Will Disney venture hurt local zoo?

Animal Kingdom opens just down the road from Sanford

SANFORD - Before Disney's Anunal Kingdom, there was the Central Florida Zoological


Established in 1933 as the Sautord Zoo, the park will not take an evasive action stance as the Orlando-based conglomerate stands ready to openits doors on a new themed at traction. Rather, the zon will confinue on its quest to provide locals with the best in conservation and education programs.

The Central Florida Zoo was hist established in 1903 as the Santord Zoo with donated antimals being held by the Sanford For Department. The Central Florida Zoological Society, which was formerly known as the Seminole Zoological Society, dedicated the site in 1973 and it was then called Central Florida Zoological Park On July 4, 1975, the zoo offictally

Since 1933 the zoo has moved around a bit. After the City of Sanford budgeted funds to maintain the collection of animals in 1939, it then moved. to the shores of Lake Monroe two years later where the Sanford City Hall stands today

In 1974, the zoo was threatened with extinction as the city was planning to dispose of the animal collection. The Semi-Zoological Society stepped in to help with support and over the next tosic years money was raised by citizens to build a new zoo, Seminole County donated a 109 acre tract of land, and, with the help of \$350,000 in senting about 100 species from

Winter Springs tot drowns in lake at park

WINTER SPRINGS - A 22month-old child died Monday at Torcoso Park, near the Winter Springs Fire Department. despite extensive efforts to revive him.

According to Winter Springs Police Chief Daniel Kerr. shortly after 6 p.m. Monday, Lieutenant Robert Heatwole, off duty and driving home for the day with his wife, spotted a commotion in the park. Heatwole said he observed a young woman go into a body of water in the park and pull up an ob-Ject which Heatwole recognized as a child.

Heatwole and his wife ran to the area while the officer phoned the Winter Springs Fire Department for assistance on his portable radio.

Once they reached the woman, they took the child and immediately started CPR until paramedics arrived and took

The child was taken to South Seminole Hospital where he was pronounced dead at 7:17 p.m.

Lake Mary will build police station downtown

LAKE MARY - The Lake Mary City Commission decided Thursday to build the new police station downtown.

Choosing the best of four options, the commissioners agreed to locate the new police station on East Crystal Lake Avenue while keeping the fire station at its current Rinehart Road site.

The police and fire departments are currently located in the same building on Rinehart. When the police department moves, the fire station site will be entirely renovated and reconfigured. The fire station will continue to share the Rinehart Road site with the public works depart-

Commissioners hope that locating the police station downtown will "kick start" development in that area. Susan Deines, sentor planner, said the Downtown Development Advisory Committee was unanimously in favor of the move, which would bring much needed infrastructure into the

Sewer lines installed to service the police station will provide connection opportunities for other users downtown.

The new station will be the "third corner to a triangular anchor of public service. buildings in the downtown commercial core district," a concept both the committee and the commission liked. The existing City Hall, at Lake Mary Boulevard and

Country Club Road and the Community Building, on Country Club and Grand Bend Avenue, are the other corners.

Commissioner Gary Brender said Friday that acquisition of the land would take about 120 days and the city hopes to "turn

diri" by October. Both the fire and police stations will be two-story structures, built to meet "essential building" qualifications for pub-

lic sheltering. Mayor David Mealor said the choice of the two sites best reflects "the picture the public bought into." Voters approved a referendum to build the new stations several

years ago. The proposed cost of the option commissioners chose is \$4,823,465.



Watch for crossing cranes on busy road

SANFORD The Seminole County Traffic Engineering Department installed caution signs Monday on Airport Boulevard, adjacent to the Seminole County Health Department and Renaissance Retirement Community.

The "Wildlife Crossing" signs were installed after Terry Auer, an employee of the health department, saw a chick with a pair of sandhill cranes that frequent the area. They hang out here a lot," sald Auer, who saw the chick Thursday,

This is the second year a nesting pair has been spotted with a chick. Last year, a family was "adopted" by the residents of Renalssance, but the chick was found dead in the parking lot of the adjacent shopping center, presumed to have been hit by an automobile. Auer was aware of the fatality and called the county, in hopes of preventing a similar incident.

The cranes, who use the marsh around Lake Ada for breeding, cross the busy highway to feed in the fields around the retirement community and near the health department. Sandhill cranes breed between the months of January and June.

Renee Bumgardner, with traffic engineering, said the signs are used in areas of the county which are known wildlife corridors.



The QUAD Unit responded to 870 complaints and initiated 3,201 contacts, some resulting in arrests. During the quarter the unit seized 293.40 grams of controlled substances, one firearm and \$2,046 in U.S. cur-

QUAD made a total of 350 arrests for the first quarter - 87 for possession of a controlled substance, 15 arrests for sale and delivery/purchase of a controlled aubstance, 71 felony arrests and 177 misdemeanor arrests.

Dillard said that the SPD is implementing a community oriented policing program that will begin at there different lo-

cations. Officers Terri Murray and Alan Smith have already begun their work at Area One in Goldsboro. They have contacted several businesses and community leaders and attended community meetings. Both have been very professional," Dillard said.

