Ford To Make CIA Report

Public, Aides Say

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Ford holds a news conference tonight, and aides say he is expected to announce plans to make public the Rockefeller Commission's report on its investigation of CIA domestic ac-

The CIA investigation was expected to be a major topic at the 7:30 p.m. EDT news conference, which will be broadcast nationally by major television and radio net-

Ship Search Continues

NEW ORLEANS (AP)-After stumbling across four Spanish speaking men in the Gulf of Mexico Sunday, the Coast Guard resumed searching this morning for a missing shrimp boat with four Texans aboard. Three planes scouring a 13, 000 square intic area of the

Gulf Sunday for the missing shrimper found the four mysterious survivors in two life rafts.

"We don't know who they are or where they came from," said a Coast Guard spokesman. "They are now aboard a vessel, but identifications are difficult." he added. "Crewmen on the vessel speak Portuguese and the men they picked up speak Spanish.

We speak neither." Planes searched all weekend for what is believed to be the 75-foot shrimper "Valley King" of Brownsville, Tex.

Evers Tax Trial To Start

JACKSON, Miss. (AP) - Fayette Mayor Charles Evers, Mississippi's leading black politician, faces trial today on charges of federal income tax evasion. Legal sources say the trial will last 10 days or more. Evers is running for the state Senate but said he would not ask U.S. District Judge Dan Russell for a delay. Evers, who in 1971 became the first black to run for governor of the state, was charged with evading \$52,593 in

federal income taxes from 1968-70. His indictment charged that he paid \$3,644 in taxes when he should have paid \$56,237 and that he reported earning \$20,229 when he actually made \$179,556.

Soviet Subs Approach Coast

WASHINGTON (AP) - A Soviet missile-firing submarine has been detected operating closer to the U.S. East Coast than ever before. Pentagon officials are puzzled why the Russian com-

mand sent a Y-class nuclear-powered submarine to cruise within 350 miles of Cape Cod, Mass., and later about the same distance off Norfolk, Va., last week. This is about 1,000 miles closer to the United States than Soviet Y-class subs normally patrol in the Atlantic.

Susan Saxe Faces Jury

PHILADELPHIA (AP) - Susan Edith Saxe, accused of murdering a Boston policeman, goes on trial today on federal charges of robbing a Philadelphia bank nearly five years ago in an alleged attempt to finance revolutionary activities.

The former Brandeis University honors graduate from Albany, N.Y., is accused of stealing \$5,240 from the Bell Savings and Loan Association on Sept. 1, 1970.

Tossed Out Of Park MIAMI (AP) - Three Miami mothers have been tossed out of a public park for allegely violating the city's decency ordinance by breast-feeding their infants. Luanne Recicar, Penny Watt and Jane Donally said Sunday they were asked to leave a city park last Thursday

by a ranger who told them he had received complaints

about the breastfeeding. The mothers said they were enlisting the support of local women's rights leaders in their fight against the ban. "What we do when we nurse a child is anything but indecent," said Mrs. Recicar. "It doesn't involve removing any clothing and we are very discreet about it. "I've nursed at church with no problems and in restaurants too," she added. "The people who complained, if anyone did, probably raise their kids to think

MIAMI (AP) - No negotiations are scheduled as a strike by 350 drivers and terminal workers against the Trailways Bus Co. goes into its second day today in Florida and southwest Georgia.

Federal mediator Robert Leitner had huddled with negotiators for the company and the Amalgamated Transit Union last Thursday and Friday in an effort to avoid the strike, which began at early Sunday. "It's not close," Leitner said Sunday of the positions of the two sides on wage and benefit terms for a new three-

year contract. "The parties are at an impasse." He said he hoped to resume negotiations this week. Company officials said the strike has shut down Trailways operations in Florida and routes between Florida cities and Atlanta, Albany and Columbus, Ga. Officials said other routes in Georgia were not affected.

Two Wounded In Escape Try

FORT MYERS (AP) - Two of six inmates were wounded in a hail of gunfire shortly after midnight this morning as deputies broke up what was described as a well planned jailbreak, officers said. Only one of the six succeeding in fleeing the Lee County

Deputies said neither of the inmates who were shot was seriously wounded. One was reportedly hit in the finger, the other in the thigh. Their indentities were not immediately released.

Phillip Lewis, D-West Plam Beach and chairman of the Senate Natural Resources Committee, said he is telling anyone interested in politics and power to watch the water management districts and their boards.

"That's where the power is going to be," Lewis said. "Water in Florida and who controls it is going to become more and more important as time goes by," said Stan Winn, assistant director of the Pollution Control Depart-





Nations Must Work Together For Peace

The United States of America has undergone a substantial reassessment of its foreign policy in recent weeks. The early euphoria of detente has faded and the hard realities of dealing with nations who prayer their own self-interests above all, or who are own sworn enemies, have come in ne to

As a consequence for example, we have reassessed our national policy toward detente itself - or "peaceful coexistence" as the Soviet Union calls it. The President, the secretary of state and the secretary of defense have made it plain recently, we have to get something in return if we give ground to relax tensions.

By the same token, in the Middle East the United States is committed to the survival of Israel - and we also want to have constructive relationships with Arab nations. On the other hand, we are reviewing our policy toward both Israel and the Arabs because Secretary of State Henry Federal Elections Commission continues to try selfinterest in his last effort at personal mediating in the Middle East. At the same time, Secretary of Defense Schlesinger also has made it clear that the United States will not take another crippling Arab oil embargo supinely.

The general hardening of U.S. foreign policy is evident also in the appointment of Daniel Moynihan as the U.S. ambassador to the United campaign funds in all future federal elections. Nations. One good thing about being laid up in hospital with a broken leg just four weeks before the end of the school year, is that there's very little else to do but study for your



In Death

Ten Seminole County Jail inmates and a jailer were killed yesterday when a stack of foam-rubber mattresses outside a hospital cell housing a juvenile burned filling the second-floor facility with dense, choking smoke.

Jailer Robert O. Moore, 40, of Longwood, was dead on arrival at a hospital, officials said, but gave his life saving an undetermined number of the 68 prisoners in the jail by leading and dragging them to safety.
