7 Criminal Cases Slated For Trial

Seven cases are docketed for arraignment in Circuit Court Room B next week. Judge Dominick J. Salfi, recently invested as Seminole County's second resident judge in the 18th Judicial Circuit Court, will preside. Three of the cases stem from narcotics charges, and include Larry Bowden, charged with possession or control of a central nervous system stimulant. Bowden was scheduled for trial Sept. 14 and later for Oct. 27. He was initially charged with possession of narcotics. Clarence R. Ball Jr. faces narcotics charges upon two counts — possession of a narcotic drug and possession of narcotic paraphernalia. Daniel Ray Michael is also charged upon two counts — possession of a narcotic drug and possession of narcotic paraphernalia. Elizabeth G. Davis is charged with manslaughter in the death last August of Guy Winkle by operation of a motor vehicle at U. S. 17-92 and Seminola Boulevard. Harold Scott faces first degree murder charges in the death of J. C. Johnson on Oct. 17. Scott allegedly shot Johnson with a .28 caliber pistol in a parking lot at Pearl's Mae Brown's Tavern, located at West 13th Street. The pistol was later found by investigating detectives. Also facing arraignment are Richard Machars, charged with attempted grand larceny, and Curtis Mathews, charged with breaking and entering with intent to commit a misdemeanor.

Mayor Confirms Negotiations \$1 Million Prison Payroll Seen

"The response your article gets will determine whether the city will pursue negotiations with the State Prison Bureau to lease airport facilities for locating a medium security prison."



LEE MOORE ... it's up to the people

Sanford Herald yesterday disclosed that city and state officials have been in negotiation over the lease of Sanford Airport property to be used for a state prison. Moore was in Belle Glade yesterday and was unavailable for comment when news of the negotiations were disclosed but today he confirmed the front page story details of the possible lease were accurate. The mayor also advised that he had talked with James Bax, state welfare official, and Bax had mentioned the possible use of airport property for a state rehabilitation center. Moore said he had informed David Bachman, Florida Bureau of Prisons deputy director, the commission had voided the use of the Building 310 at the airport and indicated there had been discussions over the lease of a southeast airport quadrant for the housing of prisoners. "We told them we would consider it," Moore explained. The mayor disclosed the total lease rental if the negotiations continue could amount to as much as \$150,000 a year with 167 job opportunities and a \$1 million annual payroll. Apparently city and prison officials are awaiting the outcome of past efforts to lease Building 319 to the State Law Enforcement Bureau for a police training academy before resuming talks for leasing a prison here.

New High School Near Forest City

It's back to single sessions at the county's high schools come next September! This was assured last night when the Seminole County School Board voted four-one to dump double sessions after a year's duration. Only Pat Bule cast a "nay" vote to the return of normal hours after Supr. John Angel asked for board approval to his recommendation to end 10 period days at Lyman and Seminole High Schools. Bule explained he was opposed to trading "demons" (ten-period days for portable schools) after Angel said an all-portable school would be set up to operate for two or three years until a new high school could be constructed somewhere west of 14 in South Seminole County. Angel's complete plan would mean the use next year of present Milwee Middle School to become part of Lyman High, when that facility discards double sessions and is subjected to possible overcrowding. A middle school would then be located in portable classrooms at a site near the Prairie Lake area. This will give three middle schools to the south county since South Seminole Middle School is already operating and will be joined by the new Walter Teague Middle School, scheduled to be finished in time for September classes. The portable school would function until a new high school is built to allow Milwee to once again become a middle school and relieve the overcrowded conditions that Lyman could attain on single sessions.

Longwood Holds Fast On Closing

LONGWOOD—City Council, meeting Thursday night, remained fast in its midnight hour closing hour for New Year's Eve, in spite of a letter from County Commissioner G. G. Drummond officially notifying of the county's 3 a.m. closing hour and urging cooperation of municipalities. City Attorney S. Joseph Davis Jr., advised the council that it would be necessary to amend the city ordinance to extend the closing time. A letter of resignation was ready from City Judge Roger Berry, effective Jan. 1, due to "pressing law practice." He offered to remain in the post for a reasonable length of time until a replacement can be secured. Following the opening of sealed bids on a new police car, Police Chief Eddie Sweet was asked to study the bids and make his recommendation. Bids were received from Johnny Bolton Ford, \$3,944, less allowance of \$150; Simpson Motors, \$3,624.47, less \$800; Joe Cremons, \$4,929.50, less \$1,751.78. Sweet recommended the Chevrolet from Cremons, because of the 450 hp engine. Council tabled the matter. Fines and forfeitures were reported \$2,909 as compared to \$1,591 last month. Franklin Ramsauer presented an 18-acre plat for 60 FIA 221 houses on 80-foot lots in the price range of \$17,000. (Continued on Page 2B, Col. 2)

Schools 'Crack Down' Discipline Is Tightened

To solve the discipline problems occurring in Seminole County schools, the School Board last night took under consideration for adoption at the next board meeting, policy recommendations from A. J. Bracken, administrative assistant, that would allow lockers to be entered and undesirable items confiscated. Supt. John Ansel advised that the school principal would have to judge what items could be considered undesirable. Jean Bryant, board member, asked about including cars parked on campus as being objects for search and Bracken said a warrant could be obtained and police called to search cars. Another policy recommendation would have the board to appoint calling law enforcement authorities to the student or students when an act of delinquency is committed. Board is also considering disciplinary procedures for those students who conduct themselves in such a way as to deprive another student of the right to pursue the learning process. In other board actions, the educators: Accepted with regret the resignation of Clyde Holder, Ovidio High School principal. Transferred William P. Layer from principal at Milwee Middle School to Teague Middle School principal, effective July 1. Transferred Arnold C. Otto from Bear Lake principal to Forest City, effective July 1.

