Only half an hour across the the island of Cozumel in the Caribbean, 12 miles off Yuca-

tan's coast. Oval and 30 miles long, it is covered with the same flat air, except for the sparkling beaches which gird it. What makes Cozumel unique the natives say, is the sea around it. Here, they claim, are the world's clearest ocean waters-yet filled with multiolored sea life ranging from lace-like filaments of algae to giant silvery sailfish. Native divers swear underwater visibility exceeds 200 feet. This remarkable clarity often helps transform the most sedentary landlubber into an

adventurous skin-diver. At Cozumel, anyone who swims can be a skin-diver. The waters teem with kaleidoscopic schools of brilliantly. hued harmless fish, ranging from an inch to more than three feet in size, plus countless varieties of coral, anemones and other rainbow-colored sea life. For the timid, Cozumel offers shallow lagoons. The most famous is Chankanab, a 20-minute ride from the main-

hotel district. The round-trip two-hour taxi fare runs about 60 pesos (\$4.80) and can be shared by a party of six. Hotels rent snorkels and masks at a nominal fee and there usually is someone around to show how to use them. Don't be surprised if the taxi-driver strips to his swimming trunks and helps you enjoy the lagoon. The deeper coral reefs of the sea are more of a lure for the experienced Scuba diver. A team of two divers can spear up to a dozen succulent 10pound lobsters in less than an

hour or go after bigger under-water game feeding around the reefs. For those who don't swim, there are glass-bottom boat tours over the coral gardens with its fascinating sea life. Naturally, most activity at Cozumel centers around the beachfront hotels and consists of water sports.

There are land and sea tours, too, including a cruise which calls at the island's sleepy capital of San Miguel (population 3,500), where Cor-tez landed in 1519, and a hidden cove that once was a haven for pirates Mergan and Lafitte.
