Reroofing To Start Next Week

Civic Center Events Continue Despite Storm Damage

Herald Staff Writer

Major repair work at the Sanford Civic Center, to fix up hail damage to the facility in last week's storm, should be under way by early next week.

Sanford City Manager W.E. "Pete" Knowles said today he expects to sign a contract for the reroofing of the center later

The roofing on two-thirds of the Civic Center auditorium, the stage and the entire youth wing was blown off during the storm and water flooded into the building.

The cost of the reroofing is expected to be about \$32,000. In any event, despite the damage to the building, civic activities have continued there. While the damage occurred last Thursday afternoon, the Sanford Rotary Club had its regular

luncheon meeting Monday in the center's annex.

And that is where the Friends of the Salvation Army dinner April 27 and the Greater Sanford area Chamber of Commerce banquet on April 30 will be held if repairs aren't sufficiently completed in the auditorium by those times, said Jim Jernigan, city director of recreation and parks.

The City Commission on Monday night authorized Knowles to spend the funds necessary, waiving the need for bids, to reroof the Civic Center. The reroofing was given first priority in the city's list of emergency repairs of city property.

The center received extensive damage from the storm. In a six-page report of damage to city buildings, vehicles and property, Knowles listed the following problems at the Civic Center in addition to the roof damage:

- Curtains heavily soaked with water - two panels cut by

- Stage floor soaked. The hardwood-finish floor will require sanding and refinishing or may need to be replaced.

- Stage curtains heavily water soaked and are drying out. They also are stained. Replacement cost is about \$6,450. -Five large glass panes broken - three of which are heavy sliding doors in the youth wing - and one small glass panel.

Approximate cost, \$1,400. - Six aluminum sunshade grids are damaged and will need

- Sound-system amplifiers and speakers were soaked and are now being dried out. Repairs will cost about \$2,700. The mixer box also may need replacing.

- Pool tables ended up with a couple of inches of water on them. They are now drying. Cost, about \$390 to re-cover.

Stored athletic gear in two storerooms was completely soaked. There was a couple of inches of water on the floor. It's now drying out.

- Dressing-room carpeting may need to be replaced with outdoor carpeting. There was three inches of water in each room. Estimated cost, \$900.

- The office area was soaked, and office equipment and

supplies were carried out to dry out. - The emergency lighting controls and stage curtain motor

- Fixed lights in the ceiling must be examined.

- Piano on the stages must be checked.

- Some ceiling electrical units must be checked.

- The youth wing office drapes may need to be replaced. They are stained from roof pitch.

County Seeking Aid For Tornado Damage

Seminole County won't receive word from the state until at least the end of the week on the amount of financial aid it will get to help repair damage caused by last week's storm. But when word comes from Tallahassee, county Public Safety Director Gary Kaiser said, the county

will apply for anything it qualifies for. "I have no idea of whether aid will come in the form of direct aid or low interest loans," he said today. "But when word comes, the county will definitely try for anything available.

Kaiser said a survey team from the state Department of Disaster Preparedness finished its survey of damage to Seminole County on Tuesday and will spend today working with officials in Volusia County.

"We're awaiting word as to whether the state team will ask for a presidential declaration of a disaster which will result in federal aid," said Kaiser

Of major concern to the county is the estimate of \$6.1 million in crop damage from the county agricultural agent. "That figure, in all probability, will

continue to grow," said Kaiser. He indicated that the second concern is a 17-block area west of Sanford off 18th Street where the majority of homes in the area sustained substantial roof and flood damage caused by blown-

out glass windows. "The vast majority of homes in that

area are uninsured," said Kaiser. During the County Commission workshop session, Kaiser told the commission his office experienced some minor communications problems during and after the storms.

"Most of the problems were minor, dealing with telephone instrument lines," he said. "We were inundated with calls from the media, and when the regular lines get tied up the emergency lines were flooded with calls. We can't

afford to have that happen," he said. Kaiser said the public safety office was aware of the problem two years ago but the dollars just weren't there to expand the system at the time.

"Most of the problems dealt with old department numbers or individual numbers that were outdated or deleted," he said "We're looking at additional phone lines to expand the public-safety telephone system for better com-

Kaiser said his office has been in the process of revising its emergency natural disaster plan for Seminole County during the last eight months.

"We gained some valuable experience from Hurricane David several years ago," he said. "And the learning experience helped us identify some critical problem areas that have since been taken care of."

