The 'Sine Danube'

Johann Strauss, the famous Austri mie in 1867, but there is some dispute as to when I was first heard by the public. Some critics say the thir-teenth of February and others insist it was on the fifteenth of February. Whichever is right, it seems fairly certain that the month of February, 1937, sees the seventieth an-niversary of the "Blue Danube" and in Vienna this entire year is being given over to the celebration of its composi-

Incredible as it may seem for anything which is as well liked today as the "Blue Danubs" and which has endured throughout so long a period as seventy years, this

particular piece of Johann Straung was not well received at its first offering. Played in a Viet more dance hall by at orchestra led by Strauss himself, the "Blue Danube" was a distinct flop and a bitter disappointment to its composer who had spent many long hours on it and who had himsel thought it good.

But as one critic wrote, "The hall was hot, there was standing room only, and one was pushed around every

which way by the elbows of inattentive listeners," and the LE VERSE FOR TODAY disappointing result led Strauss to cry out "So far as I am concerned, the devil may take this walts, but I am sorry about the theme-I thought it was pretty good." Fortunately for music lovers today, Strauss did think

the theme pretty good in spite of the inattentiveness of his audience, and that led him to try it again some time later. This time it was at the world's fair in Paris and

Strauss evidently thought that the different temperament of the French people might afford his walts a chance there travel to this state is 35 where it failed in Vienna. So he tried it and it made an instant hit.
