

President: We Cannot Interfere

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Despite tough talk on both sides, President Carter says he has not "embarked on a vendetts" against the Soviet Union over human rights and plans no further reprisals for the time being.

But during a prime-time televised and broadcast news conference Thursday, Carter defended the cutoff of a Sperry-Rand Univac computer to the Soviet news agency.

the time being," Carter said. "We have expressed our displeasure in a very moderate way," he mid "I have not embarked on a vendetia against the Soviet Union. We cannot interfere in their internal affairs."

Despite his moves to cut off computer sales and closely scratinize further transmission of oil-search technology to the Kremlin, Carter stressed several times that the United States would "like to have better relations with the

But at the same time he repeated: "We have a deep commitment to the enhancement of human rights, not only here, but around the world." Carter said the Soviet Union had signed the 1974 Helsinki Agreement, yet now is punishing and jailing dissidents who menter compliance with the accord.

But he said again that the crackdown on freedom will not stand in the way of his quest for a new strategic arms agreement between the two nuclear superpowers. And he expressed the hope that American athletes would not withdraw from the 1986 Olympics in Moscow as another retalistory move.

The president told reporters a controversial commen by U.N. Ambassador Andrew Young that "bundreds. p:rhaps even thousands" of political prisoners are in American jails was "sufortunate ... and embarrassing to

Is Interfering MOSCOW (UPI) — President Leonid Brezhnev, in his first known public statement on the controversy over the trials of Soviet dissidents, called the West "hypocritical" for defending Anatoly Shcharansky and Alexander

> Brezhnev's remarks were included Thursday in an official Tass news agency summary of a meeting he had with Czechoslovakian President Gustav Husak in the Crimea, where the Soviet leader is vacationing. It was the first time an official Soviet publication has referred to Breshnev in reaction to the Western outcry over the trials of Shcharansky and Gineburg.

Shcharansky, a 30-year-old computer scientist, was convicted of treason last week in connection with his dissident activities and contacts with Western reporters. He was sentenced to 13 years in prison - the first three in close confinement followed by 10 years at a hard labor

camp.

Ginzburg, 41, a radio repair man and human rights

Ginzburg, 41, a radio repair man and human rights activist, was convicted of anti-Soviet agitation and propaganda and sentenced to eight years in a labor camp. The Western reaction, from President Carter on down, was harsh and clear. The Soviet Union response was mild in comparison.

"It was noted during the conversation (between Brezhnev and Husak) that attempts by certain imperialist circles to pose as champions of human rights and freedoms are hypocritical from beginning to end," Tass

Bingo OK, Court Rules

TALLAHASSEE (UPI) - Florids's bingo law is constitutional, the State Supreme Court ruled Thursday. The law permits non-profit and veteran's organizations to conduct bingo games only to raise money for charity, school, civic or religious works or for the pure enjoyment of members. Agreeing with Dade Circuit Judge Paul Baker, the court said the statute does not exceed the police powers of the state. The Legislature cannot legalize any gambling device that would amount to a lettery, which is outlawed by the constitution, the

court added, but it can regulate or probibit any and all other

Sheltered Homes: Seminole Shortage?

"It's bound to," responded Weinberg. "After all, she's had kids out there from outside her own family for 67 straight days. That's part of our problem in Seminole County with the sheltered home program, we don't have enough."

As Weinberg and the caseworker were discussing the one child in a sheltered home, another HRS caseworker was clearing the way for children to be removed from the care of their parents in Seminole County and placed in a shelter home in Orange County.

Normally those children would have been placed in a Seminole

homes in Seminole County are full.
"We have the budget for two more," Weinb shelter home program, "and we need them here badly."

HRS needs shelter homes so hadly in Seminole County, according to Weinberg, that he is issuing an appeal for those interested in becoming part of the program to contact him at 321-

"We had put more kids in a shelter home in Orange County last week," he noted. "That is an inconvenience to the kids and their

"The thing that bothers me is that I think it's beginning to wear parents. I want Seminole County kids placed in Seminole County

The shelter home shortage is all the more important, believes Weinberg, because it is part of an overall shortage of facilities for displaced children in Seminole County.

"I know I could place 49 children in Brevard County, because they have shelter homes, a center for kids and other facilities," said Weinberg. "All we have are the shelter homes." "Most of the children in the program are young," said Wein-

berg. "It is unusual to have a 17-year-old in a shelter house." These are not bad kids, they are hurt kids in many ways and they need a place to live," commented Weinberg. Each shelter home is acrossed carefully by HRS officials and

must be licensed by the state. A complete medical and social history is made of the family wanting to operate a shelter home before being certified.

"One excluding factor is the use of corporal punishment," said Weinberg, "because many of these kids come from homes where

they have been beaten." The ideal shelter house would have room for from three to seven children, if necessary. The parents in the home would be a stable,
