GERMANS ARE GIVEN REPORT ON DAWES PLAN

Premier MacDonald Presiding Over Session Finally Hands Delegation Findings Conference Past Few Days

Diseased Motivation of Loeb Results In Killing of Franks Boy, Says Alienist

Noted Alienist Says Observation in Courtroom of Boys Proves to Him That Both Are Mentally Diseased

CHICAGO, Aug. 5.—Dr. William Healy of Boston, the second psychiatrist testifying for the defense at the hearing to determine the punishment of Loeb and Leopold for the kidnaping and murdering of the Franks boy, testified today that the crime was the direct result of Loeb's diseased motivation and that observation of the youths in the courtroom, confirmed his opinion that they are mentally diseased.

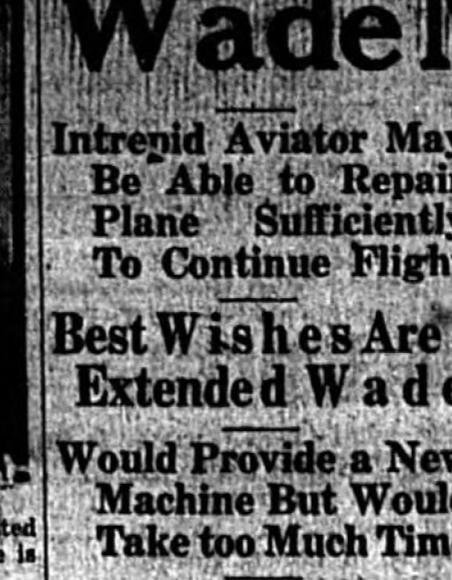
Party of 56 New Yorkers is to be Here Tomorrow

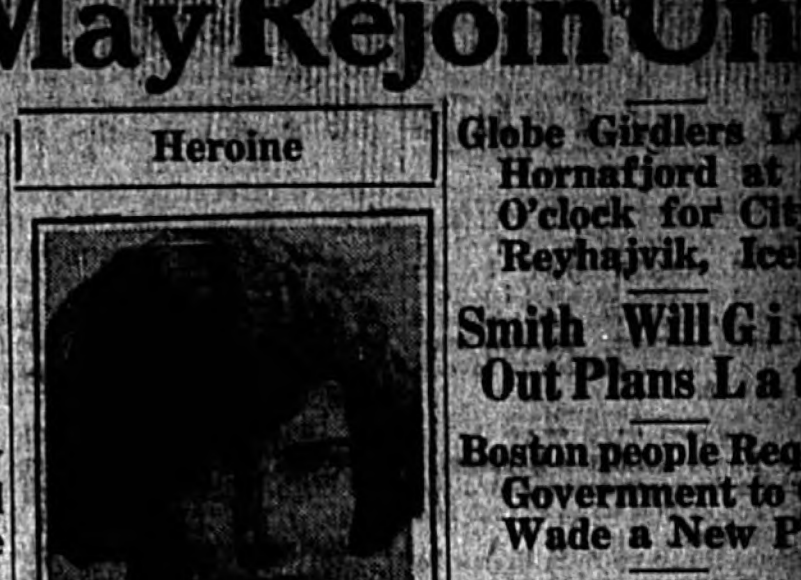
