Our government has been devoting a great deal of time to consideration of ways to ensure the safety of Southeast Asia in light of recent Communist gains. Methods of strengthening free countries in that part of the world economically as well as militarily being studied. Secretary of State John Foster Dulles said recently that the economic side of the problem cannot be overlooked and that poverty and misery must be elimin-

It is possible that a Southeast Asia Treaty Organization might make provisions for mutual military defense. It is also possible that a program of economic and technical assistance will be set up independent of the treaty organization but related to it in purpose,

However it is accomplished, the idea of ensuring Southeast Asia's security by meeting some of that areas serious problems is intelligent and forsighted. Military strength is necessary if Communist aggression is to be checked. But military strength is useless unless people feel that they have something worth defending.

Communist promises to improve the lot of backward and hungry people are meaningless. But a man or a country in desperate need is not always rational in finding remedies if we want to save Southeast Asia we must be prepared to help build it into an aren where men can hope for a better life.

Russian Farmers

After years of effort to stamp it out the spirit of free enterprise still exists in Russia. Reports from Moscow tell how farmers take the produce they raise on the half-acre of private garden they are allowed and sell it in the marketplace in competition with collectives. The prices of the free-enterprise farmes run higher than those in the state stores but thy find customers willing to pay extra for the privilege of not standing in long lines and the chance to buy merchandisc which is fresh-looking and attractive.

Those who have studied Russia in the last several decades agree that the most independent and troublesome element in the country as far as the Communists are concerned are the farmers. Efforts to collectivize agriculture, barsh punishments and threats, have not stamped out the farmer's




