

WASHINGTON (AP) - Recent intelligence reports indicate Communist troops have been ordered to prepare phony graves to lure into ambush unarmed U.S. teams searching for remains of American servicemen missing These reports say the Communists believe the U.S.

teams are really trying to spy on them and that the hunt for missing Americans is only a cover, All searches have been halted since Dec. 15 when a U.S. Army captain was killed and other Americans were wounded in a rocket grenade attack on a search helicopter

Lt. Gen. Daniel James, a Pentagon spokesman, said earlier this week that the hand is temporary while U.S. officials try to get "assurance from the other side for the safety of our people who participate in these searches."

Escaping the gray, wet weather at the Western White House in San Clemente, Nixon traveled Wednesday to the heavily guarded estate of publishing millionaire Walter H. Annenberg, U.S. ambassador to Great Pritain.

Nixon was accompanied on the 85-mile limousine ride by his wife. Pat; daughter, Tricia Cox; and his Florida neighbor, C.G. "Bebe" Rebozo.

Mushrooms Recalled

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Food and Drug Adninistration has ordered withdrawn from the market several brands of 16-ounce size canned mushrooms it says could be tainted with lethal botulinum toxin. The toxin can cause deadly botulism poisoning if vic-

tims are not treated promptly. The recall, announced Wednesday, includes mushrooms packed before May 10, 1972, under the Colonial Farms or Star Chef brands, both produced by the Oxford Corp. of Oxford, Pa.

The FDA said also being recalled are mushrooms processed by Oxford for 18 private labels. However, it said most of the suspect cans were marketed under the Colonial Farms and Star Chef brands.



Sanford Proposes Land Use, Zone Act

Sanford city commissioners have instructed City Atty. Vernon Mize to draft special legislation that would force Seminole County to update its land use plan, keep it current and participate with cities in coordinating fringe area land use and zoning. Commissioners took the action after City Manager Warren

Knowles reported legislation proposed by the county would "require the cities to comply with something that's obsolete." He said county commission has proposed legislation that would make the cities comply with the county land use plan. "The county land use plan is obsolete and needs updating." Knowles said. "It was drawn in 1968 and they've been working on a

revision for two years." "It would be wrong to require any agency to meet their land use plan until it is reviewed and brought current," Knowles said. Sanford has repeatedly tried to get the county to participate in coordinated land use planning and zoning in fringe areas of the city and to update county data to bring the county plan "into realism with what is there today," he told commissioners.

Knowles produced records since March of city efforts to get county cooperation on the problem and letters to county officials. The legislation Mize was instructed to draw up would also require the county to review its land use plan "at least every live years" after it is updated. The county-city coordination of land use and zoning in the municipal fringe areas would apply to a

No Left Turns

City Commissioners approved zoning and planning commission recommendations that the city implement no left turns exiting from private property on the east and west sides of U.S. 17-92 from 27th Street south to Lake Mary Boulevard. In this area there are two shopping centers, a bank, motel and several restaurants and auto dealerships

Commission also approved the Z-P recommendation that the city request the state Department of Transportation consider changing U.S 17-92, from 27th Street to Lake Mary Boulevard, from a "rural section" to an "urban section" and eliminate all on-

The section of U.S. 17-92 is now classified a "rural section" and has grassed medians in the center of the four-lane divided highway. A change to "urban section" would replace the medians with a fifth (center) lane to be used for left turns, acceleration and deceleration, officials said.

Swimming Pool Lost?

Commissioners instructed Mize to study a 1955 easement agreement with the district school board. Knowles said he believes when the city stopped maintaining and using the area at Goldsboro Elementary School in August 1970 it may have forfeited ownership of a closed city swimming pool and basketball





Stone Should Swim In Murky Miami

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP)- Expect Secretary of State Richard Stone to keep his promise to swim in the murky Miami River. He promised to do it three years ago, and he's been promising ever since.

Stone spearheaded a Miami River cleanup campaign which has made considerable progress. But the timetable for his victory splash has

In February 1971 Stone said he would take a dip in the river in two years.

