Khomeini Threatens

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) — The Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini today threatened to launch a "jihad" — an Islamic holy war — to topple Prime Minister Shahpour Bakhtiar and announced formation of a Revolutionary Islamic Council.

"If the government continues to resist, with American support and assistance from Israel, then we will declare a holy war (jihad)," Khomeini said, though he stressed he would prefer "to solve this country's problems through non-violent means."

It was the first time the white bearded, 78-year-old patriarch of Iran's Shiite Moslem majority has publicly threatened civil war and the second time he bitterly attacked the United States in three

Speaking to 200 reporters at a news conference in the Moslem school he had made his headquarters, the ayatollah accused the United States of using Iran's oil for its own needs and "foisting unneeded weapons and advisers on the country."

Khomeini also said he has drafted a new constitution for an Islamic republic and shortly will announce the names of the Revolutionary Council's members. He said both the constitution and the new government will be submitted to a referendum. Diplomatic sources said Khomeini's announcement had pushed Iran to the very brink of civil war.

Only a few hours before Khomeini's announcement, Bakhtiar said he would not step down — and warned the army was fully on his side. Government sources said Friday Bakhtiar and the army had made plans to arrest any Iranian that Khomeini names to the Revolutionary Council.

The armed forces "must join our ranks as soon as possible," he said. "They must not use machine guns against the people." He appealed to the army's petriotism — "We want them to be free of foreign commanders and not to be under the thumb of foreigners," Khomeini said in a clear reference to the U.S. advisers who helped build Iran's army into one of the world's most





Schlesinger: China Asking Help In Oil Development

HOUSTON (UPI) — The People's Republic of China is interested in developing its oil reserves and Energy Secretary James Schlesinger says that country already is looking to the United States for help.

Schlesinger said he and Chinese Vice Premier Teng Hsiao-ping discussed energy matters on Teng's flight from Atlanta to Houston, where he continued his tour. The energy official would give no details. (Teng survives peppers, Psage 3A).

Hospital Emergencies Only

LONDON (UPI) More than 1,000 state-run hospitals were reduced to emergency service today by Britain's worsening labor crises and some cancer patients were told treatment of their malignancies may be delayed indefinitely. Wildcat strikes by cooks, cleaners, porters and other staff reduced more than half of Britain's 2,300 state-run hospitals to emergency service and a resulting morass of dirty laundry, piling garbage, shortstaffed kitchens and poorly sanitized wards.

Andreotti Asked To Try Again

ROME (UPI) — President Sandro Pertini asked outgoing Premier Giulio Andreotti today to try to form Italy's next government after the withdrawal of Communist support toppled his previous Cabinet three days ago. Christian Democrat Andreotti, who has served on Italian governments longer than any other living man and pulled off difficult political tricks, asked for time to decide whether he should accept the unpromising task. Bombers and firebombers hit seven targets in six Italian cities Friday night and early to day, causing damage but no deaths.

Park Coming To Testify

MONROE, La. (UPI) - The State Department is preparing for a visit by South Korean Dusinessman Tongsun Park to testif at the Korean influence-buying trial of former Rep. Otto Passman, Passman, a Monroe Democrat who spent 30 years in Congress, was indicted last year on charges of conspiring to accept \$213,00 in bribes from Park, accepting \$98,000 in payoffs, and evading income taxes on the money.

Thai Reds Hit Town, Kill 3

BANGKOK, Thailand (UPI) - Thai Communist insurgents attacked a town in nor theastern Thailand Friday in a raid that killed three persons and wounded at least 12 others. Police reports from Loei province, 300 miles northeast of Bangkok, said the insurgents armed with automatic weapons and rocket propelled grenades hit a power station, a border patrol outpost and a police station in the district town of Na Haew.

NATO Maneuvers Thawed

KATTERBACH, West Germany (UPI) - A thaw interrupted a NATO winter maneuver today. The U.S. Army temporarily halted the Jan. 30-Feb. 7 maneuver of 66,000 troops because warm weather turned the snowpacked maneuver area near the East-West border into slush and mud.







