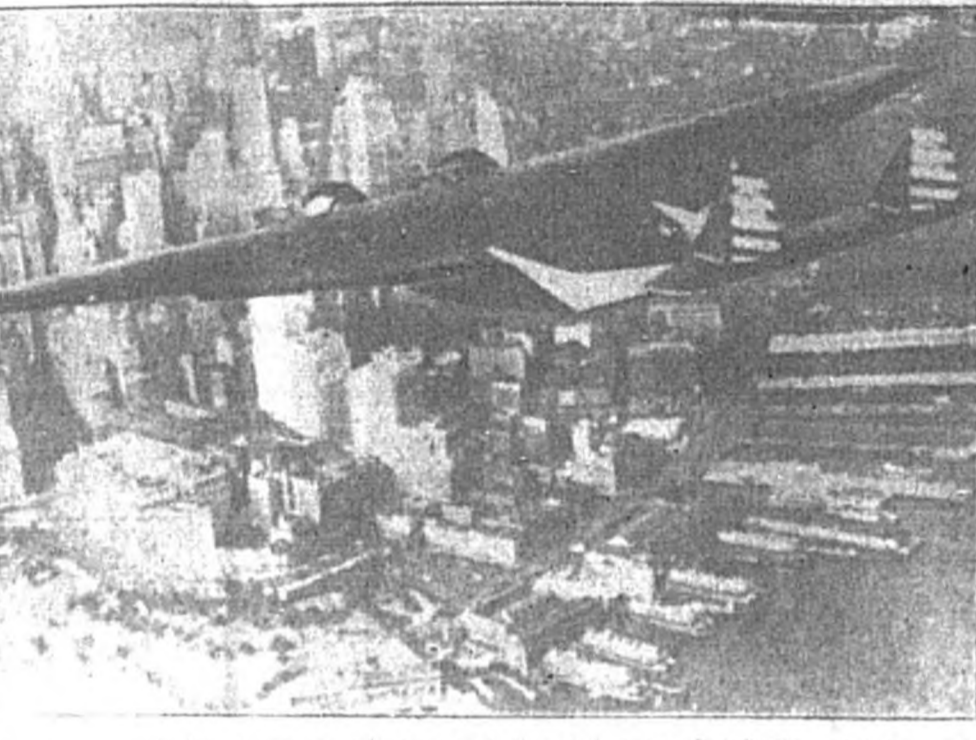

### The Way Of The World

On Thursday of this week, the Senate passed a bill which after six months will have the Court of Claims owners of government bonds who have been damaged by the government's monetary policies. The House had already passed a bill which would immediately bar the Court of Claims to such suits. The difference between the two bills will be ironed out in committee.

The law which will result from these two bills is the direct consequence of the government's refusal to pay in gold, or its equivalent, the bonds which it had previously issued containing the gold clause. The Supreme Court has held that the government, having promised to pay in gold, has no right to repudiate this obligation.

The possibility loomed that in the event the Administration's policy of raising prices should prove enormously successful, innumerable suits might be filed against the government to collect the difference between the gold value of their bonds and the currency value. It might cost the government many billions of dollars, depending on course upon how high prices might rise.

So this Congress passes a law which would prohibit a bondholder from recovering no matter how much he might be damaged by the most extreme kind of currency inflation should ensue, and it should result that a thousand dollar Liberty bond would not actually buy a week's supply of groceries, still the bondholder could not recover from the government.

Who knows but what some day a regular pressure may be exerted upon Congress to repeal the very law which now bars the Court of Claims to gold clause suits against the government?
