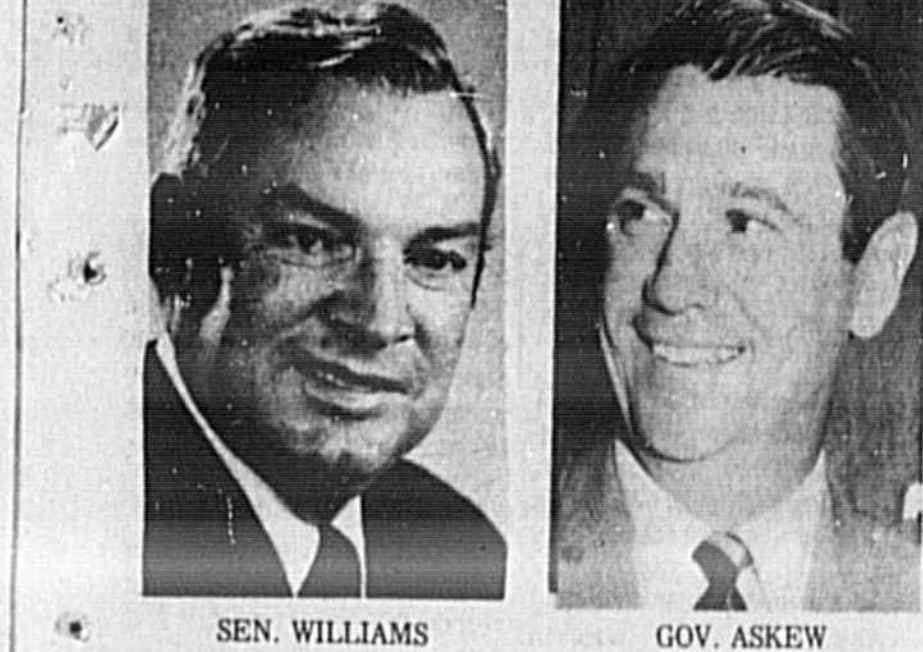

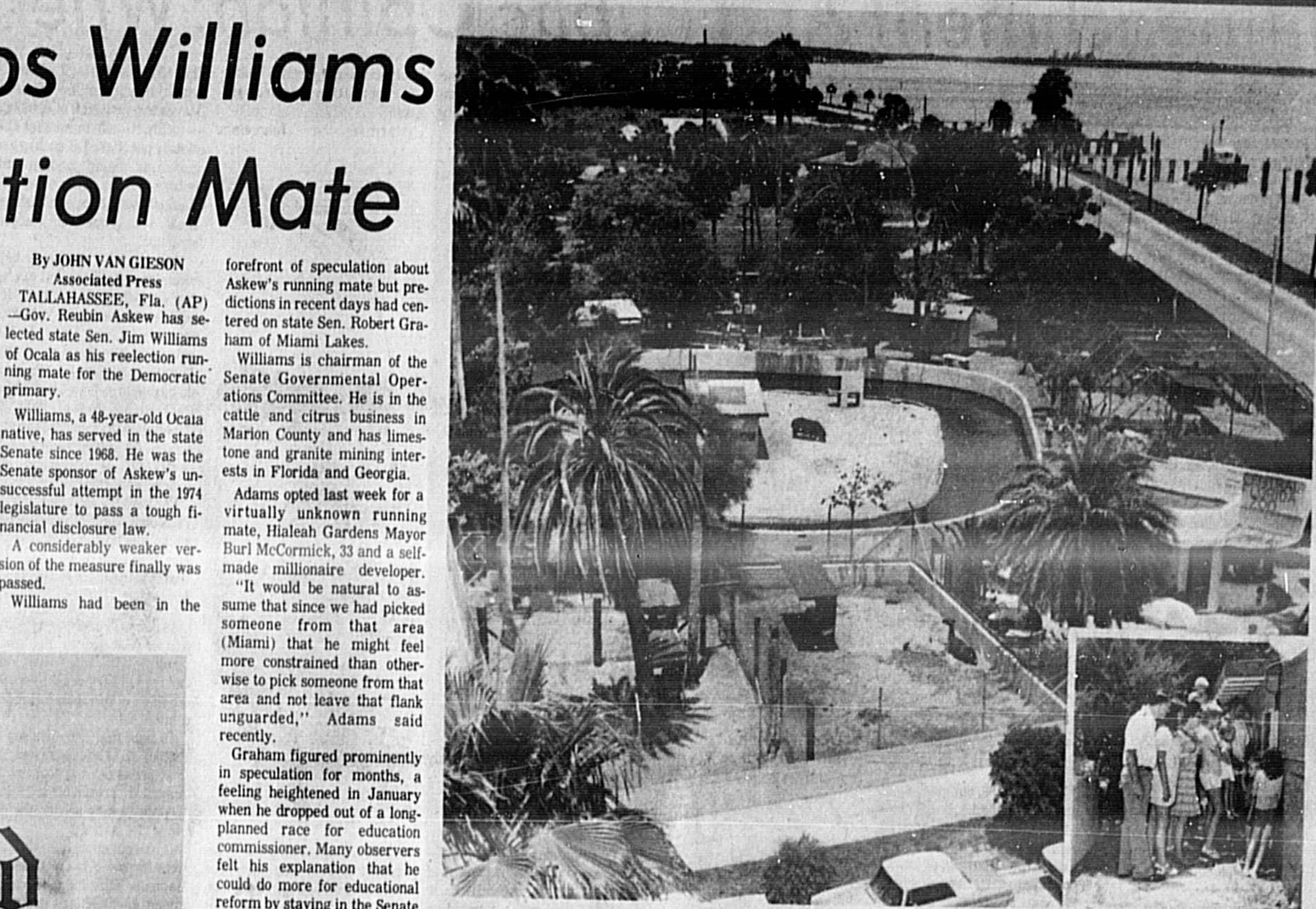

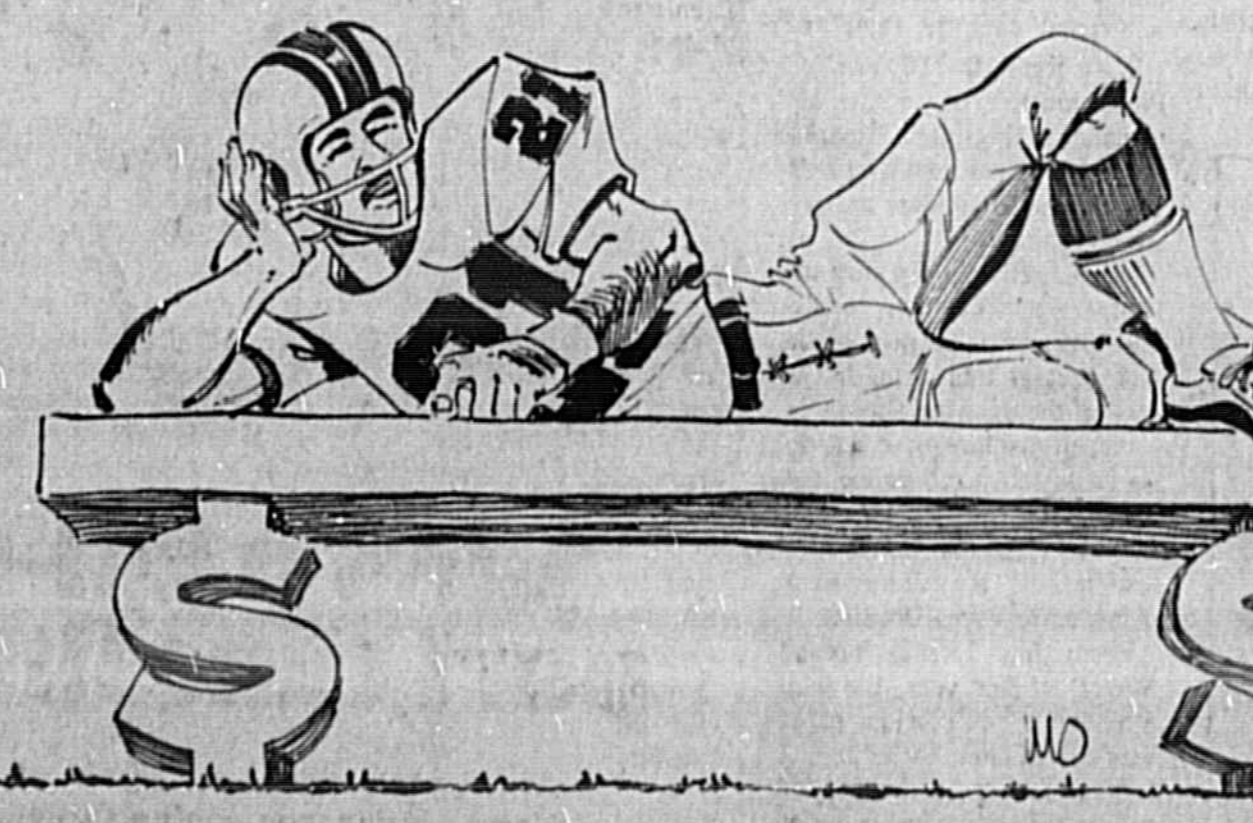

Realtors Make First Study Since 1961 by JULIAN STENSTROM. The Florida Association of Realtors recently took a good look at itself and came up with some facts and figures the general public might like to know about.

Average Is 11 Years. The average Realtor in Florida has been licensed for 11 years while the average Realtor-Associate has been in the business for five years.

Where's the best place to locate a real estate office? That's hard to tell but the report indicates that the locations of the more profitable offices appear to be on major thoroughfares, in shopping centers and in suburbs rather than in the central business district.

Education background: College is still no prerequisite for practicing real estate. Only 30 per cent of those surveyed reported a completed college education.

Another important factor revealed by the survey is that the practice of real estate in Florida is not the gold mine which the public is inclined to believe. For example, most Florida Realtors average making less than \$25,000 per year while most Realtor-Associates average less than \$15,000.

Finally, the report shows a changing trend toward real estate being the practitioner's only business or profession. Once upon a time a Realtor had another line such as insurance or something else.

A major lawn problem this time of year is damage from sod webworms and other lawn caterpillars. If your lawn looks brown and ragged, you may have one of these pests.

