

WASHINGTON (AP) - There is a room in the White House complex now that looks like a bookie joint. Or maybe one of those potboiler operations where telephone pitchmen sell stock in the Brooklyn

It is the heart of Dial-a-President, or "Ask President Carter" as it's called, the two-hour period Saturday afternoon when you can get on the telephone and talk with Jimmy Carter about whatever bugs you. Banks of telephones are at one end of the room, complicated electronics equipment at the other. And in the center, like Zeus, sits Emerson Stone, his finger on the wipe-

President Carter and Walter Cronkite, the two voices on the White House end of the radio talk show, will not be in the Executive Office Building. They will be in the Oval Office, seated before microphones and a television set that flashes the caller's name and its pronun-

Cronkite's major role will be to say "The toll-free number to call is 900-242-1611." (Yes, it's a 900 area code - the first). He will also act as the talk show host, gently easing off the verbose and redundant and keeping things moving. He can ask followWhen the show goes on the air at 2 p.m. EST, his finger will be poised over a sil-

Stone is a CBS Radio News vice president cast in a role performed by callin talk show hosts on late-night radio all over the country.

There'll be a 61/2 second delay before the conversation goes on the air. If your radio is on while you talk to Carter you'll hear yourself 61/2 seconds late, causing no end of confusion. If Stone strikes his destruct button, a tape will announce a brief in-

President Carter and Cronkite won't be spared any obscenity or abusive language. That nicety is for those listening to all 265 stations on the CBS network, some other stations where there is no CBS outlet, some public broadcasting stations and the Voice

Nationwide Activities Checked

'Sky King' Probed For Financial Fraud

The nationwide financial dealings of Kirby and Carolyn Grant and the Sky King Youth Ranches of America Inc., have been under investigation for several weeks, The Evening Herald has learned from a source within the Seminole County office of State Attorney Douglas Cheshire.

The probe by the state attorney's office is directed at the possibility of ranch funds being "funnelled" through personal checking accounts, and the possible misappropriation of ranch funds, according to the source, who asked not to be identified. Additional investigative efforts may be directed at fundraising activities throughout the nation by the Grants and the organization. At least another month of investigation probably

will be required before any charges could be con-

sidered, he said. "I can only tell you what I don't know," said Tom Thompson, the new executive director of the ranch. When we talked to Mo (Maurice) Shams, attorney for the ranch, he said they - the state attorney's office - were embarrassed because they hadn't been able to find anything. I asked what the in-

As early as Feb. 4 subpoenas had been issued for the ComBank, Longwood, banking records of the ranch itself and of Carolyn (Mrs. Kirby) Grant, the source said. Both Mrs. Grant and the ranch. maintained checking accounts at that bank, according to bank officials.

Grant has been criss-crossing the country seeking donations of funds and property. On Apr. 21, 1975, in a letter to board members, Grant stated, "There are nine states where we have been offered free land. This could only come about through trips I have made, broadcasts and word-ofmouth advertising. It is a natural culmination of events that this project shall become national."

In the same letter, Grant told the board: "For

'Sky King' series there were about 700,000 children in the 'Sky King' fan clubs across the country. These children are now young adults with families of their own. Undoubtedly, a number of them have become eminently successful in business or the professions. It is this reservoir along with many other influential friends across the country that I shall count on to help me meet the challenge that I feel I must ac-

The name "Sky King" itself has entered into th controversy surrounding Grant's Seminole County youth care facility in Chuluota for the past three

Flying Crown Enterprises Inc., a Winter Haver corporation, claims to have bought the rights to the name, as well as the actual prints of the old blackand white television series. Although Grant was a founder of Flying Crown, members of the present board of directors told the Evening Herald his connection is now minimal "if any."

An attorney for Flying Crown sent a letter to Grant warning him to "cease using the image created by the television series 'Sky King." 



