Therefore, an adjustment in one area will directly affect all other areas. You cannot move one area without moving every other area in the same general direction or manner. I want to make it clear that stance and alignment are synonymous. To take a correct stance without assuming the proper alignment, and vice versa, is impossible. If one is wrong, so is the other. When you take your stance, be comfortable. Nothing works if you are not 100 per cent comfortable. The two important things to consider are the feet and the shoulders. The feet should be kept approximately as wide as the shoulders, but comfortable relationship must be maintained with your own individual size and stature. Feet and shoulders are kept