Code enforcement had found such problems as broken and inoperable grease trap, inadequate plumbing, junk and debits and general unsanitary conditions. The Seminole County Health Department was also involved, with concerns that the grease trap may be overflowing into a nearby ditch.

Commission takes action on saltwater fishing issues

TALLAHASSEE _ The Marine Fisheries Commission held a four-day public meeting in Hollywood and took the following action:

Spotted Seatrout/Red Drum Rules-Final Public Hearing

The Commission held a final public hearing on proposed rules that would:

 Require that undersize spotted seatrout from other states that enter Florida in interstate commerce be documented and individually tagged to identify the state of origin and the name of the business entity shipping the fish (tags must remain attached to the fish until final retail sale).

* Require that spotted seatrout from other states that enter Florida in interstate commerce out-of-season and are transported in Florida for sale as food be individually tagged to identify the state of origin and the name of the business entity shipping the fish (tags must remain attached to the fish until final retail sale).

Require that non-native red drum transported in Florida for sale as food be individually tagged to identify the state of origin and the name of the business entity shipping the fish (tags must remain attached to the fish until final retail sale).

The Commission voted to take these proposed rules to the Governor and Cabinet for approval, along with proposed rules recently passed by the Commission to manage the instate aquaculture of red drum and spotted scatrout, in January 1998.

Punta Gorda Mullet Rule -Final Public Hearing

The Commission held a final public hearing on a proposed rule that would-within the City of Punta Gorda from November 1 until March 1 each year-prohibit the harvest of mullet between the hours of 6:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. The Commission will take this proposed rule to the Governor and Cabinet for approval in the near future.

Shrimp/Stone Crab Lines Rule -Final Public Hearing

The Commission held a final public hearing on proposed rule amendments that would change the Citrus-Hernando shrimp. stone crab zone coordinates to be compatible with the latest technological equipment and charts, amend the H-I line in the area to lie on a latitude, and revise the area's Zone II coordinates to correspond with designated shrimp closed areas. The Commission will take these proposed rule amendments to the Governor and Cabinet for approval in the near future.

Broward County Special Management Zone Rule - Final Public Hearing

The Commission voted to withdraw a proposed rule to establish a special management zone in Broward County waters. Correspondence received by the Commission from Broward County indicated that the county could not satisfy the Commission's local rule enforcement criteria.

The Commission received scientific and public comment and reviewed the management of Florida snook. The Commission intends to consider changes to snook management in 1998, and directed staff to schedule a series of statewide public workshops to receive comment on proposals that would:

• Reduce the daily bag limit for snook from 2 fish per person to 1 fish statewide.

 Establish minimum/maximum size slot limits for snook of 26-34 inches, 28-36 inches, or 30-38 inches total length state-

* Add either the month of February or May to the snook statewide closed season.

 Allow the harvest of snook by spearing, as requested by a representative of the Professional Association of Diving Instructors (PADI) - currently, snook may only be legally harvested by hook and line.

The Commission intends that implementation of any snook rule changes would take effect on January 1, 1999 if approved.

Serial batterers dangerous menaces

DEAR ABBY: As the founder of court program that specializes in domestic violence cases and the author of two books on the topic of spousal abuse, I have performed more lethality assessments of batterers (25,000) than any other pro-fessional in the United States. As a victim's advocate, I feel compelled to respond to Jason Larix of Montana, who felt that you exaggerated the number of women killed each year by their husbands or boyfriends.

that approximately 1,400 women annually are murdered by an intimate partner, these figures actually underestimate batterers' lethality. Many such homicides are never properly classified, while others go unsolved and the victim's relationship to the killer is never determined. In addition, the deaths of many women occur as a cumulative result of injuries received during years of habitual beatings, and their deaths are not reported as homicides.

A significant testimonial of batterers' lethality is the number of family members, friends, neighbors and children who are slain when they get caught in the crossfire of unbridled rage. All things considered, it is quite probable that, as you stated in your recent column, batterers are responsible for approximately 4,000 deaths each year. To realize that such men are responsible for the deaths of 11 peoconcerned that our society fails to recognize that not all batterers are the same. While the nonhabitual offender may be nonlethal and treatable, the chronic offender is often homi-cidal and beyond rehabilitation.

It also concerns me that while society readily accepts the terms "serial rapist" and "serial killer" to refer to men who habitually rape and murder multiple victims, it fails to acknowledge that men who habitually batter multiple female fact is, the serial batterer is one of the most dangerous individuals in American society, and we must stop excusing him and minimizing his existence

DEAR MICHAEL: I agree that serial batterers should be removed from society in much the same way as any other seri-al criminal. However, I would prefer to focus attention on the part of the problem that is fixable. The majority of domestic abuse comes at the hands of men whose anger escalates from 0 to 100 in seconds. They are not psychopaths. These are individuals who lash out with their fists or the nearest knife or gun at the slightest provocation. If they are willing to admit they have a problem, they can



anger management. However, I fear the serial batterer cannot be helped.
