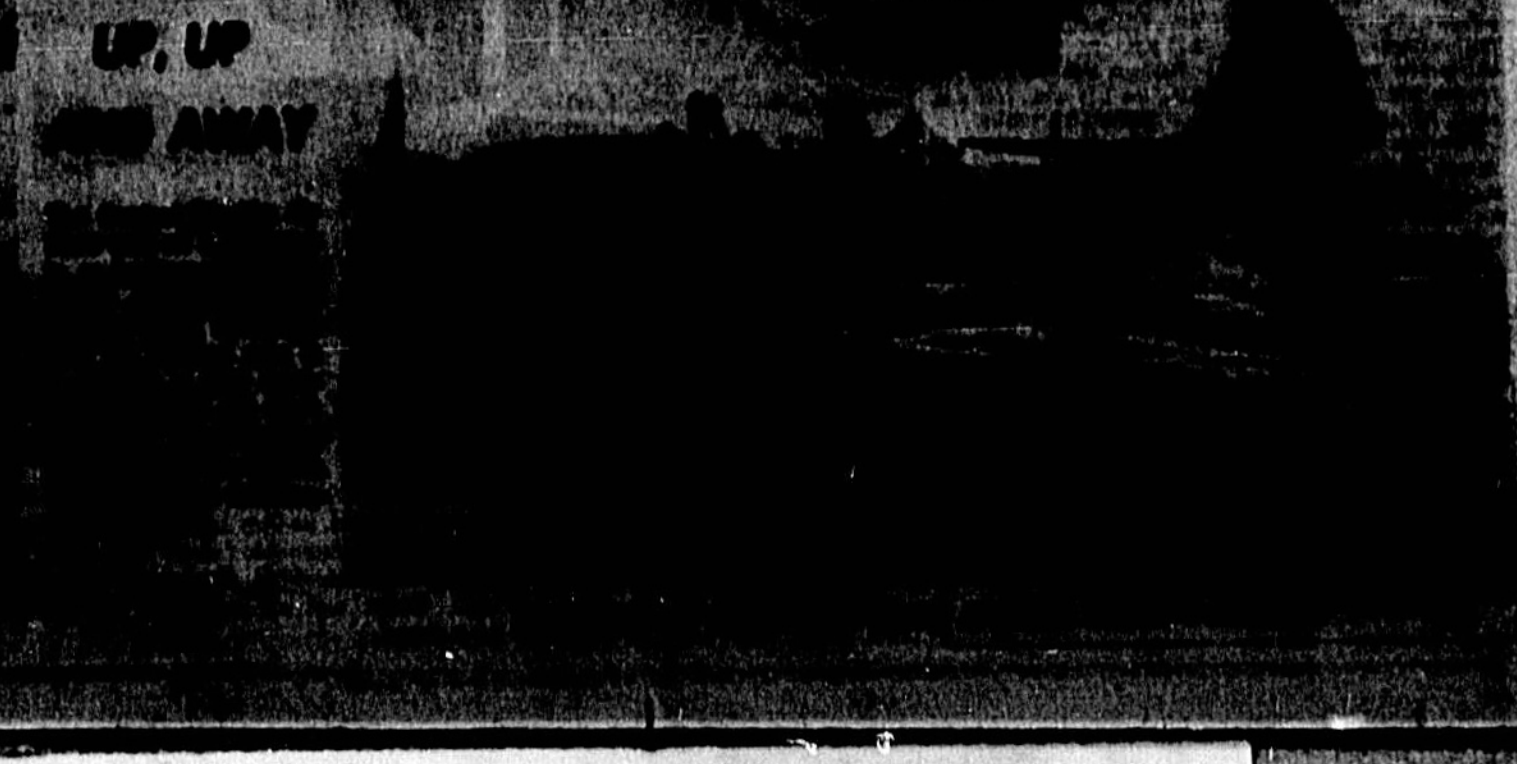

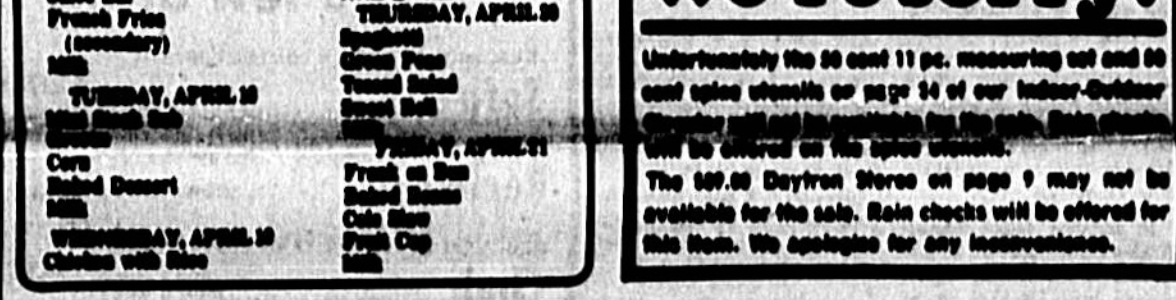

Shore Abortions in Rome? We Expected by May

ROME (UPI) — Italian politicians said today that the center of Roman Catholicism could have discontinued abortion on demand by next month.

The Italian government, which voted today to allow abortion on demand for the first time in the country's history, has set a goal to have the measure passed by the end of the year.

The governing Christian Democrats opposition party has been successful in passing a pro-abortion law. They refrained from filibustering in return for concessions on some marginal clauses of the measure.

Stinking Gas Kills Animals

PORTO ALGRES, Brazil (UPI) — Soldiers from Uruguay and Brazil are investigating a mysterious cloud of stinking gas that has swept in from the Atlantic, killing thousands of fish, birds, horses and dogs.

Reports from Uruguay and Brazilian police reported two workers died from the gas, but the Brazilian government says it is not sure if the gas is from the Atlantic. The gas is an odorless, colorless gas that has been found in the past.

Rebels, Troops Swap Gunfire

CONCEPTION, Nicaragua (UPI) — Guerrillas shooting from the hills tower of a church exchanged gunfire with government troops Friday night in a shooting that left three civilians and a soldier wounded.

The shooting occurred in Conception, 20 miles west of Managua, after 600 demonstrators cut telephone lines throughout the town and set fire to the home of Rene Sanchez, a government supporter.

Secretary of State Cyrus Vance and his British negotiating partner talked with Rhodesian guerrillas today, trying to resolve unreported problems which threatened their attempts to avert civil war.

The showdown between the Western envoys and the Rhodesians was averted after a meeting between the nationalists and ministers of the so-called Frontline nations.

The meeting was held in London, where the British and Rhodesian negotiators met to discuss the situation. The meeting was held in a secret location.

Earthquake Jolts Taiwan

TAIPEI, Taiwan — UPI — An earthquake jolted central and northern Taiwan Friday night but the Central Weather Bureau said there were no reports of damage or casualties.

BOLOGNA, Italy (UPI) — A speeding Venice-Rome express jumped the tracks between Bologna and Florence Saturday in heavy rain and hit an oncoming train, killing 10 passengers, police said.

First reports said between 10 and 20 people were killed. The train was carrying 100 passengers.

The owner of Longwood's oldest continually operated business, Homer Scott, was present accompanied by his wife, the former Bula Peacor, a member of another early Longwood family.

