## British Queen Takes Salute 'At Big Review

### Naval Ships Of Many Nations Take Part

Abroad the U. S. S. Baltimore off Spithead, England — Queen Elizabeth II proudly took part in the Royal Review today from warships of Britain and 14 foreign navies massed in wind-whipped Portsmouth Harbor for the coronation naval review.

The Queen, dressed in a white gown trimmed with white ermine and wearing a pink hat, smiled and waved from the royal yacht Sovereign as it swept through 11 lines of gallily decorated warships.

Her sailor husband, the Duke of Edinburgh, wearing an admiral's uniform, and the royal family were at her side in the glass and oak penthouse built up forward in the royal yacht.

Thousands of sailors aboard the nearly 200 big and little warships broke into mighty cheers of "Three cheers for the Queen, hip hip hooray," as the Queen and her party passed by. At a signal from the ship's mighty battleship Vanguard, salvoes of 15 shells each were quickly dispersed by the strong breeze.

Hundreds of ships' crews walked a grueling 21 miles from the surprise, trim but tiny amid the mighty warships, passed by nine British ships carrying more than 15,000 British and visiting dignitaries followed in the royal convoy.

Along the shores, more than a million spectators waved and cheered, and one of the most spectacular naval shows in the history of maritime-proud Britain.
