President Ford To Visit

Boston's Old North Church

BOSTON (AP) — Old North Church was tidied up for an observance by President Ford today of the 200th anniversary of two lantern flashes that signaled the beginning of the war of independence. Meanwhile, a spokesman for an antibusing group said the organization planned a demonstration to thank Ford for reservations he expressed last fall about court-ordered busing to integrate Boston schools. The imposing brick church was used as a signal post on April 18, 1775, to alert Paul Revere that British soldiers were crossing the Charles River for a march on Concord. The President is to give a 20-minute speech and help light two lanterns that would be carried up into the church's white wooden spire during the traditional ceremony.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The presidential panel on CIA domestic activities is investigating whether the agency withheld information from the Warren Commission to cover up CIA involvement in an alleged plot to kill Cuban Premier Fidel Castro, informed sources said. David W. Belin, staff director of the CIA panel headed by Vice President Nelson A. Rockefeller, has demanded in letters to the agency that it reveal all its contacts with would-be Castro assassins, the sources said.

Severity Of White Collar Crime Rising an official analysis of the corporate crimes, consumer frauds and says the federal government has refused to recognize the severity official corruption that are devastating this country's economy

of white-collar crime in the United States despite massive and bringing its political institutions to the brink of ruin." None of the government agencies which regularly tabulate This failure has resulted in "a paucity of information" and crime statistics, such as the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the "distortion of the true nature of crime in America," says the Census Bureau and others, keep track of white-collar crime on a report by Public Citizen, a group connected with consumer adnationwide basis. Justice Department officials would not comment on the report by Public Citizen.

However, the Justice Department is presently organizing a new task force to deal with white-collar crime, which a senior FBI and U.S. attorneys, is increasing "at a staggering rate."



Court Reform Long Overdue

The release of nationwide crime statistics for 1974 confirms what many Americans probably have already sensed — that crimes of violence and theft are approaching a runaway level in our society. The 17 per cent increase in serious crime within one year should sound an alarm in every community including Sanford. The safety that most citizens could once take for granted in their homes and neighborhoods is disappearing.
Attorney General Edward H. Levi ascribes the

galloping crime rate to "dismal and tragic failure" of our criminal justice system. This, too, is not news to citizens who have followed criminal cases from the police blotter through the process of prosecution and trial - if indeed the defendants are ever tried for the crime with which they were

Mr. Levi's comments are valuable if they awaken the public to the fact that the solution to the problem menacing their lives and property goes beyond supporting their local police. Indeed, it is difficult to fault the police in many cities for the quality of law enforcement they provide, nor to fault the public for not providing their police departments with the resources they need. It is not so much the inability of police to catch criminals that is creating our crime problem but the inability of our judicial and penal systems to deal effectively with the volume of criminals that come before

Mr. Levi points out that in many cities only a sman percentage of persons arrested for a felony are convicted for that offense. Plea bargaining more often than not reduces the charge. Appeals delay the imposition of sentences. Offenders melt back into the population under probation or parole programs. The relationship between the gravity of a crime and the gravity of punishment is lost, and with it the value of the law as a deterrent.

Congress last year passed a "Speedy Trial Act" which will require that no more than 100 days elapse between the arrest and trial of a person charged with a federal offense. That rule could be a starting point for judicial reform, provided there are enough judges and enough court rooms and provided our ponderous judicial machinery can be made to work at that pace. There is surely a lesson to be learned from England, where the arrest, trial and appeals process is generally completed within a few months and where the crime rate is small in comparison with ours.

Most of the crimes in the FBI statistical reports are not federal offenses, however. It is the bility of both the federal and state udiciary systems to see that criminal laws are applied in a way that emphasizes that there is a direct and certain relationship between crime and

The "dismal and tragic failure" of our criminal justice machinery is chargeable not just to prosecutors, judges and penal officials who determine the fate of offenders, but to the legislators who must provide them with the resources to make justice swift as well as sure.

The loaded shopping carts leaving grocery markets are usually taken as a symbol of the weight problem that besets so many Americans, but an environmental expert points out they are also part of our pollution problem. Americans are eating only about 2.3 per cent more in pounds of food than they did a decade ago, says a federal official, but their grocery bags weigh 33 per cent more because of the new packaging required for

The excess baggage eventually goes from the kitchen to the garbage pail or trash bin, where it represents a waste of resources and a disposal problem. It also represents a reason for the rise in the cost of food. We've been asking the notorious 'middleman" between the farmer and the grocer for an explanation. Maybe we should have asked the garbage man.

WASHINGTON - (NEA) - A half century ago a committee of distinguished jurists issued a "Report Upon the Illegal Practices of the U.S. Justice Department" which included a thumping rebuke of the practice of hiring agent provocateurs. Unfortunately, it received scant attention. Had proper limitations been applied then to America's spy establishment, throwing bombs at the public might not be a method the

Of all the snoop shenanigans to have surfaced in past months none causes greater dismay than the FBI policy of assigning agents to provoke public disorder and break the law. It is a matter of no great moment if a spy is planted within a suspect organization, as the Presidential Commission on Campus Unrest has pointed out, but the morality of the plant "becomes deeply troubling when he begins hurling rocks."

Actually, even rock hurling alone might raise little public anger. But some FBI agents, from the \$20,000 a year men to others merely hired off the streets, have in recent times plotted to firebomb college military units, run guns for violence-prone political organizations, and blow up oil wells in the South. Says one ex-FBI troublemaker: "I have no proof, but I've heard from time to time that the bureau has even considered killing certain people in order to provoke certain other people. From my experience with them, I don't doubt it."

The latter's experience with the FBI is apparently extensive. He declines identification. "for my own protection," but says he was hired by the FBI to infiltrate antiwar groups, the idea being to bring about their legal vulnerability.