Kaiser recalled that during Hurricane David the county didn't have a viable emergency operations center.

"Before, we were operating out of the inadequate. It had less than a fourth of the space needed, didn't have emergency power, and there were no facilities for cooking food," he said.

Kaiser said that since that time great improvements have come about county wide through changes in the development of the County's Emergency Operations Condition plans.

"All the departments use the plan internally," he said.

"Any problems we had from the storm were mostly internal ones that just need some polishing up," he added.

The modular-type cells, he said, would house minimum-security prisoners for short periods of time, perhaps several months, until space could be found within the prison system. "The Legislature does not want to see Florida get into the position some other states are in where by court order prison inmates must be released due to overcrowding," he said.

Modular cells would be an alternative to high-cost prison construction. The state budget allocates \$6 million this year for temporary prison housing.







The Choices In El Salvador

El Salvador's watershed election March 28 offered the Reagan administration a glass alternately viewed as half full and half empty.

On the one hand, the communist-led guerrillas - who boycotted the voting and threatened death to those who cast ballots - were soundly repudiated. The final vote count showed that 1.4 million Salvadorans went to the polls to replace a military-backed, centrist junta with a popularly elected government.

The turnout, generally reckoned to be about 90 percent of the eligible voters, more than tripled that of most past Salvadoran elections and gave the lie to the myth that a majority of Salvadorans supported the Marxist insurgents.

Moreover, hundreds of international observers and journalists from around the world helped ensure that the voting March 28 was the fairest electoral contest in El Salvador in at least half a

All this constituted the glass half full.

The half empty glass emerged when it became apparent that 52.4 percent of the voters had cast ballots for rightist parties rather than the centerleft Christian Democrats the State Department had all but publicly endorsed. When one of the five rightist parties would agree to join a coalition led by the Christian Democrats or their standard bearer, President Jose Napoleon Duarte, the eventual formation of a right-of-center government became inevitable.

Some in Washington profess to see this as a political disaster sure to drive many Salvadorans into the arms of the guerrillas. That assessment strikes us as a wholly unwarranted rush to

Most Salvadorans seem to have voted for the right because it promised a more vigorous war against the guerrillas and because it offered plans to revive a shattered economy.

El Salvador's gross national product has declined by 20 percent since the junta seized power in October 1979. Unemployment is calculated at 30 percent and inflation is currently running at an annual rate of 17 percent. Although the war has obviously damaged the economy and sparked a flight of capital from the country, a majority of Salvadorans seemed convinced that some of the junta's economic "reforms" have only made a bad situation worse.

In that category, we would include the illadvised nationalization of banks and export trade as well as some portions of the junta's land reform program. Nationalization has turned out badly, in part because the government lacks the management skill to replace private entrepreneurs. And the agricultural cooperatives set up by the junta have failed miserably, and should be abolished in favor of parceling out individual plots to farm families.

The two largest right-wing parties, the Nationalist Republican Alliance (ARENA) and the National Conciliation Party (PCN), both appeared to have gained votes by promising to break up the agricultural cooperatives and repeal the nationalization of banks and export trade. Why should Congress or the Reagan administration object to economic policies that stress free enterprise and a more efficient land reform program?

Washington does, of course, have every right to insist on a continuation of the democratic process and respect for basic human rights as conditions for any additional U.S. military and economic aid to El Salvador.

The elections proved dramatically that Salvadorans want a chance to participate in choosing their own government after 50 years of dictatorship and military rule. As for human rights, any new government must make it clear to the army that counterinsurgency is no excuse for shooting civilians. And there must also be a continuing effort to deter the free-lance, rightwing death squads that have added to the toll of civilians murdered by all sides in El Salvador's brutal civil strife.

Ms. Hair said she has received comments on the Toughlove series from numerous people who are "glad to see that someone isn't afraid to tell it like it is and to address a problem that is very real today."

Rod Waddell, a family counselor at the Seminole County Mental Health Center in Altamonte Springs, said he, too, has received favorable comments concerning the series from colleagues and friends.

(Both Ms. Hair and Waddell were interviewed as juvenile and family problem experts in the

"The Center posted the series on the bulletin board here at the office for everyone to read and comment," Waddell said. "I was pleased with the articles and felt it showed a real problem and offered solutions."

"That's the Important thing I think," said Ms. Hair. "So many times you read about one problem or another but no one tells you what to do about it. Toughlove offers a solution."