On July 24, 1972, Stone commented: "I don't want to take a victory swim until the whole of that river is safe for swimming. I expect we'll reach that goal within three to six months." But in March 1973 he said he was hoping to

keep his promise some time during mid-1974. Stone flew to Miami last weekend to lead another army of 1,500 cleanup recruits who have been battling the Miami River sludge.

But the cleanup plans had to be delayed until Feb. 2-3 because a Bahamian vessel docked in Miami had been damaged by a bomb explosion. There were reports that more bombs may

have been dropped in the river and police began 24-hour patrols to protect foreign vessels against possible further bomb attacks

Stone said he curtailed the cleanup effort because he didn't want to run the risk of any of the volunteers being injured by bombs. However, the Harvard swim team backstroker



A new year inventory of the national spirit

The year-end comments of American public figures and observers were remarkable for the absence of the national self-congratulation which so often accompanies the transition to the annual "new beginning.

Few spoke with condifence about 1974, and of 1973 words like "good riddance" and "horrible" were commonly thought to be most aptly descriptive. The horrors of 1973 - highlevel scandals, stunning shortages, etc. - were run through. So, naturally, were the prospective perils of 1974. Yet, somehow, very little of this painful litany had a dirgelike quality. There is a powerful strain of resilience in the

American people, and it showed in the tone of the voices of many who were totting up the grim record of 1973. We really should not need bucking up from men like the esteemed ex-Britisher, Alistair Cooke, or the newly celebrated Canadian, Gordon Sinclair, whose recent words of praise for this country have been virtually institutionalized (in a typical mixture of good and bad, they are now being recited on a phonograph record with American martial music as background - the saving grace being that proceeds go to an unassailably good cause, the American Red

We are tremendously vigorous people, inventive, capable COPLEY NEWS SERVICE significance, The switches work The transfers seemed aimed The People's Liberation of organizing great tasks and applying our energies to them, possessed basically of warm good spirit which surges up dramatically when trouble besets human beings in large numbers both here and abroad.

Though chided for being unprepared for the world's harsh realities, twice in this century we gave our blood and treasure to save freedom for a fumbling Europe. We alone have put men on the moon, have hurtled a man-made exploratory vehicle 600 million miles to Jupiter, have put into space stillorbiting manned and unmanned capsules whose missions probing the stubborn mysteries of earth and universe, mapping and defining as never before this surprisingly uncharted globe - hold great promise of future practical human benefit.

Nevertheless, we have had incredible difficulty in funcioning with steady effectiveness as an earth-bound society of humans. Even as we rush to aid the victims of some foreign natural disaster, we must concede we have a long record of not caring well for those in our immediate midst who are ill, elderly, disadvantaged either by poverty or discrimination. We are at once a helptur people and strangely.

In the tormented aftermath of our revolution, we devised a unique constitution and form of government which truly have made democracy more workable here than anywhere in time or place. It radiated promise as an ideal for the whole world.

Still, something in our free-ranging frontier beginnings and our bitter experience as colonials made us not want to be governed very much, and bred in us too much disrespect for the political and governing process. We are a highly undisciplined people, whose reading of freedom as license reached a crescendo in 1973 but is not at all new. If other societies are even less disciplined, they can at least say they Thinned down in our riches, puzzled like others that

affluence brought new problems instead of solving all, aught in the webbed contradictions of our short but dazzling sistory, we enter 1974 in bafflement. If there is hope, it must lie in our cheerful resilience, and in finding better uses than ever for our good spirit, our vigor, and our inventiveness.

Other Thoughts

Newspapers in George Washington's time were less complete, less accurate and more biased than those in the times of Richard M. Nixon. Yet the Father of Our Country not only kept his cool but advocated that the postal service distribute newspapers free of charge.

