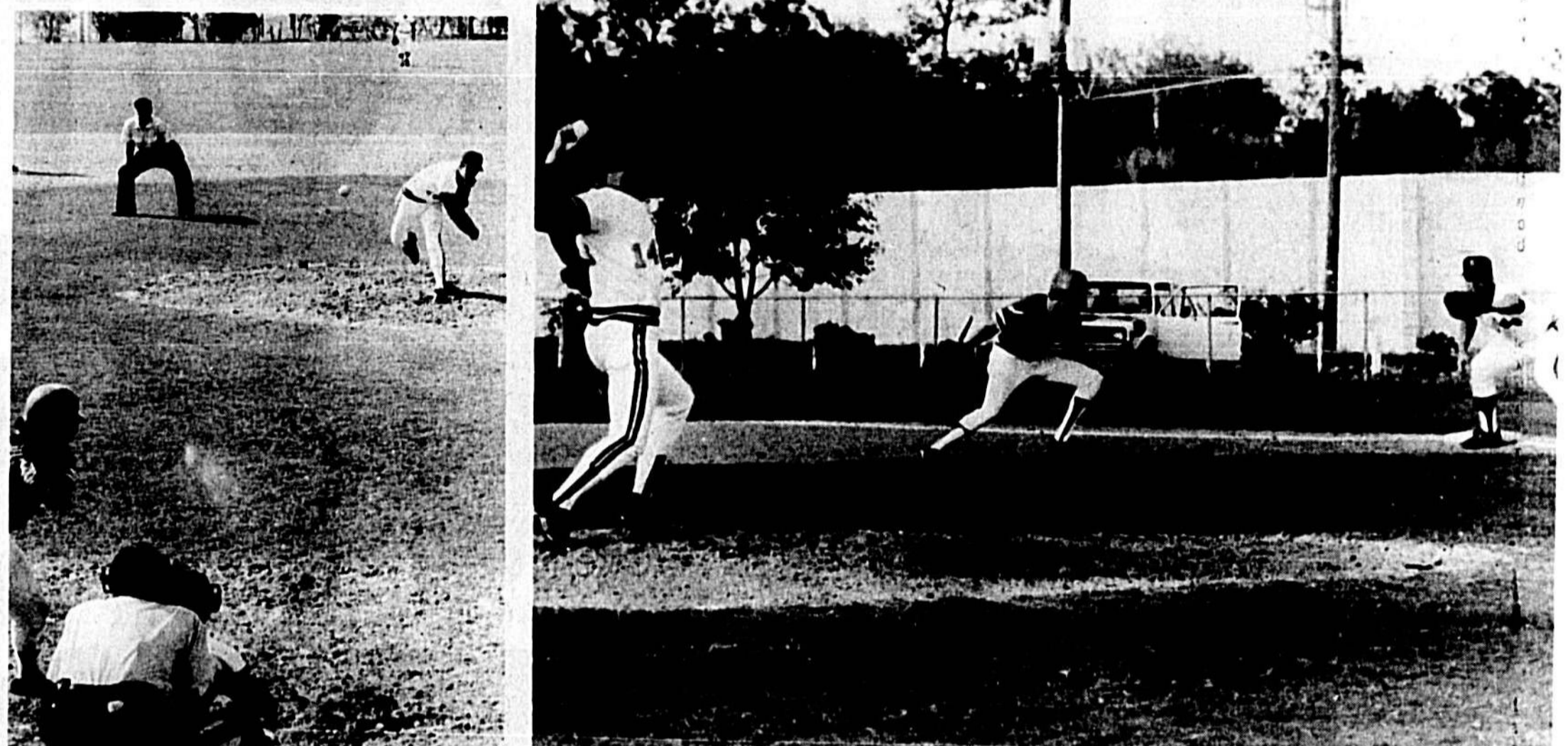


Purdue's Rose Heading South

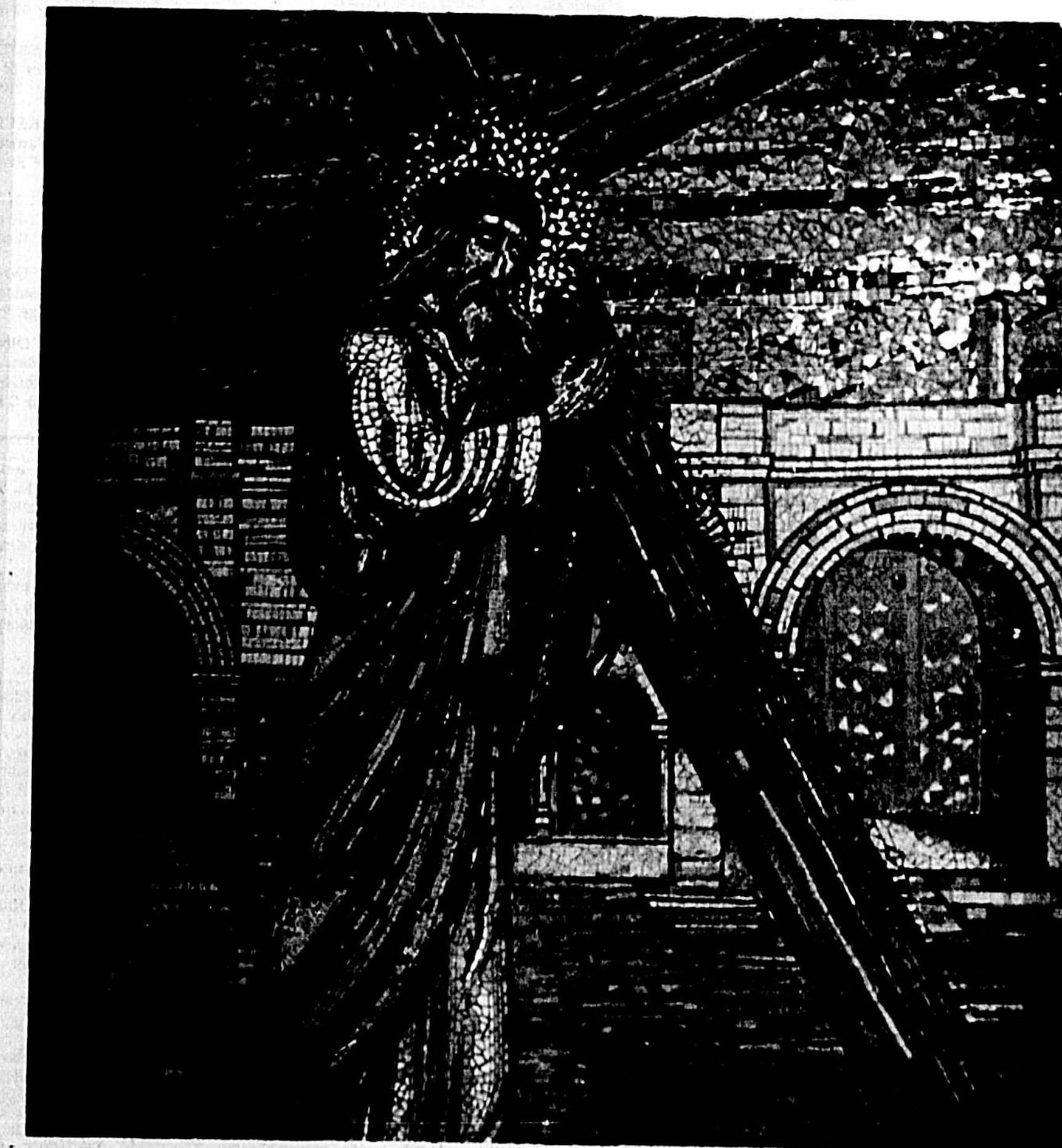

Our Intrepid Critic Recalls 'Biggies' From TV Season

The television season is over. Returns and summer replacements reign supreme, along with attempts at cogent critical summation.

Many critics are inclined to dismiss this past season as one for which superlatives shouldn't be trundled out. Not so, I don't mean to brand my colleagues as a gaggle of ladies, but there were actually a number of "biggies" this season. It just takes a little extra effort to sniff them out.

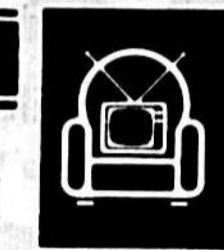
There was the big mystery, "Nobody's Perfect," an ABC sitcom starring Ron Moody as a Scotland Yard inspector transplanted to San Francisco. "Nobody's Perfect" was centered in ABC's fall schedule, then bumped. It has never been aired or heard from again.