ROBERT WAGMAN Was U.S. Duped Over

WASHINGTON (NEA) - The Argentine invasion of the Falkland Islands is still being viewed as comic opera by much of the American public and news media. But the State Department considers it one of the greatest diplomatic crises to have faced this country in recent years.

Falklands?

This perception stems from the growing belief among many Foggy Bottom professionals that U.S. actions may have led, almost directly, to the invasion. Here's why: Knowledgeable State Department sources report that the Reagan administration has for some time been engaged in high-level talks with the military governments of Argentina and Chile. The purpose was to involve those countries in what the administration euphemistically calls its "Caribbean Basin Initiative."

The talks have reportedly resulted in an Argentine pledge of direct cooperation with the United States in opposing leftist expansion in Latin America. That cooperation might even include the covert use of Argentine antiinsurgency forces in El Salvador.

The Argentines are said to have agreed to support President Reagan's efforts in the Caribbean and Central America in exchange for U.S. economic and military aid. In fact, the Reagan administration was reportedly assured that it would have no stronger ally in this hemisphere than Argentina.

According to the State Department experts, the Argentines believe that we need them so badly in Central America that we will not side with Britain, our closest European ally, on the

These experts think that the Argentines would not have embarked on their military adventure had they not been convinced of this U.S. attitude by the tone of their talks with the Reagan administration.

Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher is reportedly livid over the U.S. posture thus far in the crisis. The British think that the invasion could have been averted had Reagan been firm with Argentine President Leopoldo Galtieri during their almost hour-long phone conversation on the night before the invasion.

"The Thatcher government believes that if

we had put forth a strong statement of support for Britain in the first hours of the invasion and had condemned Argentina, at least it would have taken some of the pressure off the government in Parliament and Lord Carrington could have been saved.

The British are saying to us that 1,800 Englishmen held hostage by Argentina is exactly the same as 50-odd Americans held hostage in Iran. They firmly supported us there at considerable sacrifice, and they now expect us to return that support.

"Unless we do something quickly, this is going to shatter our relationship with Britain and really hurt our posture with our allies in

DON GRAFF El Salvador's **Political** Rubik's Cube

Democracy, given the drawbacks of all the alternatives, is unquestionably the most desirable form of government.

But it is certainly not the easiest to make function as desired.

Consider the Salvadoran election. On the face of it, with the massive turnout in defiance of immense obstacles and in the absence of any indications of serious irregularities, the vote represents a triumph of the popular will.

But the more you analyze the outcome, the more that triumph appears to have produced a political Rubik's Cube, yielding different configurations depending on who's twisting it and for what purposes.

Looking at one side, the Christian Democrats came out ahead. With the largest vote, they are certiflably El Salvador's preeminent political party.

But looked at another way, they are also the big losers, and not only in falling short of the majority necessary to dominate the projected constituent assembly that will write a constitution, select an interim president and prepare for presidential elections, probably next year.

Originally called in by the military leaders of the 1979 coup to provide a basis of popular support, the Christian Democrats were essential to the junta's reformist image. So long as they shared power in that capacity, even as junior partners, they exercised considerable leverage. They were in a position to push, against right-wing opposition, reforms considered essential to removing the long-term causes of Salvadoran

unrest. Thanks to the election, they have now lost that leverage, even if American pressure compels their continued participation in the new government. They have not been given the popular mandate that was the original idea. Instead, the anti-democratic right has been legitimatized.

As has former Maj. Roberto d'Aubuisson, a e makings of an Somoza or worse who had been on the disreputable fringe of Salvadoran politics, as the country's dominant political personality. Looked at one way, his personal power base remains modest - more than 70 percent of the electorate voted against him, or at least for other leadership. But the configuration that is important is the majority right-wing coalition that emerged from the election, of which he is in effective command whether or

All of this makes problematical at the very best continued implementation of the reforms that even President Reagan, in his postelection exultation, acknowledged Washington continues to consider essential. D'Aubuisson has been an inflammatorily outspoken opponent.

IRS Clamps Down On Tax 'Churches'

WASHINGTON - A growing number of Americans are turning to religion loday, not for redemption of their souls but for reduction in their income taxes.

Ordained on a cash-and-carry basis by obscure "religious," these born-again tax dodgers hope to evade the burden the rest of us share every April 15. By declaring themselves "churches," these quickle clergymen claim exemption from all or part of the taxes they should be paying on their wages.

