Winn Dixie robbed

Sanford Police continue their investigation today into a weekend armed robbery at the Winn Dixie at 3818 Orlando Drive in Sanford, that netted a lone gunman an estimated \$23,000.

Police say an unknown male, dressed in black and wearing a ski mask, approached the store at approximately 1 a.m. Sunday morning and knocked on a closed store door. A male employee answered and was confronted by the subject who then pulled a shotgun from beneath his clothes and threatened the employee to let him in. After gaining entrance, the subject ordered the male employee to the floor of the store's cash room, then grabbed a female employee by the arm and demanded cash. After getting the money in a large bag, the subject ejected two shotgun shells in an attempt to intimidate the store employees prior to fleeing the premises.

Police have no suspects at this time and continue their investigation.

Sanford Cop Fired

Sanford police officer Jody Smith has been fired from the department as the result of an internal affairs investigation dealing with his behavior during a battery incident May 15.

Smith had been on a two-week suspension with pay following his involvement in an altercation that resulted in two charges of battery against his mother-in-law's boyfriend, at a Sanford residence.

Police reports indicate that Smith, who was off duty at the time, smelled of alcohol and appeared to be drunk. Both he and the victim received minor injuries during a scuffle.

His official termination comes as the result of what the Sanford Police Department terms a "Violation of General Orders."

Smith, 30, joined the Sanford Police Department in November of 1995.

Smith has the right to appeal his termination before a department review board. Spokesperson Detective Kris Ziegler says at present, the department has not received indication of an appeal by Smith.

Conviction hearing

TALLAHASSEE - A 10-year old murder conviction is back in court. Kostasinos Fotopoulos was convicted in October of 1989 for the murder of Kevin Ramsey at the Strickland Hills Range in Volusia County. He was also charged with the November 1989 murder of Bryan Chase. In his original trial, the jury recommended capital punishment and the judge sentenced Fotopoulos to death.

His sentence was affirmed on appeal, but now he is challenging the validity of the sentence.

The Florida Supreme Court will hear oral arguments in the case Thursday, June 10, in Tallahassee.

Longwood may reduce paving fee

LONGWOOD - Longwood City Commissioners took the first step toward providing property owners relief from a 100 percent paving assessment fee Monday evening.

By unanimous vote, the commission moved to adopt an ordinance to amend city resolution 97-899 governing assess-

Commission considers clearing up code confusion

ment rates for street paving and drainage and sewage improvements.

Since April 1997, property owners have been assessed 100 percent of the cost of such improvements. If the proposed ordi-

nance is adopted following two public hearings, the cost configuration would change to a 60-40 split, with the city picking up the tab for 60 percent of the associated costs, while abutting property

owners would pay 40 percent. The proposed ordinance also includes a provision for accompanying sewer lines. Property owners would not be assessed the cost of sewer line installation if 51 percent of affected property owners signed a petition opposing the move. The new ordinance would affect the future paving of the city's soil based streets.

"We all have a vested interest in streets

Daly hearing set for June 21

Commission to decide Daly's fate

LONGWOOD - Controversial Jim Daly of Longwood will get his day in court. The court of public opinion that is.

City commissioners Monday evening approved a resolution to hold a public hearing on a request to have Daly removed from all of Longwood's city boards. The public hearing, scheduled for June 21, is the result of a contentious flap that developed between H.G. (Butch) Bundy and Lynette

Dennis, both members of the Longwood City Charter Review Committee, prior to the adjournment of the committee's meeting on April 28. Daly allegedly made derogatory remarks about Dennis.

At a special meeting held May 24, the Longwood City Commission determined that the conduct by Daly may constitute malfeasance and be cause for suspension or removal from municipal boards pursuant to Florida Statutes, Section 112.501.

At the June 21 public hearing, scheduled to begin at 6 p.m., Daly will hear the specific facts his accusers say are sufficient for

Kids House to open in Sanford

SANFORD - A group formed to protect abused children plans to open a children's advocacy center in a donated Sanford house on July 6.

Kids House of Seminole, located on N. County Road 427 in Sanford, will enable a variety of agencies to interview and treat children in one location, saving children from being interviewed in different places.

"Our goal is to reduce the number of child abuse incidents and to improve the quality of investigations," said Lt. Bill Telkamp of the Altamonte Springs Police Department, who is President of Kids House.

The organization combines the efforts of 15 agencies, including law enforcement, prosecutors, courts, social service and mental health agencies.

"The cooperation with all the member agencies is critical," Telkamp said.