REVIEW

There was the big disappointment, "The Associates," earmarked as the No. 1 prospect of the season, this law office sitcom choked on its own torts and the network didn't step in to apply the Heimlich Maneuver. ABC has just dumped a few leftover episodes back into the lineup.

ABC takes honors with two other biggies — "The Lazarus Syndrome," the biggest (and fastest) flop, and "Ten Speed and Brown Shoe," the biggest waste of talent.

If you want to take all this literally, there was also "The Big Show" on NBC, which turned out to be "The Hollywood Palace" with

running water, some chorines on ice skates and a big, big budget.

And, finally, there was the biggest bunch of dull, pretentious hokey of not only this season but many seasons — "United States."

This newly premiered NBC entry promised to be prime time's first honest look at marriage and its first adult comedy. Unfortunately, its idea of honest is doing away with the laugh track, its idea of adult is having its female lead wake up in the morning with her hair mussed. The show's sound man and hairdresser can now hold their heads high. If only there were something here for the audience.

"United States" is a writer's internal dialogue that hasn't grown into fully developed characters or situations. The result is wit without humor, intellect without intelligence. Talk talk, talk.

Larry Gelbart, who

created this pathetic imitation of Ingemar Bergman's "Scenes From a Marriage," demanded total creative control and NBC gave it to him. He's ruined it for everybody else — I'll be 10 years before a network gives any writer that power again.

There was no big hit. The best new show of the season is long gone, "Paris" (CBS), which starred James Earl Jones as a cop-criminology professor, soared into meaty areas rarely touched anymore by a prime time series. Unfortunately, it never left the bottom of the ratings or got the slightest following that "The Paper Chase" did — even though it was a much better show.

"Stag" and "Elschied" both had promise but NBC nipped them in the bud.

"Knobs Landing" (CBS) and "Hart to Hart" (ABC) were the most successful of the slick trash. "Benson" (ABC), a lightweight but efficient sitcom, scored steadily.

Of the holdovers, "The White Shadow" (CBS) remained the top combination of entertainment and message. I watched most episodes and was seldom disappointed. I'll miss the departing "The Rockford Files" (NBC), which was funnier than most comedies and always lively.

"Tas!" (ABC), the strongest holdover from the previous season, was very uneven this year. Judd Hirsch was written out for several weeks so he could film a movie and the cohesion seemed to suffer.

News and sports programming continued to creep into prime time. We'll see more of that ahead, whether or not circumstances call for it, because elaborate coverage of live events is something the networks can offer us that we can't get elsewhere. Elsewhere — cassettes, discs, cable — is starting to scare them.

This will be our last report of the season. See you in September.

Christians Looking To Jerusalem Today

The spiritual eyes of the Christian World are on Jerusalem at the Easter season.

Many pilgrims will be in the Holy City to follow the Way of the Cross, where Jesus walked on his way to Calvary, and to visit the many sacred shrines on Good Friday.

The Via Dolorosa, the traditional pathway Jesus followed carrying the cross, has 14 stations commemorating the sorrowful events. Nine are related to the Gospel and five in tradition. The first two are located in the site of the Antonia or pretorium of Pilate (see cover photo), seven are located in streets and the last five in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre.

Each Friday at 3 p.m. a procession is led by the Franciscan Fathers along the Via Dolorosa from the arch that marks the beginning, which tradition says is built over the site where Pontius Pilate said "Behold the Man," as Jesus came forth bearing a crown of thorns and a purple garment.

Although the Church of the Holy Sepulchre is built over the traditional site of calvary and the tomb where Christ's body was buried, many Protestant Christians view the Garden Tomb and Gordon's Calvary as the authentic sites, discovered by British General Charles Gordon in 1833.

Area Christians follow the Way of the Cross in their hearts at special Holy week observances culminated by joyous Easter services that begin with the rising of the sun.

Several special community sunrise services are scheduled as well as those at individual churches.

The Sanford Area Ministerial

Association Easter Sunrise Service will take place at 6 a.m. at the Sanford Civic Center, featuring special music and Rev. Leo King, pastor of First United Methodist as speaker.