Unfortunately for them, the Internal Revenue Service views this burgeoning evangelism with deep suspicion, attributing it to greed, not plety. The agency is cracking down on the delettante dominies with heavy fines and wage garnishments. In some cases, the tax dodgers could wind up practicing their ministries behind prison bars.

According to internal IRS documents, returns showing illegal tax deductions based on church-related schemes grew from 486 in 1978 to 2,784 in 1980. The heavenward trend

reportedly is steepening.

Consider the case of "Archbishop" William E. Drexler Sr. of the Life-Science Church of California, as disclosed in court records. Since 1976, he has set up about 3,000 "churches" across the country by selling handydandy packets of documents for anywhere from \$1,000 to \$4,000 a shot.

The conversion kits contained ordination certificates, cierical identity cards and vows of poverty for the new "minister" to sign as he turned over all assets and income to his instant "church."

Drexler made no secret of his hostility to the IRS. in issues of the Life-Science newsletter, The Patriot News, the church offered monetary rewards for the names, addresses and telephone numbers of IRS agents and their families. Those it was able to identify were listed under such titles as "Enemy of the Month" and "Know Your Enemy List." Life-Science members were encouraged to harasa the IRS employees by dumping manure on their lawns, placing early-morning collect calls to their home phones or sending them unwanted magazine

subscriptions. Drexler even obliged his new converts by

backdating the ordination documents to permit tax deductions for earlier years. The archbishop assured his new ministers that the IRS had given the church tax-exempt status - which it had not - and promised that the church would provide full legal services if the tax collectors hauled them into court. This also proved to be untrue, as many Life-Science ministers in New York City discovered, to their dismay. In fact, some complained to authorities that they were threatened with "excommunication" if they insisted on legal help.

Dexler was convicted last year of evading

more than \$185,000 in income taxes and of falling to file returns in years when he and his son earned a total of \$365,000. In New York City, the IRS slapped levies on the wages of 319 members of Life-Science and other churches for payment of \$484,000 in back

Another target of the irreverent IRS is Jerome Daly, archbishop, president and pope of the Basic Bible Church of America. In February, a 40-count tax-fraud indictment against Daly and nine others was withdrawn on a technicality, but the feds haven't given

Daly's operation was virtually identical to Drexler's - pay your money and become a "church." Two boilermakers in Pennsylvania wound up in tax court last year when they tried the Daly system on the IRS.

"Those guys didn't follow through with the program and follow instructions on the organizational aspect," Daly explained to my

associate Tony Capaccio. Though declining to go into details about his organization, which claims 3,000 members, Daly did disclose part of his teachings by saying, "Our mind is our church." He added: "If the pope in Rome and Cardinal Cody are exempt from taxes ... what's the difference between them and a guy carrying a lun-

Major Pot Distributing Suspects

Trio's Bond Set At Over \$10 Million

Herald Staff Writer

Bond set for three men, including an Altamonte Springs builder, arrested as suspects Wednesday in what police are calling the largest drug-smuggling operation in central Florida, totale \$18,125,000.

U.S. Magistrate Paul Dietrich in Orlando set ball for Leon Mausser, 32, of Altamonie Springs, at \$100,000. Ball for Robert Govern, 34, a Winter Park millionaire and suspected leader of the drug ring, is being held on \$10 million bond along with Chan Zielie, 30, of Edgewater, whose bond was set at \$25,000.

The three suspects were arrested along with Thomas Wilkerson, 28, of Lady Lake, following their indictments by a Jacksonville grand jury Tuesday on charges of distributing more than 700,000 pounds of marijuana from 1977-81 and netting more than \$150 million in the process. They are also charged with racketeering, drug possession and tax violations,

The grand jury also indicted Emmett Holcomb of Bradenton, Gabriel Quintero of Ocala, Julio Falcon of Mlami, Thomas Tucker, Todd Reynolds, Karen Reynolds and Steven Liberatore, all of Ohio; and Keith Gustafson and Roger Abeners, whose addresses are not known.

According to Terry Fernandez, who heads the Drug Enforcement Administration's (DEA) Orlando office, Govern is "one of the biggest marijuana brokers in the state."

Under Govern's direction, the suspected smugglers bought farms in Florida, Mississippi, Texas and Georgia to store and distribute marijuans which was reportedly purchased in south Florida, according to the indictment.

Assistant U.S. Attorney John Lawlor requested the \$10 million bond for Govern, saying he feared Govern would at-tempt to leave the country, after information was received that the suspected drug ring leader was liquidating his assets.