On Friday, he thanked Seminole County, the Sheriff's Office and Home Depot for their efforts to help the agency prepare to open its doors. The Seminole County Sheriff's Office was presented with a plaque made of cut-glass at the group's headquarters, which are still being renovated. Sheriff Don Estinger accepted the award for the Sheriff's Office.

The Sheriff's Office had been

Oviedo to examine traffic plan

OVIDEO - As Oviedo residents continue to say they are concerned about plans to route traffic along Division Street, near quiet neighborhoods, the city council on Monday agreed to examine the controversial traffic study again in a future work session.

City and county officials are looking to establish a

more effective road network in the northwest part of the city. The council has approved a priority list for areas to divert traffic, and \$4.9 million in funding from the county for the project will come in Oct., 2001, according to City Manager Gene Williford.

The council did not schedule a date for the work session to revisit the priority list for diverting traffic.

The road network to be constructed under the city's plans would improve the operation of the

No Smoking: FP&L to reduce smoke from Sanford Plant

DeBARY - For years, perhaps for decades, Sanford residents and others within sight of the western end of Lake Monroe, have questioned the air pollution emanating from the smoke stacks at the Florida Power & Light plant on the north side of Lake Monroe.

Now, repowering of what has become known as "the Sanford power plant" (actually in DeBary), is scheduled to get underway. The results will be an almost complete elimination of smoke from the tall towers.

FPL plans to launch into the

permitting phase of the project within the next few weeks.


"Repowering" involves replacing the 1970's power plant technology with state-of-the-art combined-cycle technology, using natural gas instead of oil. The project will use the clean natural gas to double the generating capacity of the existing facility, without requiring additional land to meet the growing electricity needs of FPL's customers.

Roxane Kennedy, plant manager, said, "Many in our community support this project, knowing that it will result in cleaner air and less visible emissions. We are committed to listening to our neighbors and working together

to make our community the best place to live, work and play".

The repowering proposal calls for expanding the power plant's current capability of providing power for about 220,000 homes and businesses to increase the number to more than 486,000 homes and businesses in the area. FPL plans to begin actual construction in February, 2000, and phase the new turbines into operation beginning in early 2002.

Combined-cycle, the operation being planned, is a type of electric generation that is said to be 40 percent more efficient than traditional methods. It includes a series of turbines that produce







his suspension, and have the opportunity to be heard concerning a charge of malfeasance.

If a letter read at Monday's public hearing section of the Longwood commission meeting by Jo Anne Rebello is an indication of the flavor of Daly's upcoming public hearing, seating at the June 21 hearing will be at a premium.

In the three page letter that Rebello read to commissioners, she blistered them for what she perceived as their one-sided trial, judgment, and conviction of Daly without regard to all of the facts surrounding the confrontation. Rebello contends that Dennis repeatedly baited Daly during the confrontation, that Dennis has a history of discord with the city, dating back to a period where Rebello contends Dennis tried vehemently to have former police chief Greg Manning fired, and that Dennis, a former Longwood City Commissioner, had a history of walking out on meetings, and was accused of perjury and sunshine law violations, having been convicted of the latter.

energy from two courses, to produce electricity; directly from the gas-powered unit, similar to a jet engine, and from the unit's exhaust heat, normally lost in traditional methods. The exhaust heat is used to produce steam for the steam turbines, thus creating the combined cycle.

"One advantage of combined-cycle technology is its modular design which enables us to phase in incremental amounts of

electric generation," Kennedy said. "Rather than wait to complete the overall construction, we can bring individual units on line as they're completed."

The Sanford plant is the second of four projects slated to expand FPL's generating capability by 20 percent over the next 10 years. The plant at Fort Myers will be the first to be completed. It is scheduled to begin operation under the new combined-cycle technology later this summer.

intersection of State Roads 434 and 426, and reduce traffic that is occurring due to congestion on the main roadways, according to the city's North-South Corridor.

Oviedo resident Tom O'Hanlon on Monday said residents from Mead Manor, Garden Grove, Twin Oaks, Windmeadow Farms, Oviedo Oaks, Oviedo Meadows, Whispering Woods, Shady Lane, and other subdivisions are have voiced concerns over traffic diversion. He said traffic diversion plans are a city-wide issue.

"I am telling you that this is not acceptable to the citizens of this city," O'Hanlon said.

O'Hanlon requested that the city remove Artesia Street from its paving priority list between Twin

Oaks Circle and Lake Charm Drive. He also requested the city take steps to reduce traffic for residents on East Magnolia Avenue.

Council chairman Tom Hagood said that until the city receives county funding for the road projects, revisiting the plans is not necessary.

