## Will Disney venture hurt local zoo?

### Animal Kingdom opens just down the road from Sanford

SANFORD - Before Disney's Animal Kingdom, there was the Central Florida Zoological Park.

Established in 1933 as the Sanford Zoo, the park will not take an evasive action stance as the Orlando-based conglomerate stands ready to open its doors on a new themed attraction. Rather, the zoo will continue on its quest to provide locals with the best in conservation and education programs.

Andrea Farmer, spokeswoman for the zoo, likened the situation to that of the Lampa Bay area. "It's the same situation that the (Lowry Park) zoo in Lampa faced when Busch Gardens opened," she said. Farmer said that Disney's park will attract the tourists where as the zoo will cater to the locals and the occasional tourist. "Eco tourism is hot in Florida," she said. "We have had people from out of state and out of the country visit."

The Central Florida Zoo was first established in 1933 as the Sanford Zoo with donated animals being held by the Sanford Fur Department. The Central Florida Zoological Society, which was formerly known as the Seminole Zoological Society, dedicated the site in 1973 and it was then called Central Florida Zoological Park. On July 4, 1975, the zoo officially opened.

Since 1933, the zoo has moved around a bit. After the City of Sanford budgeted funds to maintain the collection of animals in 1939, it then moved to the shores of Lake Montross two years later where the Sanford City Hall stands today.

In 1971, the zoo was threatened with extinction as the city was planning to dispose of the animal collection. The Seminole Zoological Society stepped in to help with support and over the next four years, money was raised by citizens to build a new zoo. Seminole County donated a 109-acre tract of land, and with the help of \$350,000 in

raised funds and 2,200 members of the Zoological Society, the zoo finally came to fruition. The park had considered moving to another site. Turkey Lake Park, Desert Ranch and Yankee Lake Park were proposed moving destinations. However, a 1995 survey of residents showed that the populace wanted the zoo to stay exactly where it is.

There are animals representing about 100 species from

around the world at the zoo. Elephants, hippos, reptiles, monkeys, etc. populate the park currently. But more animals are expected in the near future.

The zoo has plans for expansion. Exhibits coming up include Lizards of the Island with variations of reptiles such as the crocodile monitor, The amur leopard, a very endangered species from Russia and

## Sanford Police Department: Busy first quarter

SANFORD - In the first three months of 1998, the Sanford Police Department received and responded to 19,261 calls for service and patrolled

109,722 miles.

There was a total of 410 index crimes (murder, rape, robbery, assault, burglary, theft and auto theft) reported in the quarter. There were 12 rapes, 1 murder, 197 burglaries and 181 auto thefts reported.

Police Chief Joe Dillard said that 31.4 percent of the 410 crimes were cleared by arrests. The first quarter statistics were made available in a SPD Quarterly Report booklet.

The SPD is an extremely active agency that must cope

with the highest municipal crime index in Seminole County. It patrols approximately 17.7 square miles of a city with a population of 98,000. "Work Sanford and you can work anywhere," one SPD officer has said.

The agency's Investigative Division comprised of six investigators handled 463 cases in the quarter and made 38 arrests and recovered \$249,008 worth of stolen property.

The Traffic Unit issued 839

## Lake Mary will build police station downtown

LAKE MARY - The Lake Mary City Commission decided Thursday to build the new police station downtown.

Choosing the best of four options, the commissioners agreed to locate the new police station on East Crystal Lake Avenue while keeping the fire station at its current Rinehart Road site.

The police and fire departments are currently located in the same building on Rinehart. When the police department moves, the fire station site will be entirely renovated and reconfigured. The fire station will continue to share the Rinehart Road site with the public works department.

Commissioners hope that locating the police station downtown will "kick start" development in that area. Susan Deines, senior planner, said the Downtown Development Advisory Committee was unanimously in favor of the move, which would bring much needed infrastructure into the area.

Sewer lines installed to service the police station will provide connection opportunities for other users downtown.

The new station will be the "third corner" to a triangular anchor of public service buildings in the downtown commercial core district, a concept both the committee and the commission liked. The existing City Hall, at Lake Mary Boulevard and

Country Club Road and the Community Building, on Country Club and Grand Bend Avenue, are the other corners.

Commissioner Gary Brender said Friday that acquisition of the land would take about 120 days and the city hopes to "turn dirt" by October.

Both the fire and police stations will be two-story structures, built to meet "essential building" qualifications for public sheltering.

Mayor David Meador said the choice of the two sites best reflects "the picture the public bought into." Voters approved a referendum to build the new stations several years ago.

The proposed cost of the option commissioners chose is \$4,823,465.

## Winter Springs tot drowns in lake at park

WINTER SPRINGS - A 22-month-old child died Monday at Torcoso Park, near the Winter Springs Fire Department, despite extensive efforts to revive him.