As commander of the victorious Continental Army, Washington could do no wrong in the public eye or in the newspapers after Yorktown.
As President, the situation was different.
Mindful of French aid in the Revolution, the masses generally and many newspapers were pro-French in the renewed struggle between France and Britain. They accused President Washington of wanting to be a King and to adopt all the trappings of the British monarchy so recently defeated. This was a falsehood, even though people like Thomas Jefferson suspected it was true of Washington's friends.

President Washington also caught flak from newspapers supporting the democratic societies, an outgrowth of those supporting the Whisky Rebellion in Pennsylvania. James T. Flexner writes in his biography: Probably no man in American history suffered more from newspaper libels, from a reviving of old lies and the concoction of new ones with a wild irresponsibility that American mores would not possibly accept today.

A construction permit for the Altamonte Springs' 7.5 million gallon daily capacity regional power sewer plant has been issued by the State Department of Pollution Control. The interceptor system is planned to join with a Longwood interception on SR 434 at Montgomery Road to hook the neigh-90' and city and Altamonte serings together imp the sewer plant. City Atty. Joe Davis was han acted to prepare agreements for. easements which Davis "assumes the city can acquire by negotiation." The city's consulting engineering firm will supply Davis with easement legal descriptions.

Q. I want to know if our property must go through probate. My husband died in 1972. We had 56 years of happiness together. Everything we owned is in our joint names: 360 acres of land, our home, two water windmills, barns, bank accounts and farm equipment. We have two children, both of whom are

A. The law in New Mexico, your state, recognizes joint enancy as a valid method of owning real property (N.M.Stat. 70-1-34.1). It recognizes tenancy by the entirety as valid for personal property when held by husband and wife (N.M.Stat. 31-16-5) two persons payable to either or survivor (N.M.Stat. 48-10-3). If the title papers to this property convincingly show ended by your husband, the law says probate court administration is not needed,

and your lawyer and the court will say so. Before you can sell your real property to a buyer, you will be required to have your husband's death certificate er's office. If the deed is in your names as joint tenants with survivorship, he will receive the certificate and that will make you the sole owner of the farm.

For any death taxes that may be due, go to the New fice. They will evaluate your

unbalanced and not responsible for what she said, and I shouldn't pay any attention to it. Who can I believe? And what should I do? IN A TRAP


DEAR IN: Get out of his life-and out of town, if necessary, and forget him. And if he calls you again, don't have any more dialog with him. He's bad news.



#### Kissinger To Visit Mideast

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger hurriedly scheduled his trip to the Mideast this weekend to head off a big Egyptian attack on Israeli forces on the Suez Canal, a Beirut newspaper close to the Syrian government reported today.

The report in Al Shark said Kissinger had planned to return to the Middle East after Jan. 16.

"But Washington received classified information that Egypt is on the brink of waging a major offensive against Israeli forces on the west bank of the Suez Canal. So Kissinger decided to come to the area Friday," the report

GUADALAJARA, Mexico (AP) - Mexican authorities say they have arrested three Communist guerrillas, including one who admitted participating in the kidnaping last October of the honorary British consul in Guadalajara. The Jalisco state attorney said Jose de simultaneous kidnaping of consul Anthony Duncan Williams, a Mexican citizen, and of Fernando Aranguren, local industrialist. Williams was released unharmed, but Aranguren was killed. The police issued arrest warrants for the lawyer and his wife.

#### Chinese Expell Staffer

NEW YORK (AP) - A member of the United States diplomatic staff in Peking is being forced to leave China because he killed a Chinese girl in an automobile accident, the American Broadcasting Corp. reported today. Steve Bell, ABC's correspondent in Hong Kong, said the diplomat is Nicholas Platt, 37, political officer of the U.S. liaison mission in the Chinese capital.

The report said Platt's car hit a young Chinese girl Nov. 25 as he was driving his visiting parents to the Great Wall. The American commandeered a truck to take the girl to a hospital, but she died.

There was no determination that Platt was at fault, the report continued, but the Chinese government informed the U.S. mission that any diplomat involved in a fatality while driving was expected to leave the country.
