

LAKE SUCCESS, N Y. Dec. 2—(AP)—The United States today attacked the dis-armament program which Russia has proposed for the United Nations.

Senator Tom Connally, speaking for the United Sintes, said today the idea of the Russian program seems to be to get iid of the atom bomb and then place all other erms questions under the Security Council where they would be subject to what he called the "atom bomb of the

### Snow To Order

Would Florida's winter tourists like to go ice skating? Does the Yankee farmer want December moisture for his winter wheat? In today's new world, play and production needs like these can be supplied at will. For now man can make a snow fall, the amount and the date calculated to a nicety. The other day officials of the General Electric Co. demonstrated this kind of manufactured weather. Flying over Greylock Mountain in Massachusetts six pounds of dry ice pellets were dropped through a cloud, and lo! within two minutes, snow fell, real snow.

As a result of the experiment, Dr. Irving Langmuir, company technician, says that snow-making is a simple and practical matter. It can be used at resorts to cover ski slides. It can be used for irrigation and water power projects. Airports could be cleared of heavy clouds by forcing them to drop their moisture in a snow fall, and disappear. Similarly clouds moving toward urban areas could be emptied of their snow loads before they reach those congested areas, to the great aid of municipal snowclearing forces.

It's all a simple process, too, says the scientist. A single dry ice pellet the size of a pea dropped through the air, might produce several tons of snow. In five hours flight, a single plane could generate hundreds of millions of tons of snow over a large area. The cost would be relatively small, involving the price of the dry ice, the plane and the salaries of the flyers.

There are people who like snow-poets, and little children with new sleds and those indescribably vigorous souls who go in for skiing. They will rejoice to learn that snow falls can be made to order as to depth and date. But the rest of the human species will wish those clever, scientists had put their talents to something more pleasant in weather producing. Making sunshine, for example,