All the cruel dilemmas — legal, philosophical and moral — bound up in the national debate over the use of Laetrile as a cancer treatment are exemplified in the sad case of 3-year-old Chad

The boy suffers from leukemia. His parents believe his treatment should include Laetrile doses administered in conjunction with a high-nutrition,

Courts in the Greens' home state of Massachusetts have forbidden Chad's Laetrile

In apparent violation of a court order, Chad's parents took him to Tijuana, Mexico, where Laetrile treatments are legal. Reportedly, Chad will undergo limited

chemotherapy augmented by his special diet and It is difficult to review this case without feeling

sympathy for the conflicting positions of both Chad's parents and Massachusetts officialdom. Massachusetts courts, including the commonwealth's supreme court, believe that conventional chemotherapy is the only treatment that

offers Chad any hope for survival. Thus that state's statutory interest in Chad's welfare coupled with medical testimony that the Laetrile doses and Vitamin A supplements had produced a buildup of cyanide left the courts little choice but to mandate exclusive reliance on

And yet, what parent could condemn the Greens for objecting to chemotherapy's potent side effects and seeking an alternate treatment regimen they believe provides Chad the best chance for life? We can offer no easy resolution of this agonizing

But we continue to believe that the predicament thousands of cancer victims, underscores the need for an exhaustive study of Laetrile, its chemical components, and the ways in which these components may affect cancer cells.

Indeed, while Laetrile remains rightly controversial as an anti-cancer agent, the reported discovery in Japan of a scientifically acceptable explanation of the way Laetrile may work against cancer is precisely the kind of lead that cancer researchers ought to pursue with all deliberate

A noted biologist, Andrew A. Benson of the Scripps Institution of Oceanography, cites the Japanese evidence as cause for intensive in-

She's Retarded, But First A Little Girl

Mom Wouldn't Trade Her For Any Other Child In The World

If six-year-old Debbie Reis saw you on the playground, the little bundle of energy would probably run up to you with a friendly smile.

Like many little girls her age, it's likely she's be carrying her favorite well-worn, much-loved dolly. And like most little girls, her short hair would be tousled from the active play. She'd be chatting happily - or perhaps singing "You Are My Sunshine," or her favorite Hank

But you would immediately notice that she is different from most little girls. Debbie is mentally retarded. She has Down's syndrome (mongolism) which means that she was born with 47 chromosomes in every cell in her body instead of the usual

She has many of the characteristics that a child with Down's syndrome usually has - the slanted eyes, broad nose, thick neck, flabby muscle tone, and moderate

Like about 50 percent of the Down's syndrome children Debbie was born with a heart defect: she had open heart

She truly is her parents "sunshine." Debbie's mother says lovingly, "I would not trade her for any other child in Of course, it was a traumatic experience, discovering within the first hour of her birth that Debbie was one of the

seven children out of every 100 who is born with a birth

Debbie's mother was 33 years old when she was born. In the age group 30-34, one baby in 600 is born with Down's syndrome. The incidence increases to one in 80 for mothers 40 to 44. Women over 44 have a one in 40 chance that their baby will have Down's syndrome.

Her reaction to Debbie's birth: "I didn't feel anger, analyzes Mrs. Reis. "Hurt, yes! I don't think you ever get over the hurt... You go through a depression — you can't help that - but once you hit bottom, there's no place but

"Everyone is not perfect," she continues. "We've

"I sorry, Mom," she said, upon seeing her mother. "I

Their lives could have taken a different direction though. The birth of a "defective child frequently destroys a family. However, as happened in the Reis family — which includes Chuck 16, Anne 14, and Kate 8 the family was drawn closer together.

\$3 Million Too Much For Park?

