Rationing Newspapers

Oil is not the only vital defense resource which there is apparently a shortage of since Mr. Ickes decided that Americans must make sacrifices whether they are necessary or not. The OPM (Office of Production Management) has just announced a probable shortage of about four million tons of wood pulp, the stuff from which our newspa-

Wood pulp is also used extensively in the manufacture of munitions, in the manufacture of cardboard and wrapping materials used in shipping packages to England, for magazines, all other periodicals, order blanks and bulletins. Defense needs of the nation are expected to consume about 30 percent of all available wood palls, or something

about 30 percent of all available wood pulls, or something like six million tons.

With an estimated shortage of four million tons, it is more than likely that the U. S. press soon will begin to feel the squeeze. It is not likely that the government will, or can if it would, economize much in its use of wood pulp, unless perhaps it were to eliminate some millions of miles of red tape, something which no one seems to consider within the realm of probability.

rank injustice to the smaller newspapers. It could restrict all newspapers in their consumption of newsprint by a certain fixed percentage. The smaller newspapers if they were required to get along on ten percent less newsprint a year would all go broke, have to suspend publication. The larger newspapers could cut ten percent to their own financial gain.

A small newspaper which prints only four, six or even eight pages a day cannot very well reduce its use of newsprint and still remain in business. A large newspaper which prints twenty-four, thirty-six or more pages very day could cut down a few pages a day with advantage both to themselves and to their readers. Sunday newspapers which come to us in bundles of a hundred pages or more are a nuisance.

It will be interesting to see just what policy our government pursues in this matter.
