# County Official Favors SCC Management Courses

At least one county official is leaning toward Seminole Community College to teach management courses to toplevel county employes

Bob Andrew, the county's education coordinator, said SCC courses will cost about 10 times less than a similar Florida Technological University (FTU) offer that was under consideration by the county officials. If SCC instructors are chosen, the cost will be about \$10 per employe, Andrew said.

When Andrew — the director of public works — first reported on the availability of management courses, county officials leaned toward selection of the more costly TU proposal because FTU's staff is larger and it

composed of professors who have published books. But Andrew said the county staff reevaluated its position after meeting with SCC. He said it looks as if SCC will teach about 30 county employes



### President Ford Considers Reform Of Welfare Laws

DURHAM, N.H. (AP) - President Ford, saying he thinks New Hampshire Republicans will prefer his perfermance to Ronald Reagan's rhetoric, is considering a post-election overhaul of welfare laws to help the needy and "cut out ... the chiselers."

Ford was back at the White House today after a two-day hunt for votes in the nation's first presidential primary. He said he might be back before the Feb. 24 balloting. "I expect to do well in New Hampshire," Ford said, dismissing suggestions that his campaign organization is faltering where Reagan's is strong. He said he thinks the voters will base their judgment on policies - "I don't think they will make their decision on the basis of promises or rhetoric."

### **New Mail System Coming**

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Postal Service next month puts a new system to work handling mailed packages but postal officials say they still expect the service's parcel volume to continue to shrink while United Parcel Service, a private company, enlarges its share of the market. The Postal Service points to rate differences for the explanation. The service's parcel rates are 20 per cent higher than those of United Parcel Service, its chief competitor. For example, a two-pound parcel sent from Washington to New York costs 93 cents by the government's parcel post and 75 cents by United Parcel. "We projected we would hold our volume when we got the new (bulk-mail) system on line," Assistant Post master General Edgar S. Brower said in an interview. But we didn't project that 20 per cent difference in price." Brower said that "as a result of it, we expect our decline





# House Vote Shows Sanity

The overwhelming 246-124 vote by the House of Representatives which blocked its intelligence committee from publishing intelligence agencies' secrets without presidential approval was a clear voice of sanity in a Tower of Babel.

Unfortunately, the vote came after much damage has been done. Most of the contents of the Pike committee report had already been leaked to news media and Washington agencies. Nevertheless, that does not detract one whit

from the future importance of the House vote. A majority of the members now have told the intelligence committee that it has overstepped the bounds of propriety, ethics and the national in-

Mercifully, the Pike committee has disbanded largely because it could not stop its verbal hemorrhage to the media. But the majority in the House established a guideline that can assist the remaining three committees in the House which regularly monitor civilian foreign operations -

foreign relations, military and appropriations. Additionally, the House vote should give the Senate intelligence committee led by Sen. Frank Church some serious second thoughts. The Church committee has been exhibiting the same runaway - and porous - qualities as the Pike group.

Indeed, even before his committee agreed on a report, Sen. Church introduced legislation that would establish a committee solely dedicated to intelligence oversight. Its nine members would have a major voice in establishing the intelligence budget and additionally require prior notification of all foreign surveillance, propaganda, political, economic, para-military and counter insurgency activities by Americans.

The flaw in Sen. Church's proposal is summarized by the popular apothegm that a camel is a horse designed by a committee.

To avoid congressional infringement on executive prerogatives, Sen. Church stopped short of proposing that Congress have the power to veto CIA and other agencies' programs. Its authority would come from budgetary control and from its ability to publicize CIA activity that it did not approve of - even if the President opposed disclosure on the grounds that it would give secrets to our enemies. The effect that congressional disclosure of intelligence activities would have on our friends who supply us with information would in itself be devastating.

What Sen. Church really is proposing is that Congress politicize the CIA and other groups Ironically, the fear that the CIA would be thrust into politics was a genuine worry on the part of many senators during the recent nomination hearings for CIA director George Bush.

This is one of the many good reasons why the Church bill should be pigeonholed. The Senate must join the House in speaking up for responsible intelligence activities at a time when those honorably engaged in conducting them so desperately need encouraging words and deeds.

More Americans are going to school for more years than ever before, but they seem to be

One in every five adult Americans is "functionally illiterate" and unable to cope with the basic demands of life, according to the preliminary report of a five-year national survey. And the illiteracy rate among young people, aged 18 to 29, is worse than that of those aged 30

Millions of people don't understand simple things like how rent works when they get out of high school, says Dr. Norvell Northchutt of the University of Texas, who headed the team conducting the survey. "They lack the skills and knowledge to achieve even moderate success it

At the same time, there has been a decadelong drop in the scores achieved by collegebound high school seniors in such widely used tests as the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) and the American College Testing Program (ACT). Up until the mid-1960s, the trend for all testing programs was a steady increase in all subject areas. Then a decline began which has steepened in recent years and has brought the JOHN CUNNIFF level of SAT scores below that of the 1940s.

This has educators puzzled, and many of them are blaming the tests themselves, claiming they do not accurately measure true abilities. A different explanation, however, is suggested by another team of researchers. Decreasing enrollment in traditional

MANCHESTER, N.H. - Fred Harris, the chunky, jowly candidate of the common people, was holding a reception here when a genuine common person emerged from the audience to ask a question. Unfortunately, the commoner emerged at an inopportune time - that is, when Harris was too busy talking to do any listening. "Just a minute!" Harris told the questioner sharply, sarcastically, and thereafter proceeded to give the common man a very common cold

cident that there is a touch of the crudity in former Senator Harris' beer and pretzels bid for the presidency. Yet the incident does not stand alone. In his zealous solicitation of what he calls "the everyday American," Harris often equates oafishness with ordinary. He can be rude with the slow witted, ruthless with those in honest disagreement with him. To the extent then that he tries excessively to be one of them, candidate Harris' idea of the common people seems to be that they are uncivil, cantankerous, egotistic,

He of all the political contenders should know better. His campaign is structured as perhaps no other in memory to tap the spirit of the American citizen. On the stump, Harris sleeps in private homes rather than motels. At his elecdoneering stops, he sometimes acts as chairperson, meaning he helps set up the sit-downs. Then there are the multitude of young, anrelentingly common people working for him, for gratis, for long hours, for reasons they say are related to an almost evangelical belief that the nation must make better use of its limitless

reservoir of human resources. Yet for all this familiarity with the people, Harris seems unable to do anything but stereotype them, as did P.T. Barnum, in that they are important so far as they are numerous. otherwise they are rubes. At speeches he tries to get the audience to crowd the front seats, so that news photographs will not show empty spaces. In dialogue sessions with voters, he is passionate with friendly queries, curt with the others, and at all times defines dialogue as one-way communications. As to confrontation, he can be abruptly rough, once reportedly telling a critic to shut up and get out of here."

More than this, Harris can be insulting intellectually. His speeches before the common people suggest he views them as less than comprehensive. "If we take the rich off welfare," he told an audience here, "we'll have plenty of money to do what needs to be done in this country for everyone else." 