Rescuers Chipping Through

Rock To Reach Trapped Miner TOWER CITY, Pa. (AP) - Rescuers, wary

of a possible cave-in in the four-foot escape passage they were carving, today tediously chipped through a 50-foot wall of coal to reach an imprisoned miner.

They hoped to free him tonight. Federal officials ordered an oil derrick-type drill flown in from Utah to further the search for seven other men, whose fate and whereabouts are unknown.

As rescuers inched sideways toward him from a nearby tunnel at the rate of one foot an hour, Ronald Adley, 37, waited a mile inside a 400-foot mountain in the heart of Pennsylvania's hard coal region north of Harrisburg.

Carter Rights Stand Hailed

,WASHINGTON (AP) - George Balanchine, the Russian-born ballet master, has endorsed President Carter's policy of speaking out in favor of human rights in the Soviet Union.

"President Carter is great if he would insist on that," Balanchine told a luncheon audience at the National Press Club Thursday. "I wouldn't send them barley or wheat unless they let everybody go who wants to go. But they won't do that ...

Westinghouse Suit Settled

PITTSBURGH (AP) - Three power companies that wanted to force Westinghouse Electric Corp. to honor a contract to supply uranium at one-fourth its current cost have settled instead for cash, equipment and advice. The difference between the contracted ice of \$9 a pound and the present price of about \$40 a pound would have cost Westinghouse an estimated \$2 billion over the next 20 years. Westinghouse still faces suits from 24 utilities in Virginia and Sweden. Those cases have not yet been heard.

Rebates By June--Maybe

WASHINGTON (AP) - Even though the path is clear for Congress to approve a \$17.5 billion plan to stimulate the economy, don't spend your \$50 rebate yet. Congress has not yet decided whether to include rebates in the stimulus plan, and if it does, it probably will be the end of June before most rebates are in the hands of taxpayers.

Mexican Troops Restore Order After Clashes

OAXACA, Mexico (AP) - Some 1,500 federal troops have restored order in the southern Mexican state of Oaxaca after 10 days of clashes between police and groups of students, landless Indians and other local residents demanding land reform and radical changes in the state government. At least 16 persons were killed in the fighting. The state governor opposed by the students took a leave of absence Thursday and was replaced by an army general.

Paper: Oil Shortage Looms

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) - The world could face oil starvation unless Western countries reduce consumption and Arab countries find new reserves, says a Saudi Arabian newspaper. The Saudi Gazette cited reports by the Organization of Arab Petroleum Exporting Countries and the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, which is domi-nated by industrialized nations. The Arab group's report warned that production is dangerouly outpacing exploration for new oil reserves in the Middle East.

Prince Charles On Safari

LONDON (AP) - Prince Charles leaves today for a safari in Kenya and visits to Ghana and the Ivory Coast. The 29-year-old heir to the British throne is scheduled to arrive in Nairobi Sunday after stops in Naples, Cyprus and Khartoum.



Talks On Cyprus Are Test For U.S.

Former defense secretary Clark Clifford's trip to Greece, Turkey and Cyprus signals a new effort by the United States to help end a smoldering threat to peace in the eastern Mediterranean.

Clifford's presence can be of only limited value in settling the central dispute - how Greek and Turkish interests can be represented satisfactorily under a new form of government on Cyprus. Talks between Archbishop Makarios, on the Greek side, and Rauf Denktash, the Turkish Cypriot leader, already are scheduled for March, with indications that some kind of federation of two semiautonomous states or zones will emerge.

The best opportunity for Clifford is to restore the credibility of the United States as an impartial outsider concerned mainly with justice for all Cypriots and with mending the weaknesses which rivalry between Greece and Turkey is creating in the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

Our position was left in a shambles after the 1974 civil war that ended with a Turkish invasion. Former Secretary of State Henry Kissinger's attempt to intervene in the crisis was interpreted in Athens as anti-Greek, and the invervention of the U.S. Congress with an embargo on arms shipments to Turkey was interpreted in Ankara as anti-Turk. The future of U.S. bases in Turkey is still up in the air, and Congress has made the full resumption of U.S. military aid to Turkey dependent on progress toward a Cyprus settlement.