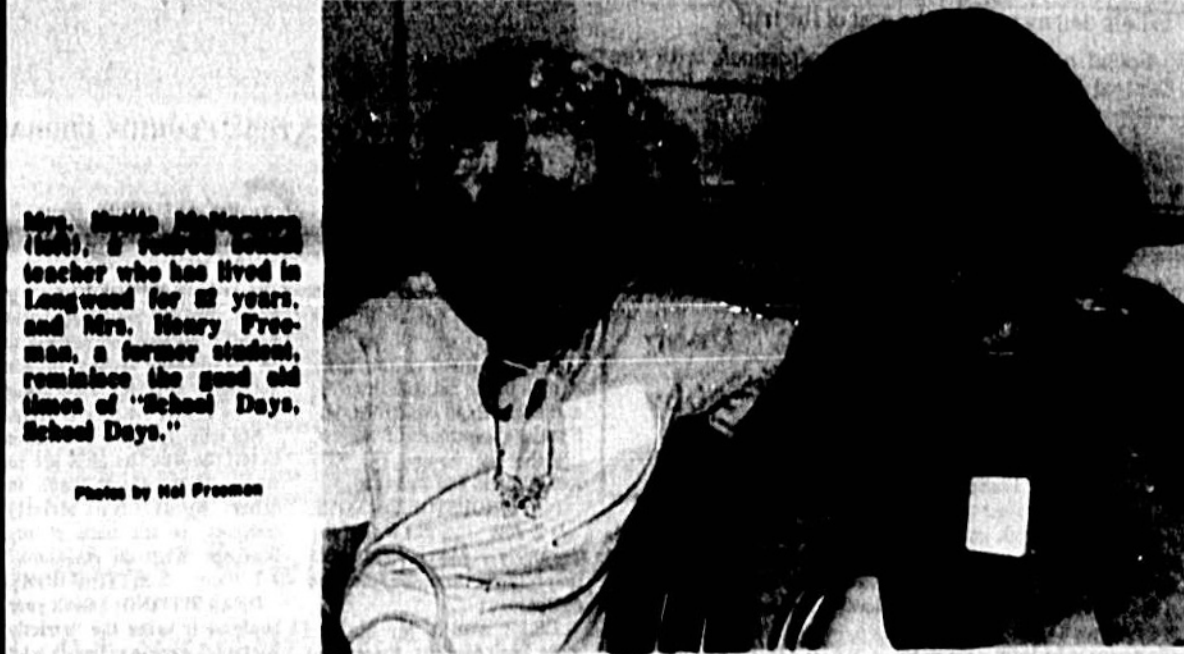

TV's 'Holocaust': 'Just History' For Students?

Social studies classes in Seminole County high schools are taking advantage of the four-part HBO-TV series, "Holocaust," which began Sunday night to dramatize the horror of death camps in Nazi Germany.

"Many students are upset at the inhumane treatment of the Jews in Nazi Germany; they weren't aware that it went that far," said Lyman High School Social Studies Chairman Dan Smith after watching Sunday night's showing of "The Holocaust."

Smith said his classes had just completed a study of World War II and the book, "The Rise and Fall of the Third Reich." Discussion of the concentration camps and Hitler's genocide policy set the stage for what they might anticipate in the television series, but discussion

sometimes does not have the impact that watching television does, he added.

"Some students stated it was difficult for them to observe this type of treatment, even on TV," Smith said, "while others recognized that this did happen but it was just history to them."

On the high school Social Studies Department head Paul Smith and Seminole County Social Studies coordinator Gordon Haskewitz had met with students from the various high schools last week to discuss use of the program and materials. Superintendent W.P. Loyal has approved their use, but at the discretion of the teachers, Smith said.

He said a representative from Seminole County Social

Studies teachers will attend a meeting with Orange County educators and the producers of the film at the Junior Achievement Center in Orlando this afternoon to learn ways to implement discussion of the film, Smith said.

"We are using it at Orinda with our 10th grade American History and I am encouraging my students to watch," Smith said. "I have offered extra credit to students who will watch at least half of the series and write a summary."

It is not new to those of us who lived through World War II, but it is to kids today," said Smith who added out of 170 students in his classes this morning about 50 or 60 had watched at least part of the first segment of "The

Holocaust."

The series is coming at a good time, said Dan Trout, chairman of the social studies department at Lake County High School in Lake County. History classes are moving into World War II.

At Lake Howell High School, students are being encouraged to watch the "Holocaust" on television, but mostly because there is no other way to see it, he said. "The only way to see it is on TV," he said. "The series is being used in two English classes and one Social Studies class at Lake Howell."

Indigent Births: Did Hospital Spurn Bylaws?

Seminole Memorial Hospital's payments to doctors for delivery of indigent births is a violation of the hospital's bylaws, according to a report from Troy Todd, director of Human Services.

Todd's report, written late

last month, will be in part the subject of a meeting between the Seminole County Commission and the hospital's board of trustees Tuesday afternoon. The trustees want the county to pay doctor's fees for indigent births.

The report recommends the county "continue status quo in regard to indigent delivery."

Other recommendations include continued efforts to collect fees from indigents and to recruit obstetricians for the hospital.

In November, 1976, the hospital board voted to pay \$275 to the obstetrician for each indigent delivery and \$50 for pediatrician care of the newborn.

The vote by the hospital constituted a "deviation" from its bylaws, according to Todd's report.

"The hospital board of trustees requires that the medical staff provide an emergency call service and a rotation of charity services for patients in the hospital," said the report.

Dr. W. Vincent Roberts, obstetrician, wrote the hospital board in February, 1976, that he refused to accept responsibility for indigent deliveries other than on those evenings when he was on emergency room call.

Todd's report notes that the commission might open itself to payment for all indigent care if it establishes a policy of paying for indigent births.

"There is a request of Seminole Hospital from a

member of the medical staff, or other donor, requesting free patients, shall receive some payment for his services," stated the report.