The Oviedo Community Sunrise Service will begin a 5:45 a.m. at Sunnyside Hill. There will be special music and a sermon by Rev. Larry Sherwood of the First Baptist Church.

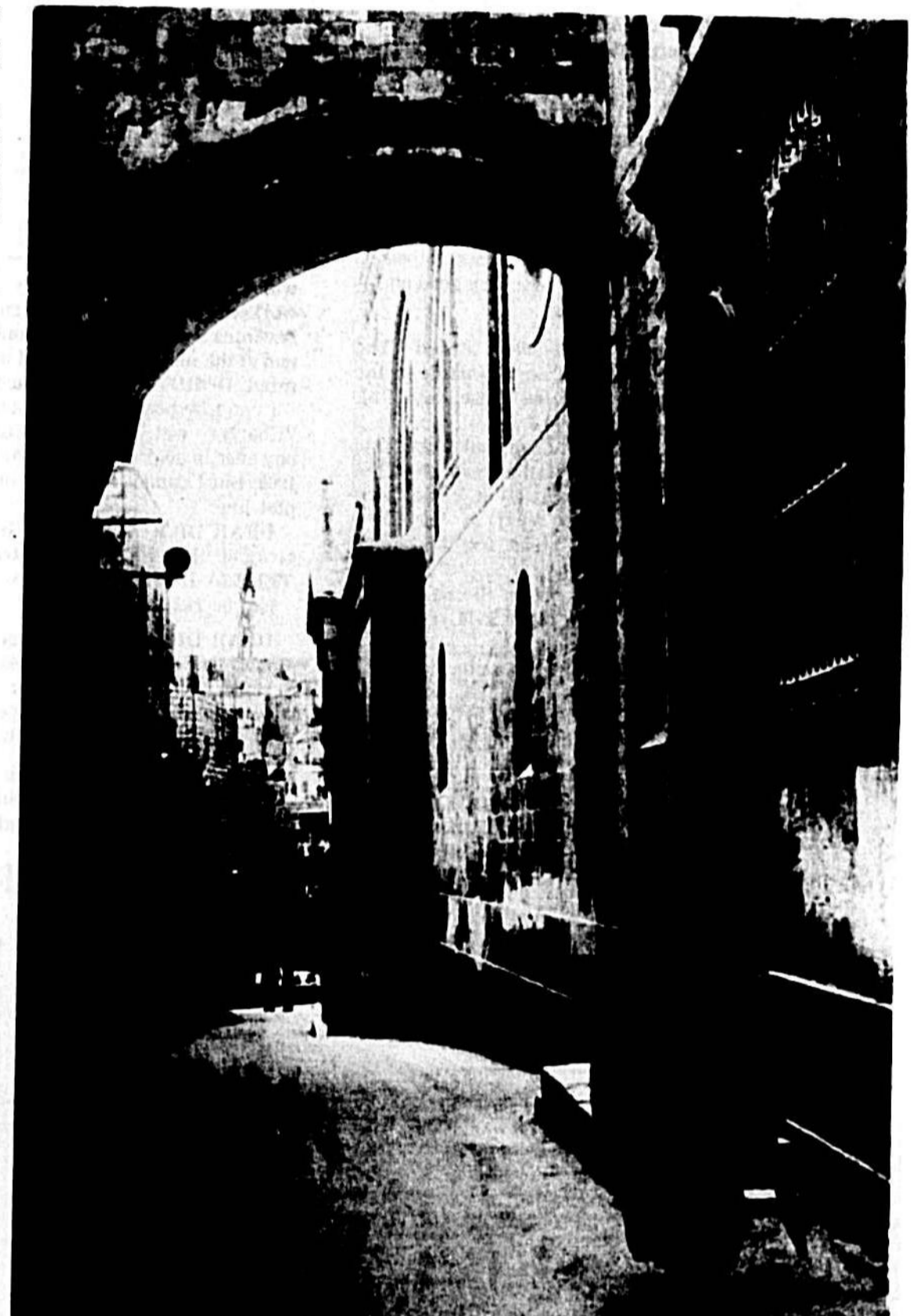
An outdoor sunrise service will be held at 6:30 a.m. at the lake next to Ascension Lutheran Church, 351 Ascension Drive, Casselberry.