According to Winter Springs Police Chief Daniel Kerr, shortly after 6 p.m. Monday, Lieutenant Robert Heatwole, off duty and driving home for the day with his wife, spotted a commotion in the park. Heatwole said he observed a young woman go into a body of water in the park and pull up an object which Heatwole recognized as a child.

Heatwole and his wife ran to the area while the officer phoned the Winter Springs Fire Department for assistance on his portable radio.

Once they reached the woman, they took the child and immediately started CPR until paramedics arrived and took over.

The child was taken to South Seminole Hospital where he was pronounced dead at 7:17 p.m.



## Watch for crossing cranes on busy road

SANFORD - The Seminole County Traffic Engineering Department installed caution signs Monday on Airport Boulevard, adjacent to the Seminole County Health Department and Renaissance Retirement Community.

The "Wildlife Crossing" signs were installed after Terry Auer, an employee of the health department, saw a chick with a pair of sandhill cranes that frequent the area. "They hang out here a lot," said Auer, who saw the chick Thursday.

This is the second year a nesting pair has been spotted with a chick. Last year, a family was "adopted" by the residents of Renaissance, but the chick was found dead in the parking lot of the adjacent shopping center, presumed to have been hit by an automobile. Auer was aware of the fatality and called the county, in hopes of preventing a similar incident.

The cranes, who use the marsh around Lake Ada for breeding, cross the busy highway to feed in the fields around the retirement community and near the health department. Sandhill cranes breed between the months of January and June.

Reece Bumgardner, with traffic engineering, said the signs are used in areas of the county which are known wildlife corridors.



# Sanford revokes license, closes inn

SANFORD - The occupational license of American West Indian Inn, 1407 W. 13th Street in Sanford, has been revoked. The Sanford City Commission made the decision last week, following a public hearing.

The city's Community Development Department, Code Enforcement Division and Sanford Police compiled a list of 10 problems associated with the operation of the establish-

ment, and notified the owner, Sydney Spence, on April 3. Since that time, the city has determined that only 2 of the 10 problems have been resolved.

Code enforcement had found such problems as broken and inoperable grease trap, inadequate plumbing, junk and debris and general unsanitary conditions. The Seminole County Health Department was also involved, with concerns that the grease trap may be overflowing into a nearby ditch.

In addition, the Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Hotels and Restaurants, had listed 32 separate violations. According to Sanford Community Development Director Charles Rowe however, he has been informed that the state has found all of these violation have been handled, and has granted back the restaurant license which had been revoked earlier.

Spence last week addressed the commission regarding the matter, suggesting that at-

tempts were being made to alleviate other difficulties noted by the city, but he was unable to convince the commission to allow the establishment to continue operation.

During discussion of the matter, Sanford police Commander Ray Bronson reported that it was at the West Indian Inn where two city police cars were damaged during an incident. Police Chief Joe Dillard said since March of this past year, the city police have been called to the establishment 226 times for such crimes as shootings, stabbings and other situations.

There were also complaints voiced regarding drug sale activities being noted in the establishment's parking lot.

Following the public hearing, Commissioner Whitley Eckstein moved to revoke the occupational license at least until the other 8 items on the city's list were cured. With Commissioner Velma Williams voting against the motion, it passed 4 to 1.

It was then moved to revoke the certificate of alcoholic beverage registration, which passed by unanimous vote.

Rowe said his office has been contacted by Spence since the meeting, and a re-inspection of the property has been scheduled. "If the commission knew that Mr. Spence believes he has brought all of the items up to code, they probably wouldn't have voted to pull the license Monday night, but we'll see what happens with this inspection, and perhaps the city can return the license soon."

**Take control of your life**

DEAR DR. GOTT: I've developed a habit of pulling my hair. It seems to get me over the hard spots. It started when my mother died. Then shortly thereafter, I became pregnant. My husband didn't want the child. He withdrew from me and now finds fault with everything I do. I can never say or do anything right. I have no self-esteem. I'll be glad when this life is over, so I won't remember all the mistakes I've made. This is not a prank letter. Should I get a divorce? I'm seriously thinking about it.

DEAR READER: Your letter, which I have shortened, is very touching. I was particularly moved by your observation that once your life is over, you won't have to remember the mistakes. Your hair pulling is an understandable reaction to the emotional pain you have experienced.

I have undergone physical therapy, chiropractic adjustment and acupuncture, without improvement. My doctor said to be patient. The situation should resolve over time. Is there anything more I can do?

