Israel Veto Heads For Sadat; He's Sticking To 'Linkage'

Israel's expected rejection of the latest Egyptian blueprint for peace headed toward Cairo today and an Israeli newspaper said the negotiations between the two nations could collapse. But the State Department said Egypt and Israel would definitely hold further negotiations to break their treaty impasse.

Golda Meir: Liver Infection

JERUSALEM (UPI) — Former Prime Minister Golda Meir, 86, has developed an infection of the liver and her doctors are keeping her under "close observation," a hospital spokesman said today. The national radio reported her condition had worsened, but Hadassah hospital spokesman Arria Rappaport said "someone at the age of Mrs. Meir doesn't get worse or better from today to tomorrow."

Soldiers Guard Tehran Area

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) — Hundreds of soldiers with fixed bayonets took up positions today around the capital's Grand Bazaar, and thousands of more oil workers joined a strike of the vital petroleum fields, cutting sharply into Iran's economic lifeblood. Major troop movements in and around the bazaar were evidently aimed at isolating anti-shah demonstrators from their traditional rallying point. The soldiers fired into the air to disperse crowds already gathered in the bazaar as they moved into place.

Pope To Mexico For Rites

VATICAN CITY (UPI) — Pope John Paul II will fly to Mexico next month to inaugurate the third Latin American Bishops Conference in his first trip outside Italy since being elected, Vatican sources said today.

Japan To Buy More Goods

TOKYO (UPI) — Japan today agreed to increase spending on purchases of U.S. farm goods over the next five years, but refused to set a date for easing seasonal restrictions on orange imports. The accord ending two days of thorny talks between U.S. and Japanese negotiators nearly doubled the annual quota on U.S. oranges and beef between now and 1983 and raised the limits on some other products as much as 30-fold.

There is considerable irony in President Carter's current plea over the poor performance of the Central Intelligence Agency...

Mr. Carter boosted himself into the presidency partly by decrying past CIA mistakes and embarrasements.

In place of the old emphasis on cloak-and-dagger spooks and covert activities, Carter promised a sanitized intelligence operation.

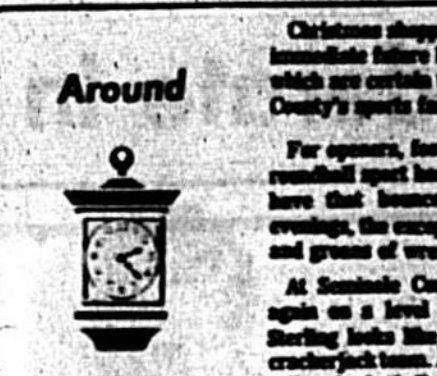
Technology — satellite reconnaissance, electronic sensors, computers and Xerox machines — would move intelligence gathering out of the back alley and into the new morality...

The fruits of all this cannot have been a surprise. The CIA failed to warn of the pro-Soviet coup in Afghanistan...

The intelligence failure in Iran is particularly illuminating. Reluctant to infiltrate the dissident Iranian groups opposing the shah...

Potentially more damaging is the CIA's upparent lack of knowledge about whether the Soviets are involved in Iran's domestic crisis.

Mr. Carter's ill-advised ascent to Turner's request for greater control over Defense and State Department intelligence operations has, presumably, exacerbated these failures.