TALLAHASSEE (UPI) - The state bought a park in Fort Pierce in 1973 for \$3 million more than it was worth, according to an appraisal released Friday. Purchase of the Fort Pierce Inlet Recreation Area for \$7.5

million is one of 18 past and pending state land deals being in vestigated by the FBI in connection with suspected payoffs. The Fort Pierce purchase was urged by suspended Department of Natural Resources Director Harmon Shields and approved by the governor and cabinet after Marion C. McCune of Miami appraised the 331-acres for the state at a value of \$7.050 million A new appraisal, saying the land was worth only \$4.5 million at the time of the purchase, was made by Riviera Beach appraiser Samuel F. Holden. It was ordered as evidence in a state lawsuit

The suit is pending in St. Lucie Circuit Court. State Park Director Ney Landrum said his agency relied on McCune's appraisal which, Landrum said, was based on a miscalculation of a comparable sale in the same area. Charlie Smith, who negotiated the deal for DNR, told the Palm

Beach Post that the owner of the property, Gordon Nutt of Orlando, wanted \$9 million for it and "I whittled on him for months and months" to get him down to \$7.5 million. "He (Nutt) was convinced if he held on to it he could get \$15

million to \$18 million," Smith said. Nutt, who had purchased it 15 months earlier for \$2.877 million denied the \$9 million figure, saying he never asked more than \$7.6

million "at the most." "I doubt if any property in this area, in a period of a year and three months, could increase in value from \$2.877 million to \$7.5 million," Holden said in the new appraisal. "Such an appraisal would be most difficult for an appraiser to substantiate." But Department of Natural Resources appraiser Al Tolius reviewed McCune's appraisal and approved the \$7.5 million

figure for forwarding to the governor and cabinet. Later Tolius asked McCune for an amended appraisal of the one 'comparable sale'' he used to calculate the worth of Nutt's land and McCune admitted a miscalculation which he said raised the value of the comparable sale by "more than \$90,000."

In other developments in the ongoing land investigation:

—The Orlando Sentinel reported a move by a majority of the six-member cabinet to fire Shields for mismanagement, without waiting for the FBI to end its investigation. However, Treasurer Bill Gunter and cabinet aides to Gov. Bob Graham, Secretary of State George Firestone, Comptroller Gerald Lewis and Education Commissioner Ralph Turlington said they knew of no plan t change the status of Shields, who is on suspension but still drawing his \$39,500 a year paycheck. Commissioner of Agriculture Doyle Conner and Attorney General Jim Smith and

their cabinet aides could not be reached for comment. -Bob Viele, former DNR land appraiser, was questioned by the FBI about the land program and whether Shields ever pressured him or tried to influence appraisals or if anyone ever offered him any money in connection with an appraisal.

Viele, who quit last year to earn more money in the private sector, said he knew of nothing illegal in the program and never was pressured or offered even a cup of coffee. He said Shields told him, "call it like you see it. If we don't get this piece of property go on to the next."

County May Up Health Clinics To Four Monthly

By DONNA ESTES Herald Staff Writer

County Commissioners Tuesday may order resumption of four monthly medical clinics at the Seminole County Health Department which were halted after Health Director Dr. Hamida Battla resigned last August.

As a result of a workshop attended by commissioners, Director of Humas Barvices Trey Total, other county staff manufactured and Larry Desbrur, of the Sale Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services, last

Since the health director's resignation only one monthly clinic has been held at the health facility in Longwood and care provided as needed for one patient at the Sanford-based department.

missioners said not all patients who had been enrolled in the clinics were screened for indigency and new enrollments in the clinics were suspended in October pending county commission consideration.

"Treatment for patients already enrolled has continued but has waned," he said. Todd said approximately 15 patients can be served in each of four monthly clinics within budgeted funds and staffing allowances. He said if new patients were again admitted and the caseload built gradually to the rate of four clinics per month, a total of 60 monthly patient visits could be handled.

The Acting Health Department Director, Dr. William Fowler, would attend the clinics

The human services director is also urging that payment for prescription drugs be

authorized. This is necessary, he said, until the already approved building renovation at the Sanford Health Department is completed to provide creation of a pharmacy area. New patients would be acreened for financial eligibility by the county welfare

department. An exception is that any tuberculosis patient could be seen at the discretion of the acting health director, as

therapy to the school board which has more extensive testing equipment and trained specialist staff available and is required by law to follow up these children.
