

ready-to-cook. When you choose your turkey look first for the circular-shaped USDA label. Some 90 per cent of the turkeys produced bear the U.S. Department of Agriculture inspection mark. This means they've been inspected for wholesomeness at the time of slaughter and processed under sanitary conditions. While grading is not mandatory, the shield-



you should check for undamaged wrapping because exposure to the air dehydrates the meat and encourages rancidity. After selecting a top quality bird, to retain its fresh-frozen goodness, store it immediately in the refrigerator or freezer.

Sizes of the whole bird may range from 4 to 30 pounds and larger. The larger the bird the better the buy if you can effectively use all the meat. You pay less per pound for the larger birds than for the smaller. Larger ones have more meat in porportion to the bone than smaller ones. Due to

Murderer Sentenced

MIAMI (AP) - A Miami judge has reconsidered putting a 19-year-old admitted murderer on probation and making him support his victim's widow and five children as an alternative to jail. Instead, Criminal Court Judge Dan Satin sentenced Larry Clark to 30 years in prison Monday, saying that Clark has shown little remorse for the crime.

"I think we have to eventually realize that the present method of sentencing has to be changed," Satin said, explaining his change of mind, "But professionals indicated it wouldn't have worked in this

Clark had pleaded guilty to seconddegree murder in the shooting death of RudolphlSmith, 36, last April.

Adams' use of state workers on the farm esulted in his censure by the Florida House earlier this year. A move to impeach him fell 17 votes short of the necessary two-thirds.

Nixon visited Peking.

Secretary of State Henry Kissinger has completed his mission to the Middle East with signal success in getting Egypt and Israel to back away from a resumption of large-scale hostilities in their still-smoldering war.

It would be too optimistic to conclude the Mr. Kissinger has set wheels in motion that will lead to a genuine, stable peace in the Middle East. That problem is as knotty as ever. Yet the new agreements represent an extraordinary accomplishment for Mr. Kissinger and are a triumph for the diplomatic effort which President Nixon has undertaken to mediate the Middle East stalemate.

A reluctant Israel agreed to join in a sixpoint agreement with Egypt which promises to relieve the tension at the most explosive point of their confrontation. A supply corridor will open to the entrapped Egytian 3rd Army, while Israel may gain access to the strategic port of Eilat. The way is thus opened for an exchange of war prisoners, and for military commanders to enter direct negotiations to "tidy up" the cease-fire lines left uncertain by the fighting which followed the acceptance of the Oct. 22 United Nations truce resolution.

Negotiations on the major territorial issues arising from both the 1967 and 1973 Arab-Israeli wars remain well down the road, but the two sides at least appear to be conceding that such negotiations must eventually take place. There is no sign that Israel is any closer than ever to accepting the terms of the U.N. resolution calling for withdrawal of her troops from all Arab territory they have occupied since 1967. The Arabs, with their oil embargo gaining new support for their position in Western Europe and Japan, may be more determined than ever to stand on that resolution as the only acceptable goal for negotiations.

Regardless, the fact that Egypt and Israel are willing to make concessions to keep their ceasefire from collapsing tells us that both the

Ben-Gurion, 67, entered Tel Hashomer Hospital on Sunday after a stroke paralyzed the entire right side of his body. The physician, Dr. Boreslaw fully recover. But his chances for a partial recovery are very good."

Sea Voyage Ends

PHNOM PENH, Cambodia (AP) - The whereabouts of the Combodian air force pilot who bombed President Lon Nol's palace compound remained a mystery. The bombing, the second such incident since March 17, killed three persons and wounded 10. 

The leveling down of talent continues. The fabricated stimulation of races increases. Breathless and unabated goes the sports merry-go-round. And we wildly chase after those elusive, illusionary stallions. Excellence is often replaced by either the middling or the bizarre.

More people watched that Riggs-King phenomenon than had ever seen a tennis match in the whole history of the so-called civilized world.

A fan pays a scalper \$100 for a \$5 seat near the end of the season to see the Mets play the Expos in Shea Stadium, with the fragile East Division title in the balance.

And like it or not it has its zany fascination, even though we can easily peruse the standings and determine that without a split of the league the Mets would have been maybe 10 games behind the Reds in a leg:timate National

The promoters and hustlers can do virtually no wrong in the eyes and pocketbook of the fan. There are, for example, 24 teams in the major leagues when once there were 16. That means there are 200 more players, enough for an entire minor league. The players have been infused into the big leagues without much of a plaintive twitter from fandom. And the commercial racket of sport grows

Manufacturing a situation to make it more titillating is old and common stuff. Why else, for example, are their seedings in tennis tournaments? Handicaps in golf are

similar: they are designed not to determine the best golfer but to fictitiously even out the competition. Sports, though, has universally appealed to dreams and illusions and the setting up and attempted conquering of


The unreality extends to the so-called selecting of all-star teams, all-pro teams, all-American teams, the col-lege football and basketball ratings. It's all a hustle to whet the interest and sweaty appetite of fans, and enrich the promoters and participants. And it succeeds with the slickness of the patent medicine flimflam man, or today's


We are not getting something that we think we're get-ting. But the wrapping is so much fun to fool with that the contents pale in comparison. If, in fact, we ever even bother to investigate inside.

What harm can there be in this seeming nonsense? Perhaps not much. Possibly, it is helpful. There is a nice assembly-line escape valve in wondering who will win the whooped-up, upcoming match. But there is also the deadening effects of accepting glitter for gold, of making a crass man who can hit a ball a hero. Possibly this extends to other areas of our life. And we begin to make





WASHINGTON (AP) — Consumer prices rose sharply last month following September's slowdown, owing partly to the energy crisis and higher prices for fuel oil and gasoline, the government said today.

The Department of Labor reported that the cost of living climbed eight-tenths of one per cent in October and pushed consumer prices up 7.9 per cent above a year ago. It marked the largest jump in any 12-month period since the 8.7 per cent in flationary rate recorded in the June 1950-51 period at the start of the Korean War. In addition to sharply higher

prices for gasoline and fuel oil.

rising costs for clothing, mortgage interest rates and health insurance contributed significantly to the October rise in prices, the government said.

A decline in meat and poultry prices was more than offset in the statistics by large increases prices of restaurant meals and some food and some grocery store

Food prices rose one-tenth of a per cent following a drop of seventenths of a per cent in September and a record 6 per cent jump in August. The increase was larger on a seasonally adjusted basis, increasing five-tenths of a per cent compared with a drop of

one-tenth of a per cent on basis on September. Grocery prices actually declined three-tenths of a per cent but the drop was offset by a 1.8

per cent jump in food purchased away from home, including restaurant meals and snacks.

Poultry, egg and pork prices fell sharply again—as they did in September — and prices for beef prices for most other food sold in grocery stores went up, government said.

Prices for nonfood commodities jumped nine-tenths of one per cent, sharpest this year and the biggest jump since a one per cent increase in October 1970.
