

WINTER HAVEN (Special)-"A huge display and demonstra-tions of the latest equipment used in cutting down handling costs of fresh farm products, to be held in connection with the annual meet-ing of the National Association of Produce Market Managers, April

Carolina, should prove a major attraction and of great interest to matket managers averywhere," states William L. Wilson, Director of Ficrida State Markets.

"These demonstrations will take place on the new, modern State Market at Columbia and will include, in addition to the newest in rail refrigerator cars, refrigerator trailer trucks and street cleaning equipment, demonstrations of all types of machines, including load-ing and unloading. Wilson, who is planning to attend this important convention next month urges mar-ket maagers, wherever possible to attend.

"The Florida State Markets con-

"The Florida State Markets con-tinue to do a brisk business, and volume of produce the past week showed a marked increase over the week bafore; quality of most commodities showed improvement; noticeably strawberries. Beans increased about 15% on the Pompano State Market; but peppers declined about the same extent. Cakes brought up to \$17 per bushel and certain varieties of squash sold above the \$10 figure. Prices fluctured from day to day. Prices fluctuated from day to day, but on the whole remained at satisfactory levels. The Pompano Market continues with a good volume of vogetables each week, and the future outlook is for continued moderate shipment through this month.


Spring cucumbers in light supply sold on the Waichula Market from \$9.50 to \$10.75 per field crate, but mostly in the \$13 to \$16 bracket. The supply is expected to

bracket. The supply is expected to increase weekly. "Cucumbers of fair to good qua-ity moved on the Fort Pierce Market, and will continue to in-crease daily with tomatoes start-ing in fair volume. "In the Immokalee area crops are responding to better weather, and increasing volume of cukes is expected this week. Tomatoes, however, are on the decline. 1,518 packages of all commodities sold the past week for \$8,172.80. In the past week for \$8,172.80. In addition to cukes and tomatoes there were squash, pepper and eggplant.

eggplant. "The Fort Myers Market re-ports an increase in peppers and eggplant. 12,048 bushels of both commodities were sold as com-pared to 8,413 bushels the week before. Fancy eggplant brought \$2 to \$2.50 per bushel; choice \$1.25. Fancy peppers sold for \$3 to \$4 per bushel. Cukes brought from \$11 to \$12.50 per bushel. "411 crates of strowberlies moved over the Starke Boate Mar-ket. Highest price paid was \$9.18 per crate, lowest \$5, with weekly average of \$7.11 per crate. With continued favorable weather con-ditions, strawberlies at this mar-

They know that all they will find on the ballot is a series of unfamiliar names. They end by taking the recommendation of the party leaders, which is another way of saying that they abdicate any responsibility of their own.

A proposal for a constitutional amendment, pending in the New York legislature, has a glimmer of recognition of this fact. It would abolish elections to fill vacancies in the offices of controller and atterney general, empowering the the generator to node an appointment for the balance of any unexpired term:

Why not let the governor appoint for the full term, in-stead of electing? No one dreams of having the voters choose the president's cabinet. It is just as nonsensical to take this task away from the governor.

The reason that so many minor offices are elective is that politicians prefer it that way. It helps to obscure issues and discourage any voter who is not a creature of the machine.

### Cats Of Ancient Egypt

The mummies of cats might impress most people as emphatically not worth collecting. It makes a difference, however, which cats. When they come from ancient Egypt, and throw light on the origin of the cat, there is special interest in them.

The British Museum in London is cat-conscious at the moment. So vast are its collections in all fields that a collection of 192 mummies of cats, given 45 years ago by Sir W. M. Flinders Petrie, a famous archaeologist of Egypt, was lost in the maze of boxes and has only now been found. Their importance is due to the fact that innumerable such mummies had been thrown away, so that cat mummies are now among the scarcest of ancient relics.

Egyptian cats were not the same as the pussies of today, They are much larger, and resemble somewhat the caffer, a species of wild cat found in North Africa. Many, however, seem to constitute an entirely new species. They were domesticated, and worshipped. Evidently they must have possessed the dignity and inscrutability of the house cat of today.

The British Museum's pleasure in recovering these rare specimens will probably start other museums to hunting through their store-rooms.
