16 New Rules Laid Down For Exchanges

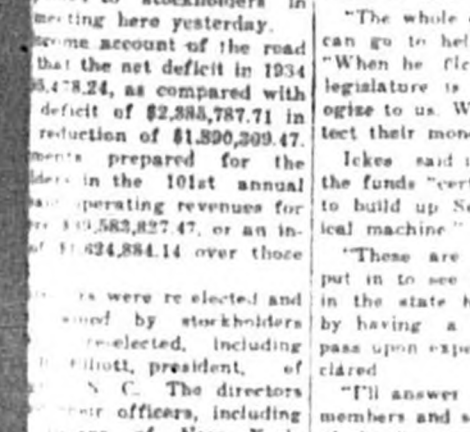

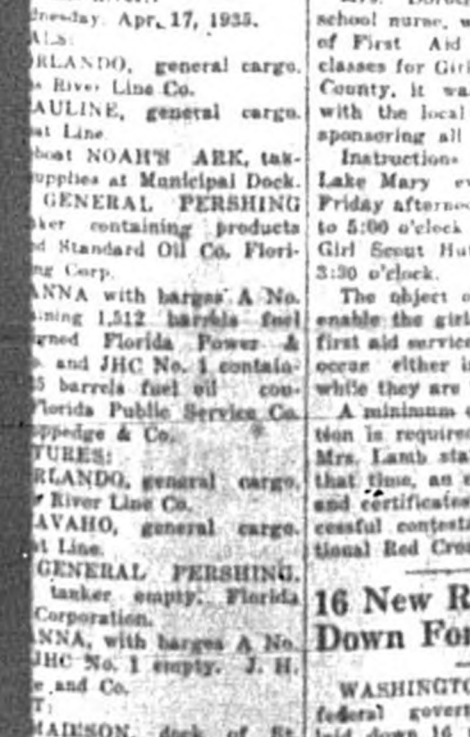

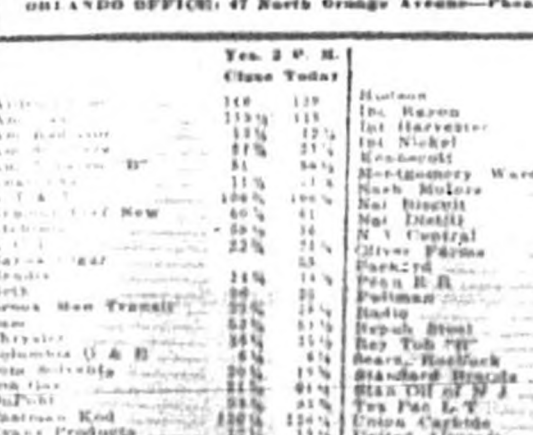

Now Is The Time To Buy

About two years ago we warned people that prices were going up and that if our readers wanted to take advantage of the then very low prices they should buy at once. Since then prices actually have gone up substantially and those who made purchases at that time have benefited considerably.

It required no unusual powers of discernment to anticipate this rise in prices, though some people who had seen prices steadily going down had ever since 1929, could scarcely believe it. President Roosevelt had publicly announced that he was going to raise prices. He declared that he expected to use the powers at his command to restore the price level of about 1926.

So prices have gone up considerably, and those who bought in 1929, whether it was industrial stocks and low priced bonds, real estate, or stocks of groceries, have seen their investments increase in value. But prices have not reached the 1926 level which President Roosevelt sees as desirable, and every day he is going right ahead with his plans to raise prices further. This can mean but one thing, and that is, that prices are going higher yet.

How much higher no one can say. Boosting prices artificially is an exceedingly dangerous undertaking. It is sort of like putting a stick of dynamite under a heavy grand piano in order to raise it just high enough to pull the legs from under it. It will raise the piano all right, but there is no telling how much higher it may rise.

President Roosevelt has no desire to raise prices exceedingly. He hopes to boost them as we have said; to about their 1926 level. But there are plenty of pretty strong monetary experts in this country who are saying that the rise in prices will not stop there, that they will go on up and up until even the level of 1929 will seem very low indeed. In fact the basis has been laid for a price level about four times as high as at present.

But whether this extreme rise in prices is real or not, it is a safe bet that it is going up. Even the level of 1926 is considerably higher than the present level. So you can make no mistake in buying now, whether President Roosevelt is right or the monetary experts are right. Both agree that prices are going up.

The farmer who has been a beneficiary of the low price level who has had a good crop and has had the highest price for his crop is the man who will keep his money well stocked with cash, for the stocks of some of the industrial enterprises will be high and will offer him the best opportunity for making a good investment.