DEAR READER: Lacunar strokes are relatively common and cause a wide array of symptoms... usually vague sensations in one or another part of the body. Although usually caused by tiny blood clots, lacunar strokes can also result from small hemorrhages, as in your case. In these instances, anti-coagulant medication must be avoided to prevent further bleeding. Lacunar strokes are more common in hypertensives, dia-

betics and smokers. Therefore, your doctor will probably monitor your blood pressure, check your blood sugar and insist that you give up cigarettes, if appropriate. Other than that, no treatment is available. With time, your symptoms should resolve.

Let me give you some tough love. You've lived through your mother's death. You're surviving a relation in which your child was unwanted.

You're considering divorce. This is more to deal with than the average person has in a lifetime. I read of you with having an enormous amount of psychological strength. Rather than wallowing in a loss of self-esteem, you should be rejoicing in an indomitable human spirit. You are a survivor.

Stop pulling your hair. Get counseling. Take charge of your life. Don't blame yourself for what has happened, although obviously a couple's problems are a shared responsibility. Forget the hair, deal with the vital issues now.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I need to have relatively minor surgery, but I don't want a scar. Surely with modern techniques this should be possible. No?

**A week to end the year**

This week, I'm going to show you the most amazing deals - good and bad - that I saw this year and haven't yet written up.

This deal occurred during the open series match between Germany and Sweden in the European Championships.

On the first round, the Swedish West bid a natural two spades. North jumped to four spades to show a very strong three suiter. He assumed his partner would know the bid wasn't natural, because with good spades he would double West's overall. It was a reasonable assumption, but a debatable bid. Why should they be able to make five of anything? However, the

inference was missed by South.

Now West refused to accept his good fortune. Going for all the money, he doubled. In about a nanosecond, North ran to four no trump, reinforcing the previous message, and one that was no longer wasted on South. However, he bid a cautious five clubs, when a jump to six could hardly be criticized. Yet North was still there, bidding as if he had a 12 winner hand! Finally, South realized that he had golden cards, raising to seven clubs.

Declarer had no trouble in winning all 13 tricks, ending with a plus score of 1440. If West had passed out four spades, South would probably have gone six down (winning two hearts and two diamonds) for minus 300. Perhaps this is the most expensive double of a nonvulnerable contract ever. Or do you know differently?



## Commission takes action on saltwater fishing issues

TALLAHASSEE - The Marine Fisheries Commission held a four-day public meeting in Hollywood and took the following action:

**Spotted Seatrout/Red Drum Rules-Final Public Hearing**

The Commission held a final public hearing on proposed rules that would:

- Require that undersize spotted seatrout from other states that enter Florida in interstate commerce be documented and individually tagged to identify the state of origin and the name of the business entity shipping the fish (tags must remain attached to the fish until final retail sale).
- Require that spotted seatrout from other states that enter Florida in interstate commerce out-of-season and are transported in Florida for sale as food be individually tagged to identify the state of origin and the name of the business entity shipping the fish (tags must remain attached to the fish until final retail sale).
- Require that non-native red drum transported in Florida for sale as food be individually tagged to identify the state of origin and the name of the business entity shipping the fish (tags must remain attached to the fish until final retail sale).

The Commission voted to take these proposed rules to the Governor and Cabinet for approval, along with proposed rules recently passed by the Commission to manage the in-state aquaculture of red drum and spotted seatrout, in January 1998.

**Punta Gorda Mullet Rule - Final Public Hearing**

The Commission held a final public hearing on a proposed rule that would within the City of Punta Gorda from November 1 until March 1 each year prohibit the harvest of mullet between the hours of 6:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. The Commission will take this proposed rule to the Governor and Cabinet for approval in the near future.

**Shrimp/Stone Crab Lines Rule - Final Public Hearing**

The Commission held a final public hearing on proposed rule amendments that would change the Citrus-Hernando shrimp, stone crab zone coordinates to be compatible with the latest technological equipment and charts, amend the H-1 line in the area to lie on a latitude, and revise the area's Zone II coordinates to correspond with designated shrimp closed areas. The Commission will take these proposed rule amendments to the Governor and Cabinet for approval in the near future.

**Broward County Special Management Zone Rule - Final Public Hearing**

The Commission voted to withdraw a proposed rule to establish a special management zone in Broward County waters. Correspondence received by the Commission from Broward County indicated that the county could not satisfy the Commission's local rule enforcement criteria.

**Snook**

The Commission received scientific and public comment and reviewed the management of Florida snook. The Commission intends to consider changes to snook management in 1998, and directed staff to schedule a series of statewide public workshops to receive comment on proposals that would:

- Reduce the daily bag limit for snook from 2 fish per person to 1 fish statewide.
- Establish minimum/maximum size slot limits for snook of 26-34 inches, 28-36 inches, or 30-38 inches total length statewide.
- Add either the month of February or May to the snook statewide closed season.
- Allow the harvest of snook by spearing, as requested by a representative of the Professional Association of Diving Instructors (PADI) - currently, snook may only be legally harvested by hook and line.

