



## AFL Endorses Stevenson For U.S. President

Action Is Unanimous; First Time In History Presidential Candidate Endorsed

NEW YORK (A)-William Green was elected unanimously today to his 29th consecutive annual term as president of the American Federation of Labor. The convention voted to leave next year's convention site to next year's convention alte to the executive committee. St. Louis and Miami had been aug-gestes. Mention of these two cities touched off an attack by A. Philip Randoloh, Negro president of the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters.

NEW YORK un-The American Federation of Labor convention to-day endorsed Gov. Adial E. Ste-venson, the Democratic candidate, for President of the United States. The action was unanimous by the 800 delegates who acted on a committee recommendation.
It was the first endorsement by

the convention action since the AFL was founded in 1881. Back in 1924 a special AFL committee endorsed the late Sen. Hobert M. LaFoliette of Wisconsin who was running for the presidency on the Progressive licket.

The announcement by AFL President William Green of the out come of the standing vote by del-egates at the Hotel Commodore was greeted with thunderous shouts. Scraps of torn paper were hurled into the air. The CIO already has endursed Stevenson, thus putting the two big branches of labor firmly behind the Democratic candidate.



He said he chose the method of raising the income of "key state. employes" because the positions were filled by men who not only took the jobs at less money than they had been receiving "but gave