Govern was arrested Tuesday morning while boarding a private plane at Oriando Executive Airport, formerly Herndon Airport, Reports indicate Govern was not attempting to flee, but was taking his first flying lesson when arrested.

In a related matter, Steve Favis; a criminal investigator in the drug case for the Internal Revenue Service, testified at the bond hearing that he heard, "what sounded like a rifle shot" at about 9:30 p.m. Tuesday and found a bullet hole through the top of a camper truck parked at his south Seminole County

Officials said security precautions are being taken and Seminole County sheriff's deputies are investigating the

Agents said they received their biggest lead in the case when a barn Govern was reportedly renting near Eustis caught fire in February, 1961. Fire officials and investigators discovered 33,000 pounds of marijuana while extinguishing the blaze, agents said. Govern was not charged in the incident because he did not own the barn.

New Hope For Angina Sufferers

BOSTON (UPI) - A drug approved in January can help reduce the need for surgery among hundreds of thousands of patients suffering a form of chest pain that can precede heart attacks, a study said.

The drug, nifedipine, can ease attacks of angina, a chest pain caused by clogging of coronary arteries and resulting restriction of blood flow to the heart muscle. An estimated 2 million Americans have angina.

A study at the Johns Hopkins Medical School, published in the New England Journal of Medicine, said nifedipine added to conventional treatment was more effective than conventional therapy among patients suffering unstable angina.

Symptoms of unstable angina include pain during rest, a sudden worsening of pain in a patient whose angina was

thought to be stable, and prolonged pain. Any of the three may be a signel of impending heart attack and less often, sudden death.

The Johns Hopkins study concentrated on angina at rest. "Our study demonstrated that in addition to conventional therapy, nifedipine resulted in a decrease in the number of patients who required surgery, and for those who had to undergo surgery, there was a longer time during which patients were stabilized on medicine ... before surgery was needed," said Dr. Gary Gerstenblith, who headed the study.

"Probably between 400,000 and 600,000 patients every year with unstable angina would benefit from this treatment," he said. "This is a very safe and effective addition to our medical treatment of this serious disease."

Army Deaths Linked To Alcohol, Drugs

HEIDELBERG, West Germany (UPI) - An Army survey found almost half the deaths of U.S. troops in Europe last year were related to drug or alcohol abuse, with one out of every 10 soldiers showing traces of amphetamines or barbituates.

The report Wednesday in the U.S. Armed Forces newspaper Stars and Stripes said 78 of the 195 deaths among American soldiers in 1981 were drug or alcohol related.

Statistics from the Army's Drug Abuse Action Panel showed that heroin and cocaine use decreased, but barbiturates or "downers" were found in nearly a third of soldiers who tested positive for drug use in 1981. Amphetamines or "uppers" showed in one of every four.

Overall amphetamine or barbiturate traces were found in about 100 of every 1,000 soldiers tested by urinalysis last year,

Longer Life Through 'Methuselah Vaccine'

NEW YORK (UPI) - Scientists using hypnosis, cell manipulation and possibly a "Methuselah vaccine" are approaching the Fountain of Youth by improving the body's immunity system.

The May edition of Ladies' Home Journal said research shows animals' immunity systems can be rejuvenated with injections from younger animals and Dr. Roy Walford, an immunologist at the UCLA School of Medicine, and colleagues have identified a part of the gene that repairs cells.

"I rather confidently expect a significant advance in maxirnum life span potential to be achieved during this century," Walford said.

"One might be able to develop a vaccine to stimulate cell repair that would have a significant effect on life span perhaps even within the next decade."

The proposed "Methuselah vaccine," named for the biblical figure who lived to the age of 969, is just one method of improving the immunity system and thus lengthening the life span, the magazine said.

Dr. Howard Hall of Penn State says hypnosis can increase the number of immune cells in a person's blood by 18 percent, calling it "a matter of mind over blochemistry." Research is under way that hopefully will better utilize immune cells to detect and destroy cancer in its early stages.

Research by immunologists has shown that people age, in part, because their immune systems wear out, the Journal said. Those systems are at their peak during puberty, then things go downhill.

The Journal said immunologists such as Walford have shown that the immune response in some older animals is enhanced when they are injected either with Immune cells from younger animals or with some chemicals - hence, the search for a Methuselah vaccine.

Walford's research also has identified the part of the gene that determines how cells repair themselves. Controlling that function would result in longer lives.
