Parents Protest

County's Choice

They literally buried Seminole County's Freedom of Choice School plan yesterday!

A group of dissident school parents led by William Foster, chairman of Pinecrest Freedom of Choice Committee for Neighborhood Schools, held a burial service complete with a casket bearing the message "Here lies Freedom of Choice" at the Seminole County Board of Education office on Commercial Street in Sanford before joining other dissident groups in Orange County for a funeral at the Federal Court build-

There, a minister, Rev. A.thur Froelich "preached the funeral" of the dying "choice" plan after federal courts struck down school plans over the state that used the concept for desegregation of schools,

Rev. Froelich of the Maitland Bible Presbyterian Church was introduced by Wilfrid C. Meloon, president for Citizens for Moral Education, before the "services" began at the

PESCO Contract At SCOPA Meet

The lease of the Port Everglades Steel Company (PESCO), who has agreed to enter into a lease with the Seminole County Port Authority (SCOPA) was under discussion at the Port Authority's regular meeting

After much discussion, a motion to remove the pre-payment of one year's rent, \$15,000, of a yet-to-be constructed building at the Port was tabled. A special meeting of the SCOPA will be held later this month to finally decide the issue.

In the interim the board will contact the president of the company to remind him of a tentative verbal agreement to pay up the last years' rent in edvance. PESCO is attempting to have the pre-payment terms removed from the lease before it is signed. "PESCO is an AAA rated company who has substantial assets, and it is felt that any pre-payment of rent is unnecessary," said Jim Ryan, administrator (Continued on Page 3A, Col. 5)
