Hitler Tells His Plans.

Hitler's speech announcing the start of a gigantic U-boat campaign against British hipping disrepards were represented in military strategy. It has always been axiomatic that secrecy and surprise are among the most important factors contributing to the success of military campaigns, either 'at see or un land, and for the head of a government to tell his opponent the axact nature of the impending strack and also the very date of its beginning is something unique in the annals of war.

But, perhaps Hitler, realizing time his plans were probably known anyway, decided to call his snots in advance for the effect on German and Italian morale and also as a means of establishing himself as a prophet. Or to make them believe an invasion try is out of the picture resulting in a relaxation of vigil along their coast.

Or, maybe, the Nazi leader is trying to constitue anyway in the face of prospects that every ship nearing england would have to run a gauntlet of German submarines. And he might believe that it would have a sobering effect on agitation for convoying of United States ships across the Atlantic.
