

#### Earthquake Jolts Greece, Villages Said Leveled

PATRAS, Greece (AP) - An earthquake jolted western Greece today, causing heavy damage to towns and villages, but there were no immediate reports of deaths or serious injuries, police said.

Most of the damage was reported south of Lake Trikhonis and Messolonghi. The villages of Ano and Kato Makrinou were said to be leveled. About 1,500 persons live in these two villages.

Hundreds of homes were reported damaged in other nearby villages, leaving several thousand persons Power lines collapsed, cutting off regular com-

### Import Controls Threaten Trade

The British government announced recently that it is imposing some new import controls as part of a program to shore up its staggering economy. This drew immediate criticism from the executive commission of the Common Market, which warned of a "chain reaction" of retaliatory measures against British exports by countries which now will find it harder to sell their goods in

The danger of such a chain reaction is real, and it is not just the British who may be provoking it. The fact is that protectionism is making an ominous appearance in the world marketplace as the major trading nations wrestle with the problems of recession in their economies. And the accusing finger is being pointed at the United States as well as others, in spite of our commitment

Some critics have gone so far as to suggest that the multilateral trade negotiations at Geneva to renew the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) might as well be called off. If that should occur, the hope of averting a trade war may be lost.

The tendency to raise trade barriers to protect domestic industries against foreign competition is always more pronounced in times of recession. That many nations yielded to that temptation in the early 1930s is one reason that the recession of that era turned into a prolonged depression.

Our new Trade Act passed last year requires the Treasury Department to act within a year if it receives complaints that foreign countries are dumping" goods on the U. S. market or subsidizing their exports to hold prices down. Penalties or countervailing duties must be imposed if the complaints are found valid. There 40 such complaints now under investigation, posing the possibility that the U. S. government may under the law be forced to take "protectionist" actions contrary to its own stated policies supporting free

We cannot prejudge whether any of the com-plaints — involving automobiles, steel, plywood and other products - are valid. However, it is obvious that the U.S. labor unions, manufacturers and others who are urging the government to act on them are playing with a weapon that can backfire. It goes without saying that the same warning applies to nations which may be guilty of dumping or creating tax breaks for their exporters to make their goods cheaper abroad.

The way all nations can improve their economic fortunes is to pursue domestic policies which encourage their industries to produce better goods at a fair price, and to pursue trade policies which open the widest market for those goods. The cries of "Foul!" now threatening trade relations are a symptom of desertion of that principal and a serious threat of trade wars which can hurt