"We can use the money however we want to," Hagood said. "We can shuffle the cards all we want, but we're not going to have the money anyway."

Councilman George Veile said the city should re-examine its plans to create a system of collector roads on the north side of the City.

Under the city's current plans, traffic could be routed down

Division Street from Mitchell Hammock Road north to SR 434 at Deleon Street. The Division Street diversion is the county's first priority under its current plans.

The proposed southern extension of Division Street, including a 10-foot wide bike path that would connect to Cross Seminole Trail, would cost an estimated \$3 million. It would provide relief to the intersection of State Roads 434 and 426.

The proposed connection on Division Street from County Road 419 to County Road 426 would cost an estimated \$1.4 million. It would serve motorists on CR 426 who turn south on Division Street.

The Division Street northern extension would cost an estimated \$760,000. It would provide relief for downtown traffic pressure.

At the March 17 city council meeting attended by more than 100 residents, nearly 40 residents spoke in opposition to the plan to route traffic down Division Street.

The city is also considering a Pine Avenue extension as a two-lane collector road from SR 426 to SR 434, with an estimated cost of \$470,000.

The extensions the city is considering would likely have a posted speed limit of 25 mph. Traffic calming measures would be included in the designs, the city's corridor study said.

Briefs

Interest on title loans capped

LONGWOOD - The Longwood City Commission has passed a resolution capping the interest rate which can be charged by title loan companies within the city, to 25 percent.

Other Central Florida cities as well as several counties, have passed similar resolutions recently, or are considering the matter.

Last month, Seminole County commissioners voted unanimously to cap the interest rate in the county to 30 percent. It would become effective by no later than July 1.

improvement," said commissioner Dan Andersen. "But its gotten to the point where if property owners want street paving, its come down to, hey, let me buy a street."

Commissioner Steve Miller at first disagreed to a change, then put the idea of a 70-30 split on the table. Following lengthy discussion, the board moved unanimously to revert back to the previous ratio of 60-40, which was in effect prior to April of 1997.

Mayor Paul Lovestrand pointed out that at times in the city's past the paving assessment was fair, at other times not.

"The city can't afford to pick up 100 percent of the costs, I favor the 60-40 split that we had

before."

Longwood will now schedule two public hearings prior to fully adopting or rejecting the proposed ordinance.

Commissioners also agreed unanimously to review and alter the city's ordinance dealing with current restrictions governing the use and placement of detached garages and utility sheds.

Using his recent troubles with adhering to current codes, commissioner Miller provided the audience with a humorous example of the conflict property owners currently have trying to

adhere to different language in the city's Land Development Code versus language in the

Land Planning Administration.

"First of all I'd like to express my thanks to the many individuals who came to personally inspect my detached garage, which is now attached," mused Miller. "Some people were kind enough to take pictures."

Joking aside, Miller illustrated his point.

"Some parts of the code tell you that you can do one thing, other parts turn right around and tell you that you can't."

Using a hypothetical example, Miller furthered his point.

"Let's say I have a lot, 50 by 100 feet. That gives me 5,000 square feet of property," he said. "Part of the code says I can have a physical dwelling on 55 percent of that

lot, which means 3,000 square feet.

"But in older sections of Longwood, like Old Town, things are different. If I have a small, 900 square foot house on that 5,000 square foot lot, I'm using only 24 percent of the property allowed. That should mean I have another 31 percent available for use, but one part of the code restricts me to using only 2 percent for a detached garage or utility shed. This situation totally takes away what it proposes to give."

Commissioner Anna Marie Dacca supported Miller's contention.

"In surrounding municipalities, particularly Altamonte

Springs, they have managed to come up with equitable zoning that has different rules for differing sections of the city," she said.

Citing the need to clear up conflicting code language, the board instructed city administrator John Drago and city attorney Richard Taylor to work with proposals from a number of consultant groups in customizing an acceptable code for the city in total.

In other action, the board:

- Moved to follow suit with Seminole County in restricting the maximum annual amount Auto Title Loan companies may charge customers, but put an even tougher restriction in a proposed resolution. Seminole

County currently has a cap of 30 percent interest, Longwood is moving in the direction of limiting that amount to 25 percent.

- Agreed to continue workshop sessions on proposed departmental budget requests for capital improvements and adding city personnel, primarily in the fire department.

- Approved three motions to amend the fiscal 1998-99 budget to reflect transfer of funds amendments to cover additional costs for the Rangeline Road Improvement Project, meet costs for unanticipated overtime for various board and committee meetings, and for the replacement of two computers within the city's Inspections Division.