Cyprus presents a lesson that should not be lost in the Carter administration, which is beginning with a commitment to greater attention to "morality" in our foreign affairs. Sorting out right from wrong in a situation as tangled as the history of Greek and Turkish rivalry over Cyprus is challenging at best, and we have seen what results when the State Department goes down one track and Congress decides to take another.

The continuing hold on Turkish aid imposed by Congress gives President Carter and Clifford something less than a free hand in dealing with Athens and Ankara. If the Makarios-Denktash negotiations are fruitful, their task will become



Auto Firms Doing Own Cleaning Up

grant the automakers a postponement of stringent new pollution standards — scheduled to go into effect on 1978 model cars - it is important to keep one thing in mind.

It is not, as some people have irresponsibly claimed, a matter of permitting the industry "to go on building dirty cars." The industry has been building progressively cleaner cars since the mid-1960s, when the first emission-control devices began to be installed, and especially since passage of the Clear Air Act in 1970.

Even if the 1978 requirements were postponed indefinitely - which they won't be - the average level of automobile-generated pollutants would continue to decline as older cars were retired to the scrapyard.

Rather, it is becoming a question of just how much we may realistically expect from automotive technology in refining the conventional internal-combustion engine, and whether we may be reaching the point where the costs of doing so begin to outweigh the benefits

The 1978 standards, if achieved, would bring us close to the level of zero emissions. This is a JOHN CUNNIFF goal devoutly to be wished, but the closer we get to it — with automobiles or anything else — the more elusive it becomes.

The first 90 per cent of the job of cleaning up any kind of pollution is relatively easy. The next five per cent is tough, but still possible. It's the last few percentage points where things begin to get sticky and where we have to start thinking about other priorities - the need to keep factories, mills and mines operating, to keep people working, the urgent need to conserve energy and natural resources.

By all means, Congress should continue to sit on the auto companies until the 1978 statutory standards are achieved, or until it is proved that we would not have come as far as we have had it not been for the law's force-feeding of quite likely will, impinge on the freedom of

pollution-control technology. Yet there is something Congress could do right now that would bring far greater and more immediate benefits for the public health: It could require that all states conduct periodic inspections of every vehicle on the road to insure that they are in compliance with the emission standards of their particular model year.

Majority Rule Can Be Misnomer

"Majority rule" has a comfortable sound to it, at least to American (and British) ears. The mind's eye pictures solemn, earnest debate in Congress or the House of Commons among men and women freely elected by their peers. A good idea for Rhodesia, too, we think to ourselves. The blacks outnumber the whites 10-to-1 and have a right to have their voices heard. One man, one

Not everyone sees it that way. The Soviet Union's view of "majority rule" is a majority of one. In this case, a Marxist client-state Rhodesia run by one or another of the potential puppets now running the guerrilla attacks. The USSR would be comfortable with another Angola or Mozambique, making it possible to control Rhodesia's natural resources and making it thus the sea lanes between two great oceans.

To the noisiest of the Rhodesian black nationalists - from those alphabet soup organizations, ZANU and ZAPU - "majority rule" seems to be synonymous with personal power, or clique power or tribal power. It is instant power they are looking for, too, and this explains their high voltage rejections of any and all conciliatory moves by the Ian Smith govern-

and, where control did occur, both chemical control and excess poundages of fish were required. In most situations, over 200 pounds of grass carp per acre were necessary to control hydrilla. Grass Carp have degraded water quality in research tests. They eat 50 per cent or more of their body weight daily. Nutrients in the form of fecal matter are redeposited in the water, causing overenrichment and algae production. Nutrient levels increased with 13 of 15 water quality indicators affected by the stocking. Important fish food organisms such as aquatic insects and crustaceans were eliminated or reduced as a result of the

