"The Chimneys" on Long Island. Pioneer residents of Sanford and Seminole county will recall that Mrs. Sanford was the daughter of the late Gen. Henry S. Sanford, former minister to Belgium and founder

of this city. Mrs. Sanford was well known by many of the older residents. having made her home in this city during the time when her father was involved with many development projects in this part of the state. It was in this city that Mrs.

Sanford became the wife of John Sanford, wealthy carpet manufacturer and former congressman in the state of New York. The marriage took place in 1892. (Mrs. Sanford's husband was her second cousin. Funeral services of Mrs. Sanford will be held today, the first at the home where she died and the second in Amsterdam, where she will be buried.