"When I worked there I felt proud to give," she said. "At that time we worked for credit toward food that was donated. I gave the food I earned to an elderly neighbor and to another elderly lady next door. I also gave some to the Moose Lodge to help with baskets for the poor."

She mentioned that the Hospice Thrift and Gift Store

also has solicited her volunteer help, and she hopes that after relatives leave from a visit that she can occasionally contribute her services there.

"I go grocery shopping next door to them," she said. "I go there a lot for other items so we have gotten to know each other. They have great prices and could use the help."

Regarding all her volunteer efforts, Miller said, "It really has benefits too. You can make people happy and I just love that. The people you meet are so nice. It still bothers me to see some of the homeless people that need help, but I do all I can to help them too. I just want to help."

Miller has lived in Sanford for 29 years. She has three children, four grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.



using the site as office space for investigators. At a child abuse summit in January, Eslinger announced the Sheriff's Office would give up its perpetual lease on the site so Kids House could tend to abused children.

The Seminole County Commission agreed to donate the site and rezone the area. Acting County Manager Cindy Coto accepted the award for the county.

"They both have been key to getting us a house and getting us a lease," Debra Groseclose, house renovation coordinator, said.

Home Depot has donated \$1,000 in cash and materials to Kids House. The company's employees have also volunteered their skilled labor toward electrical work, plumbing, and dry-wall finishing. The company received a plaque on Friday.

"They've been our first real corporate sponsor," Telkamp said.

Kids House will be staffed by a Child Protection Team, made of two investigators, a medical director and administrative staff. The organization plans to add counseling and support services for victims and their families.

The facility will be used primarily for investigations. Interview

rooms will be set up with video-audio recording devices to gather evidence for use at trial.

The interview rooms will be designed to make children feel as safe as possible. There will be two-way mirrors so state attorneys and investigators can observe interviews without making their presence felt by the child. The investigators can talk to the interviewer through a wireless microphone.

"That helps reduce the trauma of an interview," Telkamp said.

The organization is seeking funding to offer medical examination rooms with medical staff.

The organization is seeking \$50,000 in county funding, and a total of \$100,000 in funding including state grants and private donations, Telkamp said.

The Altamonte Springs Police Department has donated \$2,500 to Kids House. The Lake Mary Police Department, the Guardian Ad Litem Program of Seminole County, and Seminole County Friends of Abused Children have each donated \$1,000.

Telkamp said police are continually learning more about spotting the signs of child abuse.

"When we keep getting calls to go back to a house we're looking

at all of the circumstances," Telkamp said. "We're starting to dig deeper each time we go out there."

Telkamp said people should contact the police any time they notice something suspicious that could point to child abuse.

"Don't feel that you are interfering in someone else's life," Telkamp said. "We all have a responsibility to protect children."

The organization is in need of volunteers to renovate the donated house for use as a child advocacy center. Anyone interested in volunteering is encouraged to call Groseclose at (407) 320-9988.

More bridge for your computer

By Phillip Alder

More and more computer bridge products are appearing. "Bridge Trix" by Bobby Wolff is on a CD-ROM. It requires Windows 95 or better and at least eight megabytes of RAM (though 16 Mb are recommended). You are challenged by 60 declarer-play deals, 13 of which contain videos of Wolff explaining how to find the winning line. The deals concentrate on ducking, holdup plays, and related techniques. It is aimed primarily at intermediate players, though in each deal you receive an indication of the difficulty level.

At first, you see your hand and the auction. When you click on "OK," the dummy is shown, overlaid by a précis of the problem. Then you click on the

cards you wish to play. If you make a mistake, the machine beeps at you, but permits play to continue.

In this deal, how would you proceed in three no-trump after West leads the heart king?

Three spades showed a stopper in the suit and expressed doubt about hearts for no-trump purposes.

There is a natural tendency to duck the first trick. However, against good defenders, you will promptly go two down. West will switch to the spade jack, and they can run the whole suit.

You should hope that the diamond finesse is working. So, win trick one, run the clubs (to restrict undertricks) and take that diamond finesse. Here, you end with an overtrick.

ASK DR. GOTT

Emphysema has numerous causes

DEAR DR. GOTT: Why do some people develop emphysema even though they never smoked or worked in polluted air? It doesn't seem to be the kind of disease that a person could develop without an outside cause.