Rape, Robbery, Break-In

A rape, robbery and two break-ins highlighted Seminole County and Sanford police activities during the past 24 hours. Joseph Samuel Smith, Route 1, Ovidio, a 42-year-old truck driver was arrested by Ovidio and county authorities on a rape charge brought by a 19-year-old girl, who reported the man held a knife to her neck and forced her to drive to a wooded area where the alleged assault occurred. Sanford police are probing the theft from the Touchton's Drug Store safe of \$107.75 in cash and a money order taken yesterday. A second break-in within a month has occurred at the closed Ritz theater, now being processed for reopening. Two projectors and two lanterns were damaged by the intruders who entered by the fire escape.

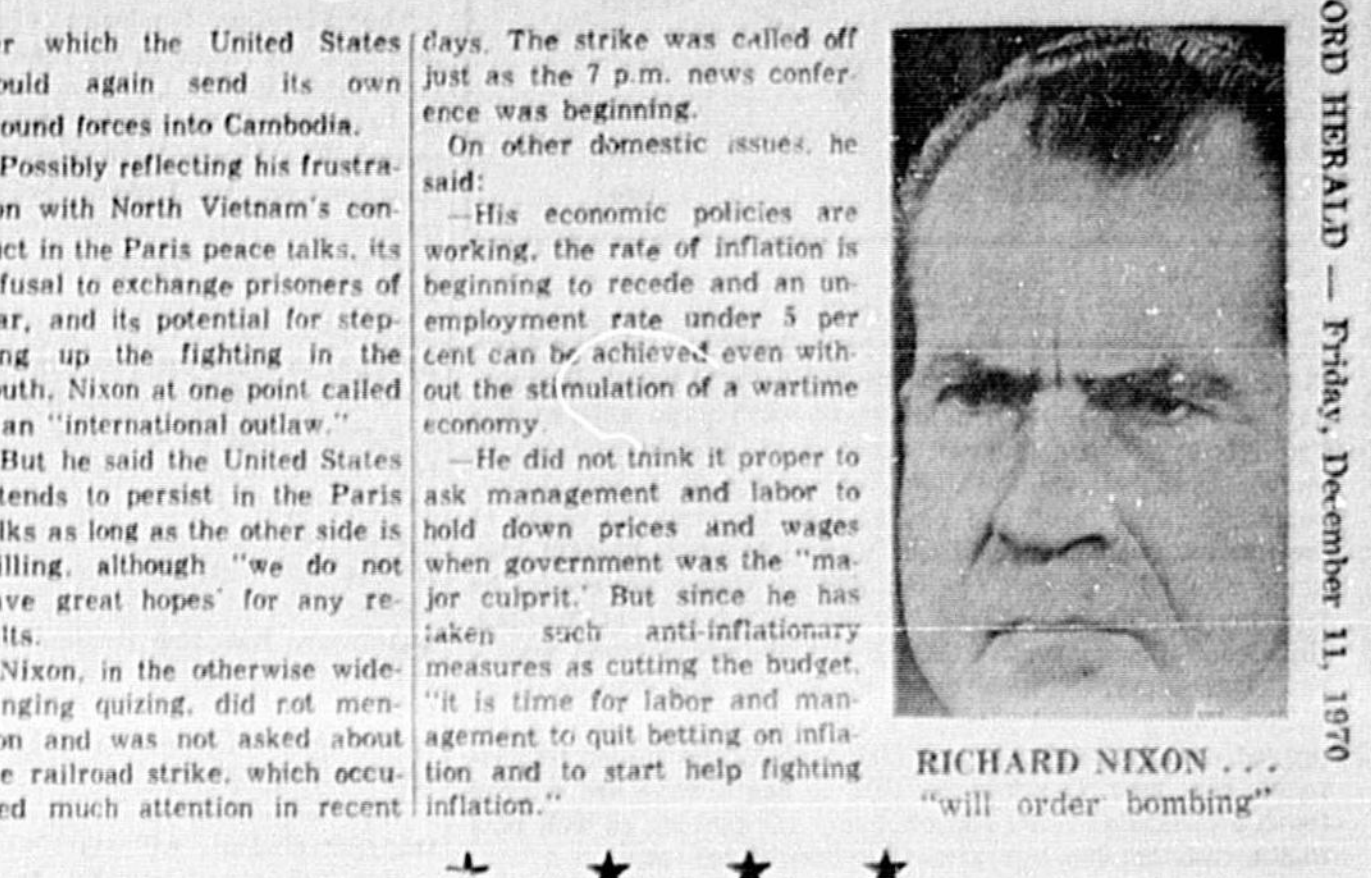

Seminole Education Association (SEA) salary committee is seeking salary increases for annual contract personnel and other proposals from the School Board for implementation in fiscal year 1971-72. This was disclosed after a presentation of the SEA by Hughie Barron, committee member, to the county board, Barron, chairman of the SEA committee, in making his requests to the guidelines and supportive data relative to how the committee's proposals should be accomplished until a work session or School Board meeting can be arranged to discuss the following requests:

1. Improve the salary index for annual contract personnel.
2. Payment of full premiums on the single basic medical program or its equivalent on another insurance.
3. Implementation of a salary supplement for all departmental and grade group chairmen, as well as sponsors of student clubs, activities, and publications that require additional effort beyond the normal work period.
4. Full salary based on certification and experience for all summer school personnel.
5. Sabbatical leave for the purpose of study and educational travel with appropriate compensation.
6. Reimbursement of tuition at the state rate for a planned program in upgrade certification.

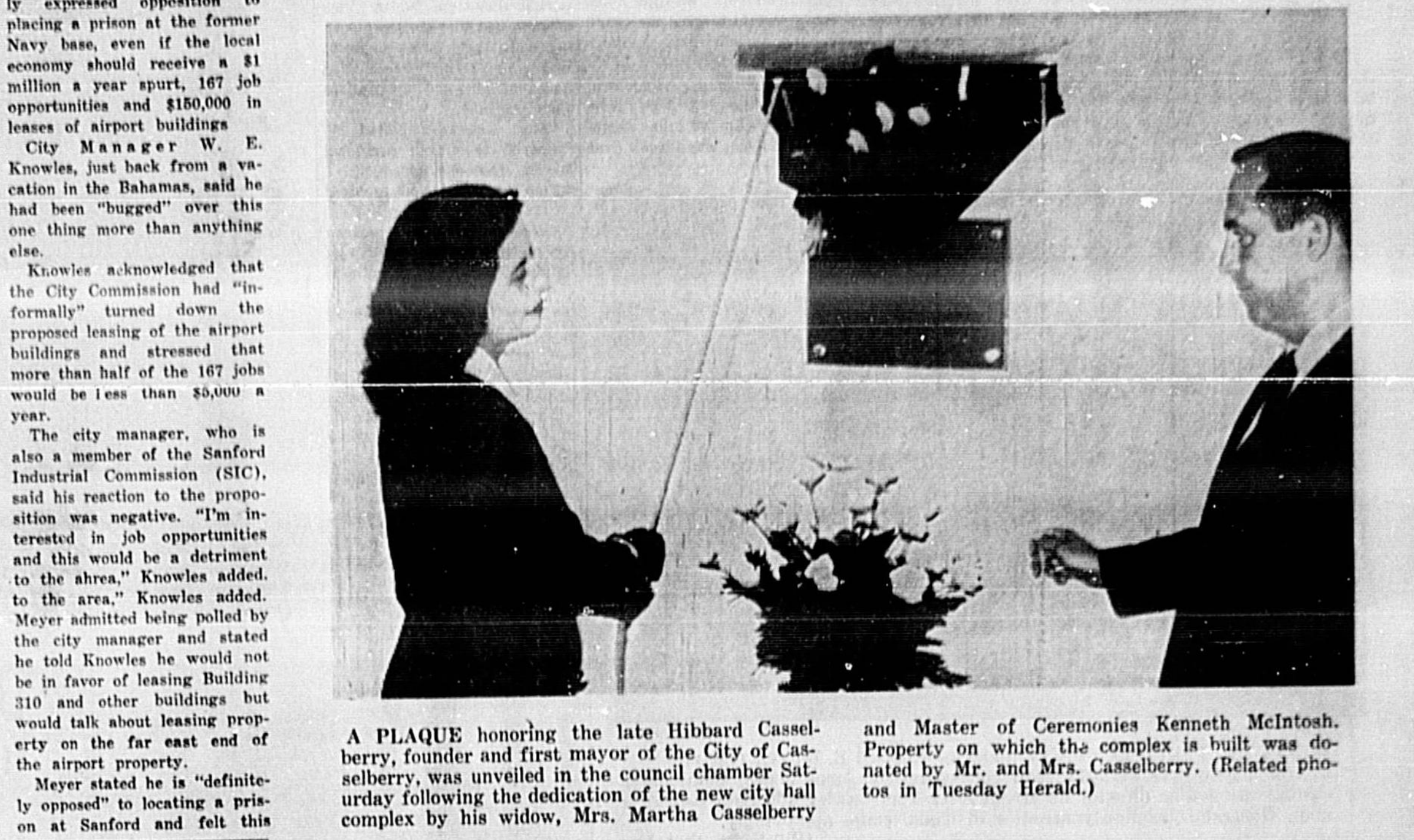