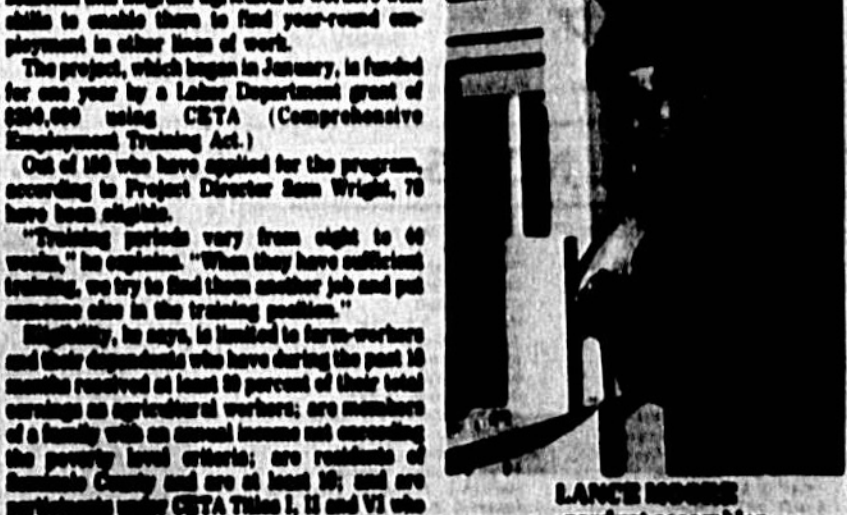

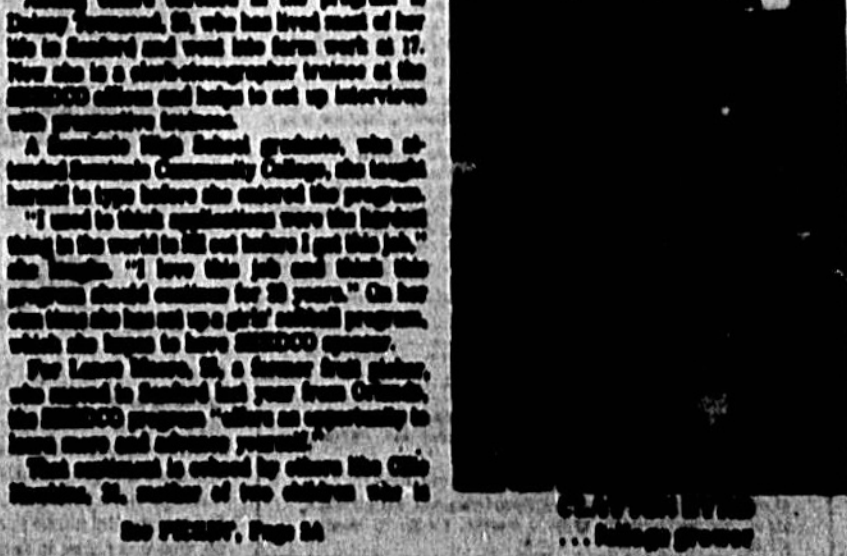

Seasonal and migrant agricultural workers with skills to enable them to find year-round employment in other lines of work.

The project, which began in January, is funded for one year by a Labor Department grant of \$600,000 using CETA (Comprehensive Employment and Training Act).

Out of 100 who have applied for the program, according to Project Director Sam Wright, 70 have been accepted.

"Training periods vary from eight to 40 weeks," he explains. "When they have collected training, we try to find them another job and get someone else in the training position."

Eligibility, he says, is limited to farm-workers and their dependents who have during the past 18 months received at least 50 percent of their total earnings as agricultural workers; are members of a family with an annual income not exceeding the poverty level criteria; are residents of Seminole County and are at least 18; and are participants under CETA Titles I, II and VI who have met CETA requirements.

Among others enrolled in the program is Danny Williams, 34, who has lived most of his life in Sanford and moved into farm work at 17. Now able to do a multi-photographer course at the SEMCOO office and help to set up interviews with prospective business.

A Seminole High School graduate, who attended Seminole Community College, she taught herself to type before she entered the program. "I used to think agriculture was the hardest thing in the world to do and before I got this job," she laughs, "I love this job and think this country should continue for 25 years." On her own time she has set up a girl's softball program, which she hopes to have SEMCOO sponsor.

For Lance Moore, 31, a former fruit grower, who worked in the field for years before joining the SEMCOO program, "what an opportunity to learn more and advance myself."