Messianic Lutheran Church, Highway 17-92, Casselberry, will hold a sunrise service on the north parking lot at 6:30 a.m.

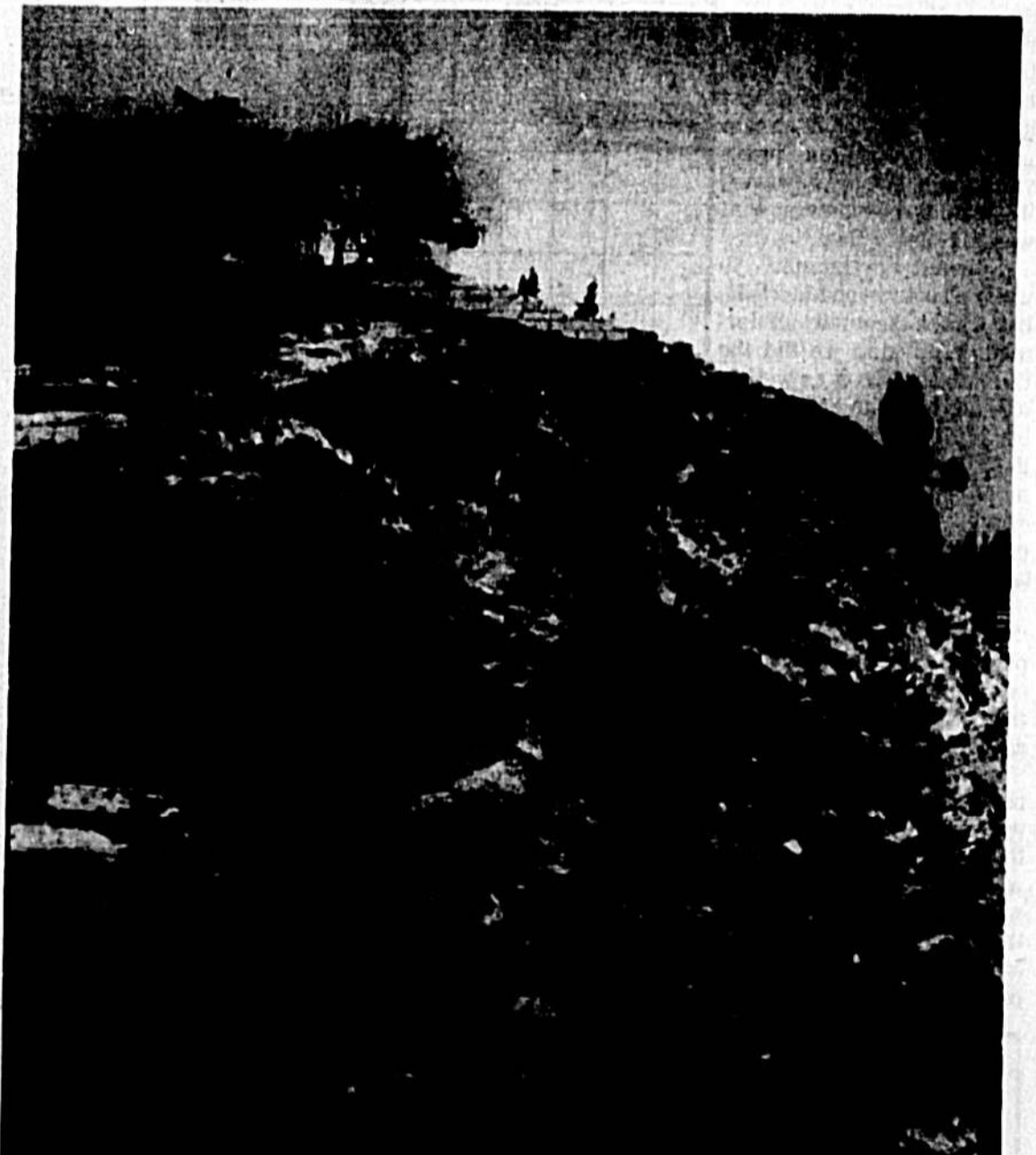
A sunrise service will be conducted at 7 a.m. on the grounds adjacent to Covenant Presbyterian Church, Highway 17-92, Sanford.