When it is established that sod webworms are the problem, start the control measures promptly. Sod webworms, in particular, complete their life cycle very quickly after they reach a size where they cause noticeable damage. Recommended materials are diazinon or sevin sprays. Treat the entire lawn thoroughly, giving particular attention to areas obviously heavily infested.

# Lake Mary Curtails Further Annexation

Lake Mary — City Council Monday night closed the door on any discussion concerning the annexation of additional property into the city until the future of the city is decided by the voters July 30.

To the delight of 30 residents near the city's northwestern border, including two attorneys and a court reporter who was recording the session, council tabled a request by Sanford businessman Don Hattel to annex four parcels of land totaling around 200 acres.

"If the charter vote fails and the city continues, we'll still fight the annexation and zoning. I feel Lake Mary should get itself in order within its existing borders before moving out to get additional land," Fredrick said.

Council also failed to consider the annexation of 100 acres of property in the city's southeastern border adjoining U.S. 17-92 to the south crossing SR 427 to the north at the request of the Babcock Corporation. The city had already approved rezoning of 70 acres inside the city for Babcock's Planned Unit Development, with the 100 acres also going for PUD zoning for a 959 unit condominium apartment and patio home project that had sparked a heated controversy in this city of 2,400.

The Babcock proposal, which opponents say will cost the city too much in taxes before it begins to pay enough real estate taxes into the city to pay its share of growth-related expenses, also was a key issue in the charter recall petitions and vote.

Wade Hargadon, Babcock regional manager asked the city to delay the public hearing on the annexation until after the charter vote.

Council hired a part time policeman at \$2.50 per hour for a 24 hour week to assist its police chief with routine patrols.

However, the man hired, Gayne Turner, 34, is on active duty at the Orlando Naval Training Center as a storekeeper, and council agreed to Chief Gerald Fitzgerald's recommendation to hire him with permission of his commanding officer.

Turner, a Sunland Estates resident, has a state certificate of completion of the 280 law enforcement course and is presently a part time police officer with Orlando.

Orlando Naval Training Center security office spokesman said Turner had permission to work for the Orlando Police Department from the base commanding officer, and saw no barrier to his accepting the position in Lake Mary.

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# Blowflies, Mosquitos Invade Casselberry Near Turf Club

CASSELBERRY — Heavy rains and washed out streets have for the past two weeks prevented city crews from spraying mosquitoes and blowflies generated by compost heaps at the Seminole Turf Club.

Many city residents don't like this at all, and they vented their collective displeasure during Monday night's council meeting.

"You can't even sit outside anymore," said John Morgan, 3 King Arthur Court, Camelot subdivision.

