## NOMINATION COUPON




The above map has been prepared to show the present sewerage system of Sanford and the one proposed. The dotted lines represent the ormer and straight lines the latter.

Sanford has at present 12 miles of sewers costing in excess of $\$ 120,000$ and were financed principally by the bond issues of $1922-23$. The proposed system will give the city an additional fifteen miles of sewers and will cost $\$ 165,000$. When completed every section of the city will be erved including the colored sections which at present are truly a menace to the health of the city.

Progressive citizens are again urged to support this issue as they have done previous issues, voling favorahivy for the other provisions of qual importance, which are $\$ 100,000$ for the paving in front of city property, school property, public parks and tine opening un of new streets nade necessary by the rapid increase of population and new construction, $\$ 50,000$ for a new jail, and $\$ 10,000$ for a municipal cemetery that will be maintained in a manner satisfactory to all.

The issue has been endorsed by the Chamber of Commerce and a great many of the city's progressive citizen:. Its successful passage will again record that Sanford is determined to retain the enviable prestige it has of being one of the most progresive cities in this section of Florida, proving that as a city its motto has been and always will be
