



 MEEKER, Okla., Jan. 31.—(AP)—It didn't just start with Carl, the baseball pitcher of the New York Giants. All the Hubbells are left handed.

At the Hubbell farm near Meeker where Carl is rounding into shape for the coming National League season and Brother Merritt is getting ready to pitch for the Tulsa Oilers of the Texas League, Carl grinned as his father explained: "The Hubbells just can't help it. They were born that way."

The father, G. O. Hubbell, incidentally, was Carl's first backstopper, a catcher back in the days when they took them with their bare hands—and I had it. The father held aloft his gnarled finger,

jammed and broken by baseball back before the turn of the century, and chuckled over his catching days.

And G. O. Hubbell, like his son, Carl and Merritt, is a southpaw, something unusual among catchers. "My only sister," he added, "is left-handed, too."

Carl, who has been getting in condition for the coming season by shooting first from baseball, snatched away at a pocketful of paper-shelfed pecans taken from his own orchard, and blushed becomingly as his father explained: "Carl's in good shape. I've had him clearing out trees back in the timber. I think it's better for him than golf, and he doesn't play very good golf anyway."

Farm Debt Leaders Attend Important Meet At Capital

A plan that special efforts be made at this time to save from foreclosure Florida farms and other property affected by the recent freeze has been made by Governor Deen Shultz, according to Frank T. Kellenger of Daytona Beach, spokesman for the Florida Farm Debt Adjustment Commission in 33 counties on the East Coast who called on local members of the organization in Sanford today.

The plan was framed during a meeting of leaders in farm debt relief work held Monday and Tuesday in the office of the Florida body in Tallahassee, which Mr. Kellenger addressed as representative of the federal land banks in refinancing farm debts were explained by Henry Johnson, a member of the similar loan committee of the Columbia, S. C., land bank at this conference.

Views on the general farm credit situation were offered by Dr. G. W. Fisher, noted economist of Raleigh, N. C., who is admitted to being head of the department of agriculture in the North Carolina State College and a member of his state's loan commission, is serving as executive secretary of the North Carolina Farm Debt Adjustment Council.

EXPERT INSISTS NOTES NOT JOB OF HAUPTMANN

 man's aid defense.

Just before the celebrated murder trial reached the end of its twenty-second dramatic day, the carpenter's counsel won the right to put the first handwriting expert on the witness stand to attack the state's identification of Hauptmann as the ransom writer.

For a half hour, prosecutor had fought to keep the expert from the stand.

Two new alibi witnesses, a Hamilton County Committee; L. A. Brunley, Sanford, member Seminole County Committee; B. F. Wheeler, Ocala, member Seminole County Committee.

Woman Banker and a Harlem Restaurant Owner, Battled the accused man's story of what he did on the night the golden-haired lady was stolen and slain.

Hauptmann's tale of that wild first night of March, 1932, was that:

That he was in the Bronx, 65 miles from the lonely Hopewell home of Col. and Mrs. Charles A. Lindbergh; that he called for his wife at the bakery where she worked; took the baker's dog for a walk and then went home with Mrs. Hauptmann.

The state, led by dark and fiery Attorney General David T. Walton, ripped into each story separately.

Much of William's fire was directed at the credibility and record of Lou Harding, young law-lover in a tattered lumber-jacket, who swore that two men in a station wagon, loaded with a ladder, asked him directions to the Lindbergh estate

on the afternoon of the kidnaping.

Neither of the men was Hauptmann and the ladder appeared to be "one of them slide ladders" like the one used in the kidnaping, said Harding, who was working on a Princeton graduate at the time.

With Harding and the other witnesses out of the way, the defense called John M. Trembley of East St. Louis to contradict eight expert state witnesses who swore that Hauptmann wrote every one of the 14 ransom notes and thus perpetrated a grisly, \$50,000 hoax.