"I know, I know," said Councilman John Leighty, who returned this weekend from vacation, to discover his telephone ringing and irate citizens on the other end.

"I've got just as many of them (blowflies) around my house as you do," Leighty said, "and I don't like it either."

City Manager Harry Hug, after explaining that bad road conditions and steady rain had learned to make fogging impossible, said crews will begin spraying this week.

Councilman Edith Duerr said it is necessary to spray quickly because standing water ponds make ideal breeding places for mosquitos.

However, there probably will be no more night time fogging, Hug explained, because \$2,000 allocated earlier this year for that purpose has been switched to another fund, which means the spraying will be done only during the day.

Mosquitos are most troublesome in the afternoon and night, when the day's heat has diminished.

Council also heard several residents complain about proposed changes in the expansion project at Land O' Lakes Country Club.

Mrs. Alice Miller, 229 Shadow Hollow Lane, vented her displeasure about a planned lake that SMD developers want to put 20 feet from her back property line.

"I just don't believe you'd do that to me," said Mrs. Miller never been told about a lake going in, and expressed fears it might overflow and flood her property.

Other residents objected to the erection of tennis courts and handball courts on golf course land that fronts a residential area.

The developers agreed to delete from the plans presented to council the two courts and to seek a settlement with the homeowners who complained.

At one point Chairman Tom Embree, who said he has always objected to the site of the proposed courts, challenged the developers' representatives to explain why councilmen were receiving complaints about the courts after being assured by the developers that they had contacted all property owners and no objections existed.

One SMD official said, "I don't know." He then added he will "check on it."

# Longwood Council Strips Jaques Of Power, Salary

LONGWOOD — City Council in little more than five minutes Monday night without objection from a packed audience held a public hearing and repealed Mayor Eugene Jaques' \$10,000 annual salary and his administrative authority.

The action, anticipated since January when Councilmen Donald Scherier and June Lormann took office, was blocked for six months by the absence from meetings of the mayor's powers and authority. Councilman H. A. Scott, elected June 11 to Williamson's unexpired term said prior and immediately after his election that he would work to strip Jaques of both salary and power.

Councilmen also told City Atty. Joe Davis to find out from the attorney general councilmen and the city clerk's powers and responsibilities.

Davis said he had refused a request from Jaques to seek the opinion, awaiting city council authorization.

Jaques, attending his first council meeting in several weeks, said he had faithfully performed his duties as pseudo city manager, charging that the new council majority since January had not permitted him to fulfill his executive responsibilities.

The repealing ordinances will not take effect until Jaques either signs or vetoes them. The city charter provides a mayor's veto can be overridden by a simple majority.

Davis has told councilmen that the charter does not give a deadline for Jaques to take action. He said that a "reasonable" time for consideration and action by Jaques would be 10 days. He admitted, however, that there is little, except for court action, that the city council can do if Jaques refuses to either approve or veto the ordinances.

Jaques said he has not made up his mind what course he will follow.

# W. Springs Must Pare Big Budget

WINTER SPRINGS — It's back to the drawing board for the architects of Winter Springs' budget for the 1974-75 fiscal year.

When adding up the totals for the tentative budget Monday night City Council discovered that budgeted spending was almost double projected income.

Expenditures budgeted for the various city departments totaled \$441,330.75, while, even with anticipated revenue from a three mill ad valorem tax, income only came to \$204,882. This left a deficit of \$236,448.75.

The tentative budget called for \$171,950 for the Police Department; \$73,541; Fire Department; \$40,810; Road and Bridge; \$76,500; office; \$13,576.75; court system; \$24,246; Planning and Zoning; \$41,000; finance.

Council approved including the coming year's budget plans for putting city employees on Social Security and initiating a pension plan with employee-city participation. To be eligible for the pension plan employees must have worked for the city for two or more years.

Mayor Troy Pfland suggested the department heads come to the 7 p.m. workshop next Monday with proposed budget cuts.

Told last week that all police vehicles were either "dead or dying," Council acted to meet the emergency by accepting the \$11,073.72 bid by Bert Smith American Motors for three vehicles. The vehicles will be financed with Southeast National Bank at Maitland over 13 months.

More flooding problems were cited in The Terrace where washouts have occurred on Sweet Gum Court and Cedarwood Court. Water from Gies Creek caused the Sweet Gum being washed away from under a swimming pool.
