill me you're a dirty dog." Courson admitted he once whipped Maillefert but in contrast with state witnesses, who said he used a hose like a boxer's coupling, Courson said the hose was "about as big as my finger," adding he let Maillefert up when another convict intercepted, saying he would show the captain where the saws were hidden by which Maillefert had cut his shackles.

SHOLTZ RECEIVES MUCH APPLAUSE IN FORT MYERS

Fort Myers, Oct. 13.—Four thousand enthusiastic citizens of Lee county heard Dave Sholtz, Democratic nominee for governor, in an address here last night. They applauded him and again Mr. Sholtz explained what he was going to do to help the common people of Florida.

The nominee assured his listeners he would lead an intensive fight against high cost of government. He declared his program for tax reduction would not impair the efficiency of government.

He promised to improve the school system and would give Florida citizens a chance to recuperate from the heavy tax burdens that have forced many to leave their homes and give up moderate possessions.

ROOSEVELT TO LEAVE OCT. 18 ON DIXIE TOUR

Campaign Trip Of 3000 Miles Will Also Include Middle West And Border States

ALBANY, N. Y., Oct. 13.—(A.P.)—Governor Roosevelt, the Democratic presidential candidate, will leave here on Oct. 18 for an eight day campaign trip of 3000 miles through the Middle West, the border states and into the South.

Roosevelt will make three major speeches on the trip, at Pittsburgh, on Oct. 19; St. Louis, on Oct. 21 and Baltimore on Oct. 25. Important addresses will be made at Indianapolis, Springfield, Louisville, and perhaps other stops on the trip.

Four years ago three of the states of the old South voted with President Hoover against Alfred E. Smith. The border states, West Virginia, Maryland, Kentucky, Tennessee and Missouri also were in Hoover's column.

Roosevelt will cross Ohio, in the Mid-West battle some five days after President Hoover makes a campaign speech at Cleveland. The Democratic nominee likely will not make an appearance in the turkey as his schedule calls for a night run across that state.

He has twice before appeared in Ohio. Pennsylvania will hear one of the three major speeches, Oct. 19, in Pittsburgh, home of Andrew Mellon, secretary of the Treasury under three presidents.

"Well get your legs packed, we're going traveling again," said Roosevelt, who personally handled out schedules of the trip.

Asked what would be the subject of his addresses during the trip, the nominee replied, "I can't say just now. I haven't prepared them."