The Commission intends that implementation of any snook rule changes would take effect on January 1, 1999 if approved.

## Hogan's early training paying off for Patriots

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS - When lacrosse started at Lake Brantley a few years ago, Danny Hogan had a special advantage.

He comes from Maryland. In Maryland, kids grow up with lacrosse sticks the way kids in Florida grow up with football helmets. Johns Hopkins, Loyola, Towson State and Maryland are always among the top-10 nationally even though the game is spreading rapidly.

In Maryland, you know how to cradle, shoot, catch and scoop early on. It's a Maryland way of life.

In Florida, there are still people who look at someone carrying a lacrosse stick and wonder how in the world they'll catch fish with that thing.

In short, Hogan grew up playing the game, moved to Florida and has established himself as the county's top scoring threat for Lake Brantley which has suffered only one loss all season, that to a team from New York where lacrosse is almost as big.

Hogan started at age seven and played until eighth grade when his family relocated to Florida, where

no one played the game.

"I thought it was the end of the world," Hogan said. "When it was time to go to high school, I knew I couldn't play, but then we heard Lake Brantley was offering it. That's why we moved where we did, because Lake Brantley offered lacrosse."

The sport grew quickly and Hogan led the way, not just at Lake Brantley, but throughout the county. He has already scored 57 goals and has 59 assists this season. He said he helps out during the summer teaching his teammates to learn the intricacies of the game, including the fact that it's not all about plastering your opponents to the field on every play.

"Maryland lacrosse is all about finesse," he said. "Everybody can handle the stick. Down here, it's a lot more scrappy and hard hitting, and the selling points of the game are all about contact and the fact that it's a lot like soccer. But our biggest selling point at Lake Brantley is that we're good."

Last season, the Patriots struggled to a 5-11 season with a very young lineup that improved throughout the season. Almost everyone played club lacrosse over the

## Spotted Seatrout

The Commission received a stock assessment and public comment regarding the spotted seatrout fishery, and agreed to maintain the current management of this fishery until a more comprehensive stock assessment is completed in 1999.

## Stone Crab/Blue Crab Traps

The Commission reviewed a stock assessment of the stone crab fishery, and received scientific and public comment on recommendations to limit the number of licenses and traps in this fishery. The Commission intends to support legislation that would extend the current moratorium on stone crab permits for one year, establish a self-sustaining trap tagging program to begin as soon as possible, prohibit trap leasing, establish a moratorium on blue crab trap permits, and provide for a mediation process if necessary to assist in developing a workable plan to manage the number of stone crab traps in Florida waters. The Commission also directed staff to continue working with the stone crab industry to further develop trap management plans.

## 1998 Work Plan

The Commission received scientific, law enforcement, and public comment and reviewed the management and status of numerous Florida saltwater fisheries. The Commission agreed to include the following fisheries and saltwater fishing issues on its 1998 work plan: calico scallops, squid (including public workshops), mullet, fishing gear, provisions regarding the possession of regulated fish, gray triggerfish, cobia, black drum, fishing tournaments, certain tropical ornamental fish species, reef fish, shrimp, and other issues as they develop during the year. The Commission also directed staff to formally request the official position of the Professional Association of

Diving Instructors (PADI) regarding its representative's request to allow spearing of any fish that may be taken by hook and line (such as snook, billfish, tarpon, bonefish, etc.).

## SHUPE'S SCOOP

Pay careful attention to the new proposed snook rules. It seems a little odd to me that the Marine Fisheries Commission would reduce the limit from two to one for anglers, while allowing divers to shoot them with spearguns. I'm a diver, but I don't consider it fair sport to shoot gamefish with a spear.

## FISHING FORECAST

Expect tough bass fishing to continue with high water levels. Stick to local lakes for the best results. Shiners and plastic worms are top choices for this time of year.

Snook are hitting at Sebastian Inlet. Large live shrimp, pinfish or finger mullet all work well. Most anglers prefer large live shrimp or one-ounce jugs. Some bluefish, ladyfish, jack crevalle, flounder and trout will also be mixed in with snook catches.

High seas will probably keep boats in port this weekend at Port Canaveral. It is usually about the middle of May before seas finally subside and the fishing really heats up. Inside the Port, count on sheepshead and a few flounder. Trout and redfish are beginning to move on the flats of the Banana and Indian Rivers.

Bluefish and sheepshead are the main attraction at Ponce Inlet. Redfish, drum, jack crevalle and ladyfish are also present in fair numbers. Live or dead shrimp is the top bait. Trout and redfish are rated as good in Mosquito Lagoon.