Grass. Carp have had detrimental effects on sports fish. The results of a study of four ponds by the Game and Fish Commission and the Department of Natural Resources indicate a reduction of bass populations by as much as 90 per cent by number and elimination of seven species of fish. Similar research findings have recently been indicated in tests conducted in

Grass Carp are not likely to become popular as sport or food fish in Florida. The fish is extremely boney and the flesh may be tainted from feeding on obnoxious weeds. Grass Carp are rarely taken by sport fishing methods due to their feeding habits. Grass Carp research is currently underway in Lake Wales, Baldwin, Conway, Deer Point, Holden, Killarney, Clear and Bell as well as several small ponds. The Game and Fresh Water Fish Loses 6-1 Tilt Commission feels that this number is sufficient to answer questions concerning the use of Grass Carp in Florida. It is important to complete these studies before the fish is stocked and allowed to spread throughout Florida with a potential for causing

substantial damage to fresh water resources. One of the major concerns of local conservationists and politicians is that if the fish is stocked in local lakes they will possibly make their way into our main rivers.

The Question Of Plea-Bargaining

Seminole-Brevard State Atty. Douglas Cheshire has instituted a tough no-plea bargaining policy in burglary and robbery cases. He says he's thoroughly convinced that "when you make a man plead to his crimes it doesn't clog up the court dockets." But Circuit Judge Robert B. McGregor, who handles all felony criminal trials in

Seminole, says the no-plea bargaining policy

"will probably increase the trial work of the McGregor, two months into an experimental program designed to increase efficiency in handling felony criminal cases in Seminole, is already feeling the pressures of the heavy court workload. He's asked other

circuit judges sitting in Brevard County (the other half of the 18th Judicial Circuit) for some assistance.

Cheshire said he instituted the no-plea bargaining policy in burglary and robbery cases four days before state Attorney General Robert Shevin issued a memo last week urging state attorneys to end plea bargaining in nearly all armed robbery and burglary

Cheshire says he is one of five state attorneys around the state so far to support the Shevin request. Shevin asked state attorneys to limit reduced charge and sentence negotiations with people accused of armed robbery or

"I'm 100-per-cent for it," said Cheshire. "They either plead guilty as charged or go to trial." Cheshire also expressed the belief that if a defendant faces multiple burglary charges he

should plead to all counts. "Why do a burglar a favor?" he asks. Shevin is opposed to legislation on plea bargaining, according to Cheshire, but Cheshire said, "If the legislature proposes legislation on plea bargaining I'll support it."

Prosecution of burglaries has been given a

top priority by Cheshire. He says he sees a trend toward more burglaries than robberies because defendants know the penalties for burglary convictions are less than robbery. "For example, last week a member of my staff told me about some suspects who decided to "hit" two apartments instead of

robbing a store because the penalties are less

"I think the public demands this (no plea bargaining on burglaries and robberies)." said Cheshire. Burglaries are more upsetting to homeowners and citizens, he said, than many robberies because the thefts of personal property hit them personally and their

Cheshire noted that prosecutors must be careful not to "overcharge" burglary in situations that are actually larceny so as to get a plea to larceny. Grand larceny is a third-degree felony, punishable by a maximum of five years in prison and a \$5,000 fine. Burglary is

upon the type of burglary charged, auto, structure, dwelling etc. "In many cases defendants won't plead unless they have prior criminal records and know we have a strong case to go to court with," Cheshire said.

Last November, McGregor got approval from fellow judges in the circuit to handle all felony criminal matters in Seminole in an effort to improve the efficiency of the system. Prior to this past January, several circuit judges had rotated felony criminal court responsibilities and spent many hours

Observers say that for some unknown reason there seem to be more pre-trial motions and matters to be heard by the court in Seminole than in Brevard felony criminal cases. Judge McGregor, known for taking the time to go into matters thoroughly, has been working for just over two months with a schedule calling for a two-week trial period followed with a week of pre-trial hearings and a week of sentencings of cases tried or pled