DEAR READER: There is more than one kind of emphysema and more than one cause for it. Emphysema is basically a loss of the feathery air sacs in the lungs, which ordinarily provide an enormous surface area for the exchange of oxygen and carbon dioxide. As the air sacs disintegrate and coalesce, the lungs' surface area is progressively reduced; less oxygen enters the bloodstream and less carbon dioxide is exhaled. Emphysema often coexists with chronic bronchitis and asthma, conditions that trap stale air within the pulmonary system. We all breathe in pollutants from time to time, and — over the years — these compounds lead to a reduction in lung reserve. Furthermore, as we age, there is an unavoidable loss of lung elasticity and pulmonary capacity, an affliction called senile emphysema.

Everyone develops a degree of

emphysema if he or she lives long enough. The process is accelerated by genetic factors and the "outside" causes to which you allude. While we may not be able to prevent the emphysema that comes with age, we can certainly minimize its effects by avoiding air pollution and tobacco smoke.

DEAR DR. GOTT: What is the difference between gastroenteritis and dysentery?

DEAR READER: Dysentery refers to severe inflammation of the colonic lining that is caused by either one-cell microorganisms called amoebae or by specific bacteria. I don't hear the term used much nowadays, probably

because amoebic or bacillary dysentery is rare in the United States. The affliction is diagnosed by stool examinations and treated with anti-parasite drugs or with antibiotics.

In contrast, gastroenteritis is familiar to all of us; it occurs suddenly, is usually caused by viruses, and produces nausea, vomiting, diarrhea and malaise. The body may lose so much fluid so fast that dehydration becomes a problem — and intravenous feeding is required. However, for most people, recovery is rapid if patients limit their diets (water, tea, beef broth and ginger ale). Although gastroenteritis can be serious in children and the elderly, most adults are ill for only 24 to 48 hours. As a general rule, simple gastroenteritis does not require medical attention; dysentery, on the other hand, does.





Magic name Rivers as fifth head coach

ORLANDO - Glenn "Doc" Rivers, a 13-year NBA veteran as a player, was named the Orlando Magic's Head Coach, General Manager John Gabriel announced Monday afternoon.
 Per club policy, terms of the agreement were not disclosed.
 Rivers succeeds Hall of Famer Chuck Daly, who retired on May 24. Rivers becomes the fifth head coach in franchise history.
 "We're excited "Doc" has joined our family," said Gabriel. "He has demonstrated over the course of his career to be a true leader and has been preparing for this day for some time. He has a very magnetic personality and a sharp basketball mind. He is an outstanding fit for our organization."

Rivers played 13 seasons in the NBA for the Atlanta Hawks (1983-84 and 1990-91), Los Angeles Clippers (1991-92), New York Knicks (1992-93 and 1993-94) and the San Antonio Spurs (1994 and 1995-96).
 He played for three of the game's top coaches in Pat Riley, Larry Brown and Mike Fratello.
 Rivers, who has worked as a Turner Sports NBA analyst since his July 11, 1996 retirement, averaged 10.9 ppg, 5.7 apg and 3.0 rpg over the course of his career.
 His teams advanced to the playoffs 10 times, where he averaged 11.4 ppg, 5.9 apg and 3.3 rpg.
 Rivers saw action in 864 regular season games over the course of his career and 81 playoff games. He averaged a double-double in 1988-87 (12.8 ppg, 10.0 apg), was selected to play in the 1988 All-Star Game and averaged a career-best 15.2 ppg in 1990-91.
 He scored a career-high 37 points in a Feb. 4, 1988 game against Seattle.
 Rivers was selected after his junior season out of Marquette by the Atlanta Hawks in the second round (31st pick overall) of the 1983 NBA Draft.
 He played the first eight years of his career with Atlanta, setting the Hawks' single-season assists record with 823 in 1988-87. He is Atlanta's all-time leader in assists (3,868).
 Rivers played the 1991-92 season for the L.A. Clippers, before going to New York and concluding his career in San Antonio in 1995-96.
 In addition to his Turner Network duties, Rivers has served as a Spurs television analyst.
 Rivers played for the United States at the 1982 World Championship of Basketball, leading the U.S. to a silver medal and earning tournament Most Valuable Player honors after averaging a team-best 18.6 ppg.
 A product of Proviso East High School in Maywood, Ill., Rivers earned the nickname "Doc" from former Marquette coach Rick Majerus, when he wore a "Dr J" T-shirt to a summer basketball camp.
 He earned a pre-law/political science degree from Marquette in 1985 and was honored by the Pro Basketball Writers with the 1990 J. Walter Kennedy Basketball Citizenship Award.
 Rivers is the nephew of former NBA player Jim Brewer, and the cousin of former NBA player Byron Irvin and baseball player Ken Singleton. Rivers and his wife, Kris, have four children, Jeremiah (11), Callie (9), Austin (6) and Spencer (3).
