

The industrial revolution of the 19th century at least postponed the impact of the Malthusian theory, as far as Britain was concerned, by making it possible for Britons to produce sufficient exports to buy the food they need. Now the green revolution of fast-growing strains of wheat and rice may be doing the same for Asia.

With the present world population of three and a half billion - more than half in Asia expected to double by the turn of the century, the Malthusian theory again may be put to a

Can another major development such as synpopulation disaster? The food versus population time bomb is one which has been met and de fused before. But the projection of seven bil lion inhabitants on this globe by the year 2000 is a sobering one.
