

RUBIO IS SHOT 2 HOURS AFTER TAKING OFFICE

Attempt To Assassinate New President Follows Traditional Custom Of Mexicans

MEXICO CITY, Feb. 6.—Pascual Ortiz Rubio, president of Mexico since yesterday noon, rests peacefully today at his home with a wound from a 38-Caliber pistol in his cheek and jaw, inflicted by an assassin just two hours after his inauguration.

His physician and his family, who were at the home when the attempt was made, believe that he would be restored sufficiently within about a week to resume the duties of his new office.

Manuel, R. H. P. (C) who turned the new president over to Rubio, in his capacity of minister of the interior, in a one-day government, a member of an invest corporation which he had formed, is the assassin.

The assassin himself was in the Mexico City military hospital, the chief of police, according to reports, yesterday.

CUBS ESTABLISH NEW RECORD FOR 1930 CONTRACTS

Every Man On Team Has Signed Up Without Holdout Threat

CHICAGO, Feb. 5.—(AP)—William Wrigley's temperamental Cubs, victims of a few undetected records in their recent World Series, sketched with the Athletics, have established somewhat of a different record in signing their 1930 contracts.

Instead of having owner Wrigley, President William Veech and Manager Joe McCarthy several financial and managerial head-aches by becoming high-priced incumbents, the Cubs in their new season have signed their 1930 contracts without a holdout threat.

Even Hank Williams, who last year after playing the holdout role admitted to spending more money than the team, signed his contract without a holdout threat.

Although Veech refuses to give out salaries or public knowledge, it is known the big reason for the lack of holdouts among the Cubs is due to substantial increases in pay for the more important members of the National League championship staff. Wrigley is believed to have received a contract of \$1,200,000, a good increase over 1929, while Chief Executive and P. J. Mahoney, one of the pitching staff, also will draw a large pay envelope.

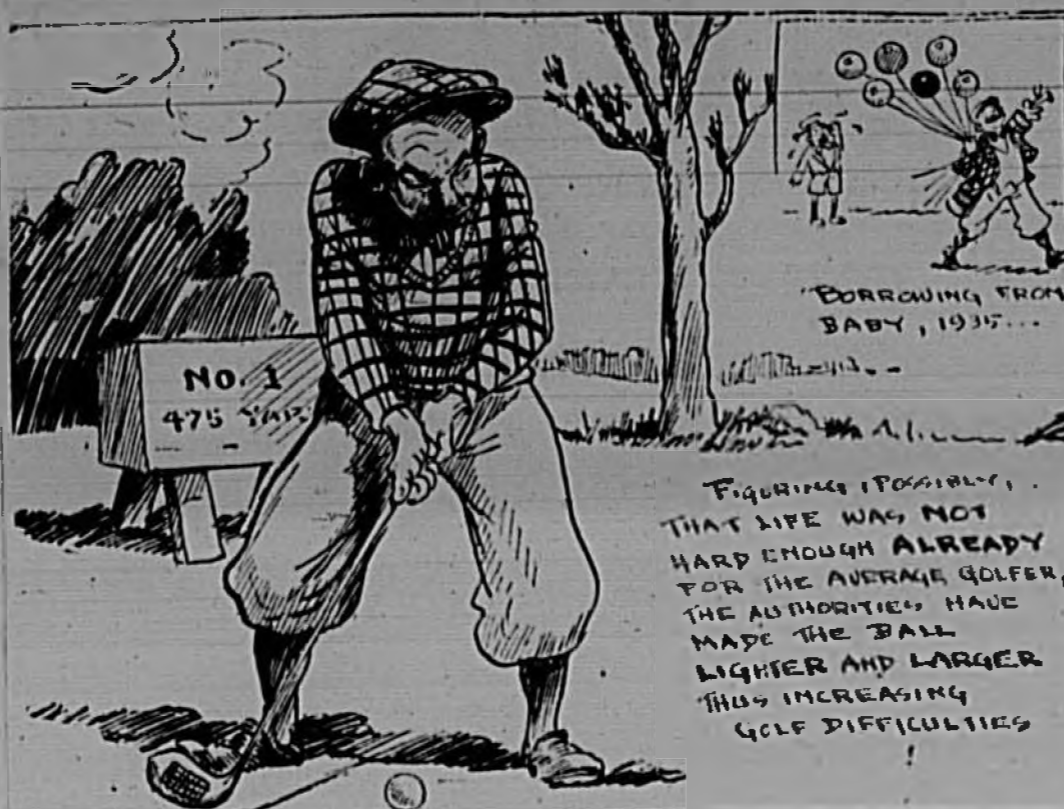
