Hundreds Of Suspects Held By Turkish Military Regime

ANKARA, Turkey (UPI) - Turkey's new military regime today rounded up hundreds of suspected terrorists and political extremists and sources close to the ruling junta said they expected a major purge of civilian provincial governors within 48 hours. Government sources in Ankara said hundreds of suspected left-wing and right-wing militants have been picked up by the army since Sunday in Ankara, Adana and other large cities. Some have been questioned and released and others held in custody.

Sources said among those arrested have been several academicians from Ankara's left-leaning Middle East Technical University and Ankara University's political science department. Both institutions had become highly politicized during the past

News of the political situation in eastern Turkey has been difficult to obtain but there is believed to be widespread opposition there to the military rule installed in Friday's bloodless coup.

Polish Union Meeting Set

WARSAW, Poland (UPI) - Organizing groups for free trades unions from all over Poland plan to meet in Gdansk Wednesday to discuss the founding of a nationwide non-Communist-run labor organization, union activists said today.

They said the meeting in the Baltic seaport center of the mass strike would be a major step toward the consolidation of activities by the new unions, whose formation was one of the key concessions granted by the government in its historic agreement with the

Attorney Helps Haitians

NEW ORLEANS (UPI) - An attorney for the Maitian Refugee Center says the Immigration and Naturalization Service systematically discriminates against Haitians by issuing wholesale deportation

Thirty-five runaways from that Caribbean island were being held in New Orleans for seeking entry into this country without proper documentation. But attorney Vera Weisz objected to their being held in a detention center.

"If a boatload of Cubans had gome to New Orleans you can bet your right arm that they would not have been carried off to a detention facility," Ms. Weisz said

U.S. Tribe Seeks Iran Aid

HOULTON, Maine (UPI) - Leaders of the Malisee Indian tribe are asking Iran's Islamic government for financial aid, saying the United States and Canada repeatedly ignored their pleas for help. Loomis Sappier, chairman of the Maliseet Land Claims Committee, said a letter requesting the Iranian government's help in paying the tribe's legal fees was

sent last week to the nation's embassy in Ottawa. The Houlton band of Maliseet Indians joined with two other tribes in claiming 12.5 million acres of Maine was taken from them in violation of federal law more than 150 years ago. An out-of-court agreement settling those claims is now making its way through Congress.

Expert: Lifestyle Changes

Could Slash Cancer Rate NEW YORK (UPI) - A noted researcher predicts

the nation's cancer toll could be cut by 30 to 40 percent if Americans would change the way they live and work. "The elimination of tobacco use alone, if not replaced by similar vices, would prevent 100,000 cases a year in the United States alone," said Dr. Michael B. Shimkin of the University of California at San Diego. Shimkin addressed an opening session Sunday of an international, five-day symposium marking the 10th anniversary of the start of America's stepped-up-war

Higginson cited figures studies showing that personal habits alone such as smoking, alcohol beverage consumption, betal-quid chewing and sunbathing account for 25 to 50 percent of all cancer in males in different populations around the world. The figures are lower for females, ranging from 5 to 20 percent.

Klansman Faces Charges

SCOTLAND, Conn. (UPI) - Imperial Wizard Bill Wilkinson, who exhorted law and order and segregation at Connecticut's first public Ku Klux Klan rally in 70 years, faced a court hearing today on a weapon's charge.

Wilkinson was arrested Sunday just hours before several hundred people gathered in a rural cow pasture for a second straight night to hear the Klansman call for a return to segregation. Police recovered a loaded .45-caliber automatic pistol from a suitcase in the trunk of Wilkinson's car. He was charged with possession of a dangerous weapon and released on \$1,000 bond for a hearing in

Windham County Superior Court. The second rally ended with the burning of a 20-foot il-soaked wooden cross. There was no violence reported Sunday and, unlike

Saturday night, there were no counter-demonstrations.

Douglas Recalls Presidents

WASHINGTON (UPI) - John F. Kennedy was a playboy and Lyndon Johnson a fair-weather friend, the late Justice William O. Douglas says in his memoirs, writing that he postponed retirement so Richard Nixon couldn't name his successor.

Douglas, who died Jan. 19 at the age of 81, defends his 35 years on the Supreme Court and his controversial high public profile in the second volume of memoirs, titled "The Court Years, 1939-1975." He also commented on many of the famous personalities he enountered. The book is to be released next month Douglas accused fellow Justice Thurgood Marshall of a "lawless" breach of court rules in overturning his order blocking the bombing of Cambodia. "Nixon men" put pressure on Marshall, Douglas concluded. President Dwight Eisenhower was "insensitive to the implications of - massive gifts to him from key men in the establishment," and John Kennedy "was

indeed a playboy in public office up to 1958," Douglas

Burnett's Daughter Slips Back To Drugs

year-old daughter is undergoing treatment at the second time

"Carrie was free from drugs for almost a year," Miss Burnett says in an article written for the October issue of the Ladies Home Journal, "Then, three months ago, she slipped." Miss Burnett, saying the relapse was "not unusual," immediately sent her daughter, Carrie, back to the Palmer Drug

Abuse Program in Houston. "Carrie is, we know, an addictive personality," Miss Burnett said. "She will need ongoing treatment. Nobody ever said it would be easy and it isn't. Today, as then, we are taking one

Miss Burnett and her husband, producer Joe Hamilton, last year discovered their daughter was using marijuana and was hooked on quaaludes and cocaine. In June 1979, Hamilton took Carrie to Houston, against her will.

"That was the first time I said to her, 'I love you enough to let you hate me," the comedienne said. "She is now out of the Palmer drug abuse center, again, but she is still in the program," Miss Burnett told UPI Sunday afternoon. "We hope it 'takes' this time.

"We were disappointed that she had a relapse, but we weren't surprised because it happens all the time. "In the long run, Joe and I are confident that Carrie's drug problems will work out happily for all of us. I guess youngsters have to keep hitting their heads against the wall until they find out that it doesn't stop hurting until you quit for good.

Last year, Miss Burnett estimated Carrie had spent \$10,000 selling drugs. Last January, Carrie returned home

"We will support Carrie with love, but not with indulgence

"Her latest report card yielded all B's and one A," Miss Burnett said in the Ladies Home Journal article. But the old symptoms came back, and Carrie was taken back to the Palmer Drug Abuse Program. Miss Burnett finished the article saying, "God, we love our

Despite the settlement reached recently between striking Polish workers and their government, the situation in Poland is anything but tranquil. It is, in fact, the most dangerous flashpoint in the world today. Therefore, events in

Poland should command the closest scrutiny and, meanwhile we trust, some unusual forethought in DON GRAFF Washington and other Western capitals. The agreement granting Polish citizens the right to strike, the right to form independent trade unions, and revision of censorship laws stopped short of openly challenging party supremacy According to Washington observers, it was just under the threshold of what would be required for Moscow to take over completely with a massive

military intervention. Such independence is

unheard of behind the Iron Curtain and is absolute

poison to the Kremlin. The removal of Polish party chief Edward Gierek could represent the exercise of an early Soviet option short of force - tighter control through the Moscow-oriented Polish Communist apparatus. But Westerners do not know for certain that the Russians dictated the Gierek removal and elevation of Stanislaw Kania, formerly in charge of internal security, to be the new top man in Warsaw.
